

WEEKLY INCIDENT BRIEF - COVID-19 06/22/2020 - 06/29/20

<u>Purpose of Weekly Incident Brief</u> This Weekly Incident Brief provides resources for businesses seeking economic relief, information for workplaces, and guidance for donating services or supplies. In comparison, the Daily Brief provides more detailed information about the evolving COVID-19 situation, including travel and transit impacts and the number of COVID-19 cases in the City by borough.

Incident Summary

NYC Emergency Management continues to coordinate with our partners at the City, State, and Federal levels as well as the private sector in response to COVID-19. As of June 20, 2020, there are 208,455 COVID-19 positive cases in New York City. Additionally:

- Per <u>CDC guidance</u>, employers should not require a positive COVID-19 test result or a healthcare provider's note for employees who are sick to validate their illness, qualify for sick leave, or to return to work.
- Governor Cuomo <u>released a guide</u> to the state's "NY Forward Reopening" Plan, along with the state's <u>regional monitoring dashboard</u>.
- NYC is in Phase 1. Mid-Hudson and Long Island are in Phase 2. All other regions are in Phase 3 of reopening. More information about reopening New York can be found here.
- Governor Cuomo announced the implementation of a new <u>early warning dashboard</u> to monitor and review how the virus is being contained on an ongoing basis.

Relief For Small Businesses

- The Small Business Administration (SBA) will offer Small Businesses impacted by Coronavirus (COVID-19) up to \$2 million in Economic Injury Disaster Loan Assistance (EIDL). Please click here to check your eligibility and apply.
- The Small Business Administration (SBA) will offer loans up to \$10 million to small businesses with less than 500 employees affected by COVID-19 through the Paycheck Protection Program. SBA will forgive loans if all employees are kept on the payroll for eight weeks and the money is used for payroll, rent, mortgage interest, or utilities. - Businesses can access free assistance to apply to the United States Small Business
 Administration (SBA) loan products, including the Paycheck Protection Program and the Economic Injury Disaster Loan. For more information, please click here.
- Mayor de Blasio announced a Small Business Emergency Grant Program for small businesses who were impacted by looting and experienced damage to their storefronts. These grants will help with recovery, including repairs, security systems, locks, and more. More information can be found here.
- The \$100M New York Forward Loan Fund will provide loans to small businesses, focusing on minority and women owned small businesses that did not receive federal COVID-19 assistance.

NYC Employee Retention Grant Program
