Appeal 34 of 1906, New Building 1072 of 1906, premises Port Morris, New York Central Railroad yards, One Hundred and Forty-first street and Locust avenue, The Bronx; W. M. Young, appellant. (Referred to Chief Croker at last meeting).

The Chairman presented and read report from Chief Croker, under date of October 1, 1906, as follows:

"Recommend application be granted."

On motion, report received and approved. Appeal 34 approved.

BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

October 9, 1906.

Present—Messrs. Warren A. Conover, Charles Buek, Lewis Harding, Charles G. Smith, Edward F. Croker, Henry R. Marshall and William J. Fryer, Chairman. Meeting called to order at 2 p. m.

On motion, minutes approved as read.

Messrs. Smith and Croker were excused by the Chairman.

Appeal 35 of 1906, Alteration 2611 of 1906, premises No. 69 East Eighty-second street, Manhattan; Luis J. Phelps, appellant and owner.

"No. 1. The 8-inch walls are of unlawful thickness. Section 31 of the Code."

"No. 2. The terra-cotta block walls are of unlawful construction for outside walls. Sections 27 and 31 of the Code."

The mode, manner of construction and materials proposed to be followed or used in this alteration having been rejected and refused, and that an equally good and more desirable form of construction can be employed than the strict letter of the Code required.

1. To allow the side walls of the playroom or upper story to be 8 inches in thickness, laid up in Portland cement mortar.

2. To allow the cross wall of the playroom or upper story to be constructed of a framework of angle and tee irons filled in with 4 inches burnt clay blocks and plastered on the outside with cement mortar and plastered on the inside; this partition to be supported on a girder spanning across the present roof and resting at the ends on the opposite walls. The sizes of the girder and angle and tee irons in respect to strength to be made satisfactory to the Superintendent of Buildings.

This dwelling house is only a little over 20 feet in width and only 50 feet in depth, and 42 feet above the curb. The party walls are 12 inches in thickness, and it is desirable that as little weight as possible be added to same, and therefore it is proposed to make the side walls of the playroom 8 inches in thickness, laid up in Portland cement mortar, and to make the cross walls of iron and burnt clay blocks carried on an iron girder, in order to place no greater load on the party walls than is necessary.

Mr. Fryer announced that he waived any contingent interest personal or otherwise in this appeal.

On motion, approved.

Appeal 36 of 1906, New Building 764 of 1906, premises northwest corner of Broadway and One Hundred and Sixteenth street, Manhattan; Charles A. Rich, architect and appellant.

"Fire escapes must be provided for."

All, that are equally good and more desirable form of construction can be provided.

That we may not be compelled to add fire escapes.

That building is fireproof.

That there are two flights of stairs through the building.

That the elevator is entirely inclosed in fireproof material.

Mr. Chas. A. Rich appeared before the Board.

On motion, laid over for one week.

Mr. K. L. Martin, representing the Department of Bridges, appeared before the Board, requesting permission to file appeal affecting proposed structure in bridge yard, Washington and Tillary streets, Brooklyn; whereupon appeal was accepted and, on motion, laid over for one week.

BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

October 16, 1906

Meeting called to order at 2 p. m.

On motion minutes approved as read.

Mr. Harding was excused by the Chairman.

Appeal 36, new building 764 of 1906, premises northwest corner Broadway and One Hundred and Sixteenth street, Manhattan; Charles A. Rich, architect and appellant. Laid over at last meeting.

The Chairman presented and read a letter from the appellant dated the 15th inst., whereupon, on motion, Appeal 36 was dismissed in accordance with appellant's request.

Appeal 37, new building, of 1906, premises Tillary and Washington streets, Brooklyn Bridge railroad yard; J. W. Stevenson, Commissioner of Bridges, appellant.

"That the construction of said building will be in direct violation of section 144 of the Building Code."

An equally good and more desirable form of construction can be employed.

The appellant desires to be allowed to erect on the steel deck of the Brooklyn Bridge yard a wooden frame building, sheathed with corrugated iron, as shown on accompanying plans. Size 35 feet 6 inches by 102 feet 6 inches by 15 feet high, of shed construction.

The proposed building is to be used as a small repair shop for bridge cars, and is of a temporary nature. The building will be located on the fireproof bridge deck and stands in the centre of an area where no other buildings can be constructed and is accessible from all sides.

On motion approved.

Appeal 38, new building 1349, of 1905, premises Nos. 321 to 337 East Thirty-first street, Manhattan; Grosvenor Atterbury, architect and appellant.

"Fireproof wood or wood covered entirely with metal should be used."

1. Provisions of law or ordinance do not apply.

2. Equally good form of construction can be employed.

Whether wood painted with fireproof paint or natural wood can be used in place of fireproof wood, the roof in either case being covered on top with metal tile.

1. Expense practically penalizes the construction of this roof garden for these tenements, which are being built as models and with a view of stimulating other owners to improve their tenements over present structures.

2. As supports to roof and trellis are either of steel angles, encased with brick or brick piers, roof could not fall by the burning of the supports. Should roofs or trellis catch fire no damage could be done to other parts of building, as the main roof is of concrete, covered with Akron tile and entire structure fireproofed.

Mr. Grosvenor Atterbury appeared before the Board.

On motion denied.

Appeal 39, alteration 2310, of 1906, premises No. 500 Madison avenue, Manhattan; Edward S. Hewitt, architect and appellant.

"Proposed construction of pent house is unlawful."

An equally good and more desirable form of construction can be employed.

A pent house to be built on roof, to be constructed on two sides of angles and trees and filled in with Bell's fireproof blocks. The remaining two sides are to be of brick. Floors to be constructed of reinforced concrete between 9-inch beams spaced about 5 feet on centres, all as shown.

Exterior covering to be of galvanized iron.

Is that it is not practicable to carry up a brick wall on the south side of pent house, as the roof slopes for water to drain to the north, and so it is asked that brick piers be allowed to support each of the steel floor beams with stone templates and constructed of angles and tees with fireproof blocks.

On the west side it is impracticable to use a brick wall, as there is no brick wall below, the wall on this side is framed as on the south side with angle irons and tees and rests on a 9-inch beam.

Mr. Edward S. Hewitt appeared before the Board.

On motion, laid over for one week.

The Chairman presented and read a communication from the President of the Assurance Company of America aent the desirability of incorporating in the Building Code a provision for fireproof roofs; which was ordered on file.

The Chairman directed the Clerk to purchase one copy of the new (third) edition of the Greater New York Charter.


