The 863 deaths represent a death-rate of 24.67 against 21.94 for the previous week, and 29.58 for the corresponding week of 1891.

The increase of 96 deaths was mainly due to an increase of 9 in the deaths from scarlet fever, of 32 from disarrhead diseases, of 17 from diseases of the nervous system, of 15 from diseases of the digestive organs, of 12 from Bright's disease, and of 13 from sunstroke. There was a decrease of 8 in the deaths from diphtheria, and of 17 from measles.

The deaths from diphtheria were most numerous in the Twelfth and Nineteenth Wards, from measles in the Twenty-second Ward, and from scarlet fever in the Twenty-second and Twenty-third Wards.
