Do You Know NYC's COVID-19 Alert Level?





Guidance During High Alert Level

At this time, follow these prevention tips:

- Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines: Get vaccinated and boosted. Vaccines are available for everyone ages 5 and older. Booster doses are available for everyone 12 and older.
 - Visit the <u>NYC COVID-19 and Flu Vaccine Finder</u> or call 877-VAX4NYC (877-829-4692) to find a vaccination site.
 - COVID-19: Vaccine
- Wear a face mask in all public indoor settings and crowded outdoor settings. Upgrade to higher-quality masks, including KN95, KF94, N95, or a cloth mask on top of a surgical mask. Higher-quality masks will most benefit people who are at high risk of severe illness, are over 65 or are unvaccinated.
 - Guidance for Face Masks
- Consider avoiding higher-risk activities. Do not go to crowded, indoor gatherings. Limit any type of gathering to a small number of people.
- Get tested. Testing is especially important if you have COVID-19 symptoms or were recently in contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19. You should also get tested before and after traveling or getting together with others.
 - COVID-19: Testing
- Stay home if sick or recently exposed. Follow all isolation and quarantine guidance, including wearing a face mask. COVID-19 is highly contagious.
 You can spread COVID-19 even if you do not have symptoms.
 - COVID-19: What to Do When Sick
- Wash your hands. Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, or use a hand sanitizer.
 - Watch: COVID-19: Handwashing Tips



This course, also known as FEMA IS-100.c, provides a good baseline education for new CERT volunteers on how to organize during an emergency operation. This system is used nationwide to manage incidents regardless of size or type. CERT volunteers will see this in action when deploying to



emergencies. You can see where it is stated that this is a required course on page 1 of the NYC CERT Standard Operating Procedures and numerous other times relating to CERT deployments starting on page 30.






