Pursuant to New York City Administrative Code §9-151, the Department is required to report on information related to adolescents and young adults located in a Department of Education facility controlled by the Department of Correction that offers educational programming to incarcerated individuals. The reporting period pertains to the 2020-21 City school year (9/13/2020 – 6/25/2021).

Following the suspension of in-person educational services on March 13, 2020, limited in-person educational programming resumed on April 5, 2021. With limited DOE staff, the DOC supported the provision of educational services via a combination of both in person and virtual instruction. The below data represents incidents occurring during in-person educational programming from April 5th, 2021 to June 27th, 2021.

- 1. The number of departmental infractions issued to adolescents at a department of education site, and the number of departmental infractions issued to young adults at a department of education school site, in total and disaggregated by the type of infraction, as defined by the department:
  - a. By October 2018 all adolescents were transferred to the custody of the Administration of Children's Services. There were no infractions issued to young adults at a Department of Education site during the 2020-21 school year.

  - a. Due to behavioral concerns, 2 individuals were restricted from attending educational programming in the reporting period.
- 3. The number of assaults on staff at a department of education site, in total and disaggregated by whether such assault was committed by an adolescent or young adult:
  - a. There were no reported instances of assaults on staff committed by young adults on DOE school sites for the 2020-21 school year.
- 4. The number of incidents of use of force A at a department of education site, in total and disaggregated by whether such use of force was used on an adolescent or young adult.

Class B Use of Force is a classification used to describe Use of Force Incidents that do not require hospitalization or medical treatment beyond the prescription of over-the-counter analgesics or the administration of minor first aid (e.g., Use of Force Incidents that result in a superficial bruise, scrape, scratch, or minor swelling); or involve the forcible use of mechanical restraints in a confrontational situation that results in minor injury.
