### POLICE DEPARTMENT.

POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK,  
NO. 300 MULBERRY STREET, BUREAU OF ELECTIONS,  
NEW YORK, October 5, 1891.

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of chapter 410 of the Laws of 1882, and by virtue of the authority therein conferred upon the Board of Police, the division of the several Assembly Districts in the City and County of New York into Election Districts and the boundaries of said Election Districts are hereby fixed by said Board, as follows:

#### First Assembly District.

The First Assembly District shall be divided into nineteen election districts, the extent and limits of which shall be as follows:

The First Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within William street, Old slip, East river, Whitehall street, and Beaver street.

The Second Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within John street, Burling slip, East river, Old slip, William street, Beaver street, and Broadway.

The Third Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Spruce street, Gold street, Ferry street, Peck slip, East river, Burling slip, John street, Broadway, and Park row.

The Fourth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Rector street, Broadway, Whitehall street, East river, Hudson or North river, Battery place, Greenwich street, and Governor's Island.

The Fifth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Morris street, Greenwich street, Battery place, and Washington street.

The Sixth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Carlisle street, Washington street, Battery place, Hudson or North river.

The Seventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Carlisle street, Greenwich street, Morris street, and Washington street.

The Eighth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Vesey street, Broadway, Rector street, and Greenwich street.

The Ninth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Liberty street, Greenwich street, Carlisle street, and Hudson or North river.

The Tenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Barclay street, Greenwich street, Liberty street, and Hudson or North river.

The Eleventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Reade street, Broadway, Vesey street, Greenwich street, Barclay street, and Hudson or North river.

The Twelfth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Canal street, Broadway, Reade street, Hudson street, Franklin street, Varick street, Beach street, and West Broadway.

The Thirteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Franklin street, Greenwich street, Harrison street, Hudson street, Reade street, and Hudson or North river.

The Fourteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Beach street, Hudson street, Harrison street, Greenwich street, Franklin street, and Hudson or North river.

The Fifteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Beach street, Varick street, Franklin street, and Hudson street.

The Sixteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Vestry street, Canal street, West Broadway, Beach street, and Hudson street.

The Seventeenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Lighthouse street, Hudson street, Beach street, and Hudson or North river.

The Eighteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Desbrosses street, Canal street, Vestry street, Hudson street, Lighthouse street, and Hudson or North river.

The Nineteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Canal street, Hudson street, Desbrosses street, and Hudson or North river.

#### Second Assembly District.

The Second Assembly District shall be divided into twenty-four election districts, the extent and limits of which shall be as follows:

The First Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Oak street, Catharine street, East river, and Oliver street.

The Second Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Cherry street, Oliver street, East river, and Roosevelt street.

The Third Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Oak street, Oliver street, Cherry street, and Roosevelt street.

The Fourth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Madison street, Catharine street, Oak street, and James street.

The Fifth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within New Bowery, Chatham square, Division street, Catharine street, Madison street, and James street.

The Sixth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within New Bowery, Madison street, James street, Oak street, and Roosevelt street.

The Seventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Park row, Chatham square, New Bowery, James street, Madison street, and Roosevelt street.

The Eighth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Park row, Roosevelt street, New Bowery, New Chambers street, and Pearl street.

The Ninth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Pearl street, New Bowery, Roosevelt street, and Cherry street.

The Tenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Cherry street, Roosevelt street, East river, Peck slip, Water street, and Dover street.

The Eleventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Rose street, New Chambers street, Pearl street, Dover street, Water street, Ferry street, Gold street, and Frankfort street.

The Twelfth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Park row, Pearl street, Rose street, and Duane street.

The Thirteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Park row, Duane street, Rose street, Frankfort street, Gold street, and Spruce street.

The Fourteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Worth street, Centre street, Duane street, Park row, and Broadway.

The Fifteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Park street, Pearl street, Park row, and Duane street.

The Sixteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Worth street, Baxter street, Park row, Pearl street, Park street, and Centre street.

The Seventeenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Worth street, Chatham square, Park row, and Baxter street.

The Eighteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Park street, Mott street, Pell street, Bowery, Chatham square, and Worth street.

The Nineteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Canal street, Bowery, Pell street, and Mott street.

The Twentieth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Bayard street, Mott street, Park street, and Mulberry street.

The Twenty-first Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Leonard street, Baxter street, Bayard street, Mulberry street, Park street, Worth street, and Centre street.

The Twenty-second Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Canal street, Mott street, Bayard street, and Baxter street.



The Thirtieth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Stanton street, East river, Rivington street, and Lewis street.



*Seventh Assembly District.*

The Seventh Assembly District shall be divided into twenty-nine election districts, the extent and limits of which shall be as follows:

The First Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Washington square, South, Washington square, East, Washington place, Broadway, Bleecker street, and South Fifth avenue.

The Second Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Washington square, South, South Fifth avenue, Bleecker street, Sullivan street, West Third street, and Macdougall street.

The Third Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Minetta lane, Macdougall street, West Third street, Sullivan street, Bleecker street, and Minetta street.

The Fourth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within West Fourth street, Macdougall street, Minetta lane, Minetta street, Bleecker street, Carmine street, and Sixth avenue.

The Fifth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Clinton place, Macdougall street, Washington square, North, Washington square, East, Washington square, South, West Fourth street, and Sixth avenue.

The Sixth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within East Ninth street, Broadway, Washington place, Washington square, East, and University place.

The Seventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within West Ninth street, Fifth avenue, Clinton place, University place, Washington square, North, Macdougall street, Clinton place, and Sixth avenue.

