Re: Agency-based Voter Registration Under LL29 of 2000, Mayoral Directive One of 2014, LL61 of 2014 and LL63 of 2014

July 1 through December 31, 2020 Report

Local Law 29 of 2000 requires that specified agencies offer voter registration in their encounters with the public. Mayoral Directive One of 2014 strengthened the requirements of LL29, putting a structure in place to monitor agency efforts to increase voter registration. Local Laws 61 and 63 of 2014 increased the number of agencies required to offer voter registration.

The Board of Elections reported that it processed 1,292 voter registration applications originating at City agencies (called Code 9 applications) between July 1 and December 31, 2020. This does not include applications from DSS/HRA, where voter registration applications are offered, collected and sent to the Board of Elections under the requirements of the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) and are not denoted as Code 9. DSS/HRA reported sending 2,418 applications to the Board of Elections during the reporting period, yielding a combined total of 3,710 City agency submissions to the Board of Elections. The total for the comparable period in 2020 was 7,171.

Some highlights of agency activities during the reporting period include:

- 1. The COVID-19 pandemic continues to restrict in-person activities of all kinds, including in-person voter registration activities by City agencies. As a result, City agencies are focusing their voter registration-related activities through the mail and online:
 - a. ACS chaired virtual voter registration workshops via web conference and will continue to use this method and other online resources to engage New Yorkers to vote. ACS also included early voting and election day reminders to staff in its weekly e-bulletin.
 - b. DOC: in advance of the November election, the Department distributed voter
 packets to all people in custody. Each packet included voter registration
 paperwork and absentee ballot request paperwork in both English and Spanish.
 The packets also included NYCCFB instructions for completing both forms, also

in English and Spanish. The packets additionally included an instructional cover page, which listed the key election and registration deadlines, as well as voter eligibility criteria with specific information for incarcerated persons. The Department also partnered with the health provider in NYC jails, Correctional Health Service (CHS), to conduct on-unit engagement and assistance.

- c. DOF: voter registration cards are also sent out by the SCRIE and DRIE units with each SCRIE and DRIE renewal application.
- d. DPR: recreation centers, which serve as a hub for voter registration and outreach, have remained closed since March 18, 2020 due to the current public health crisis. This has greatly impacted the Department's ability to conduct outreach.

Describe how your agency distributes applications.

Voter registration forms were disseminated throughout ACS outer borough offices and Youth-Concentrated Programs. However, due to the impact of COVID, many in-person events, meetings and ACS youth centered activites were postponed or limited to online activity. In addition, many ACS staff have been tele-working to combat the spread of COVID. ACS chaired virtual voter registration workshops via WebEx and will continue to use this method and other online resources to engage New Yorkers to vote.

ACS Website and Social Media Page: ACS Intranet Newsletter portal delivered content to over 6,000 staffers. The page served as a hub to provide resources promoting civic engagement info, voter registration deadlines, and information needed to engage and guide voters and potential voters in the electoral process. The information was shared via the following digital methods:

- ACS Commissioner Public Service Announcement: ACS released a PSA, available on YouTube
 at NYC Child Services, featuring the commissioner, encouraging ACS staff, partners, and
 stakeholders to register to vote, while providing general guidance on voting safely, key dates
 to register, alternate ways to vote in addition to in-person and voting policies. The PSA
 reached over 1,000 subscibers.
- ACS E- Bulletin: Early voting ad Election Day Reminders were sent out weekly reaching over 6,906 employees
- ACS Voting Banners- Listed key dates and up to date information with a link to The NYC Campaign Finance Board for up to date info and election alerts.

Children's Center (CC) Voter Registration Workshop: Prior to the pandemic, ACS liased with the Campaign Finance Board (CFB) to host our first virtual interactive voter registration meeting with a focus on the young demographics and how patterns in socio-economics plays a role in voter turnout in communities with higher incomes versus those living in low-income communities. Over 30 youth from ages 15-21 participated on the workshop. During the presentation, the CC youth learned how they could make an impact in their communities by volunteering, organizing community events (such as beautification projects), using their social media platforms to share information, contacting their local elected officials to insight change and other civic engagement activities.

Young People Hearing: ACS liased with CFB inviting CC and YRC Youths to in speak at at CFB's annual hearing about their experiences with voting, local government, civic education, etc. and make recommendations to our board on how NYC Votes can better serve young New Yorkers.

Family Permanency Services: The Housing Academy Collaborative (HAC) provides a series of weekly trainings to young adults to prepare them to meet the challenges of renting an apartment and maintaining it via financial literacy, education resources, tenant rights and more. At each of these trainings a voter registration table is set up. Time is set aside in each training to discuss few voter rights and voter registration and access to voter registration applications. 8 youth were registered.

