





The object of this application is to obtain an order of the Court for the appointment of three disinterested and competent freeholders, at least one of whom shall reside in the County of New York, and at least one of whom shall reside in the County of Ulster, to ascertain and determine the damages, if any, fixed by the Board of Water Supply, and the cost of the same, for the removal of an entire or a portion of an real estate not taken by virtue of Chapter 628 of the Laws of 1906.