The Eighth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within East Eleventh street, Broadway, East Ninth street, University place, Clinton place, and Fifth avenue.

The Ninth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within West Eleventh street, Fifth avenue, West Ninth street, and Sixth avenue.

The Tenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within East Fourteenth street, Broadway, East Eleventh street, and Fifth avenue.

The Twenty-sixth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within West Twentieth street, East Twentieth street, Broadway, East Eighteenth street, West Eighteenth street, and Sixth avenue.

The Twenty-seventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within West Twenty-first street, Sixth avenue, West Nineteenth street, and Seventh avenue.

The Twenty-eighth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within West Twenty-third street, East Twenty-third street, Broadway, East Twentieth street, West Twentieth street, and Sixth avenue.

The Twenty-ninth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within West Twenty-third street, Sixth avenue, West Twenty-first street, and Seventh avenue.

*Eighth Assembly District.*

The Eighth Assembly District shall be divided into twenty-five election districts, the extent and limits of which shall be as follows:

The First Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Bayard street, Forsyth street, Division street, and Bowery.

The Second Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Canal street, Chrystie street, Bayard street, and Bowery.

The Third Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Hester street, Forsyth street, Bayard street, Chrystie street, Canal street, and Bowery.

The Fourth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Hester street, Eldridge street, Division street, Bayard street, and Forsyth street.

The Fifth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Hester street, Allen street, Canal street, Ludlow street, Division street, and Eldridge street.

The Sixth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Hester street, Norfolk street, Division street, Canal street, and Allen street.

The Seventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Grand street, Norfolk street, Hester street, and Allen street.

The Eighth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Grand street, Allen street, Hester street, and Bowery.

The Ninth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Broome street, Eldridge street, Grand street, and Bowery.

The Tenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Broome street, Orchard street, Grand street, and Eldridge street.

The Eleventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Broome street, Norfolk street, Grand street, and Orchard street.

The Twelfth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Delancey street, Norfolk street, Broome street, and Orchard street.

The Thirteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Rivington street, Essex street, Delancey street, and Orchard street.

The Fourteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Delancey street, Orchard street, Broome street, and Eldridge street.

The Fifteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Rivington street, Orchard street, Delancey street, and Eldridge street.

The Sixteenth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Rivington street, Eldridge street, Broome street, and Forsyth street.

The Twenty-fourth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Stanton street, Norfolk street, Delancey street, and Essex street.

The Twenty-fifth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Stanton street, Clinton street, Rivington street, and Norfolk street.

*Ninth Assembly District.*

The Ninth Assembly District shall be divided into thirty election districts, the extent and limits of which shall be as follows:

The First Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Leroy street, Hudson street, Clarkson street, Greenwich street, West Houston street, and Hudson or North river.

The Second Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Clarkson street, Varick street, West Houston street, and Greenwich street.

The Third Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Leroy street, Bedford street, Downing street, Varick street, Carmine street, and Hudson street.

The Fourth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Downing street, Bleecker street, Hancock street, West Houston street, and Varick street.

The Fifth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Leroy street, Bleecker street, Downing street, and Bedford street.

The Sixth Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Cornelia street, West Fourth street, Barrow street, West Washington place, Sixth avenue, Carmine street, and Bleecker street.

The Seventh Election District shall contain all that part of the city bounded by and lying within Morton street, Bleecker street, Jones street, West Fourth street, Cornelia street, Bleecker street, Leroy street, and Bedford street.

## TO OWNERS OF LANDS ORIGINALLY ACQUIRED BY WATER GRANTS.

ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE RECENT act of the Legislature (chapter 449, Laws of 1889), which provides that whenever any streets or avenues in the city, described in any grant of land under water, from the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty containing covenants requiring the grantees and their successors to pave, repave, keep in repair or maintain such streets, shall be in need of repairs, pavement or repavement the Common Council may, by ordinance, require the same to be paved, repaved or repaired, and the expense thereof to be assessed on the property benefited; and whenever the owner of a lot so assessed shall have paid the assessment levied for such paving, repaving or repairing, such payment shall release and discharge such owner from any and every covenant and obligation as to paving, repaving and repairing, contained in the water grant under which the premises are held, and no further assessment shall be imposed on such lot for paving, repaving or repairing such street or avenue, unless it shall be petitioned for by a majority of the owners of the property (who shall also be the owners of a majority of the property in frontage) on the line of the proposed improvement.

The act further provides that the owner of any such lot may notify the Commissioner of Public Works, in writing, specifying the ward number and street number of the lot that he desires, for himself, his heirs and assigns, to be released from the obligation of such covenants and elects and agrees that said lot shall be thereafter liable to be assessed as above provided, and thereupon the owner of such lot, his heirs and assigns shall thenceforth be relieved from any obligation to pave, repair, uphold or maintain said street, and the lot in respect of which such notice was given shall be liable to assessment accordingly.

The Commissioner of Public Works desires to give the following explanation of the operation of this act: When notice, as above described, is given to the Commissioner of Public Works, the owner of the lot or lots therein described, and his heirs and assigns, are forever released from all obligation under the grant in respect to paving, repaving or repairing the street in front of or adjacent to said lot or lots, except one assessment for such paving, repaving or repairs, as the Common Council may, by ordinance direct to be made thereafter.

No street or avenue within the limits of such grants can be paved, repaved or repaired until said work is authorized by ordinance of the Common Council, and when the owners of such lots desire their streets to be paved, repaved or repaired, they should state their desire and make their application to the Board of Aldermen and not to the Commissioner of Public Works, who has no authority in the matter until directed by ordinance of the Common Council to proceed with the pavement, repavement or repairs.