College Internship Program: Amid the pandemic, much of ACS staff in the Division of Administration were required to telework, which had an impact in terms of hiring college interns, as most of the assignments would decree interfacing with the public. As a result, admin hired 1 college intern to support COVID 19 projects and virtual events.

Describe any special registration activities, if any.

Children's Center (CC) Voter Registration Workshop: ACS is again liasing with the Campagin Finace board, bringing in a series of new training and workshops to engage youth at the Children's Center,

Youth Residential Centers, and The Housing Academy Collaborative. The division of admin will also coordinate with ACS Divisions- Family Permancey Services, Division of Youth and Family Justice, and Division of Child Protection to enagage youth in the voting process through education programs and to provide the youth with information and skills to become an enagegd itizen. The NYC Votes Civic Engagement Course is a series of three trainings + workshops designed to provide context for why voting and local government are important and to give youth the skills needed to organize their own community events. While this series is youth-focused, we are hoping to include in future programs educators, service providers to host an intergenerational communication around voting and civicengagement.

1. Youth Civic Engagement Workshop

 Our Civic Engagement Workshop provides an on overview into why voting at the local level is so important. ACS teens will learn about how New York City youth turnout to vote, what each elected official does at the local level, and how to encourage other young New Yorkers to show up at the polls.

2. Voter Mobilization Training

 In this training, teens will be walked through the process of how to organize and execute a voter registration drive. Youth will have the opportunity to break out into small groups and make a plan for implementing a drive. Small groups will then share out their ideas and we will workshop them together.

3. Ranked Choice Voting Train the Trainer

In this train-the-trainer, youth learn about Ranked Choice Voting and how it
works, but they also receive training in how to host their own forum about RCV
with their peers, adults, and senior citizens in their communities. This is being
built in partnership with the Civics for All team at the Department of Education.

Voter Registration Challenges: ACS will coordinate a Friendly Divisional "Voter Registration Challenge". Which ever division registers or host the most voter registration drives will be recognized on an agency wide level.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

There are still many restrictions and limitations in place, affecting most in-person civic engagement activities, forcing groups to operate online.

Describe how your agency distributes applications.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Commission has conducted its work remotely consistent with Citywide policy. As a result, the Commission has not been able to distribute hard copy voter registration forms.

Instead, the Commission has and continues to develop digital distribution of these forms. For example, links to voting information are made available to the public on the Commission's website. In addition, links to voter registration information is also contained in a growing number of Commission communications to the public.

Describe any special registration activities, if any.

¹ No hard copies have been distributed due to remote working.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

Challenges noted in prior reports remain. While the Commission continues to serve and reach thousands of individuals during the COVID-19 pandemic through virtual intakes, meetings, workshops, campaigns, and presentations, it is not able to track how many people who receive links to voter registration materials use them, analogous to the same challenges noted in prior reports to the distribution of hard copy voter registration forms which the public may use but which are not submitted to the agency.

A number of factors may determine the number of people served, including the number of those who use online resources to access the electronic voter registration form. These may include the virtual setting, technological platform, and type of event taking place, as well as the extent to which technology is accessible to the public. Although there has been a significant increase in the use of technology by the public, access to technology and electronic means of communication is still not completely widespread for a variety of reasons.

Another reality influencing the number of electronic voter registration forms that are submitted to the Board of Elections is the receiving population's eligibility to vote. Commission events are regularly frequented by individuals who may not be eligible to vote, which may depress the number of voter registration forms that are accessed, filled out, and ultimately submitted online.

Continuing to emphasize the importance of political engagement to the public across all channels may contribute to an increased number of distributions and submissions.

Based on our implementation plan, the Department for the Aging has required each program, project and site to offer voter registration materials to participants and those inquiring about service. Additionally, all units at DFTA's Central Office having contact with the public have been diligently informing applicant and others about the opportunity to register to vote. Voter Registration materials and inquiries have been offered by every DFTA contractor, including satellite offices.

With impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the suspension of onsite congregate services, we encourage clients to visit/go to the NYS BOE's voter registration webpage. We also have voter registration information prominently displayed on DFTA's internet homepage and continue to promote through DFTA's social media.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

The general challenge for DHS in distributing voter registration forms at intake lies in the emergency nature of contact with the public at DHS intake centers. Families and individuals arrive at intake centers for assistance in a crisis, with their belongings, to await immediate temporary placement in a shelter (pending approval of their application). Application documents are completed electronically by staff, making it impossible for DHS to physically attach a voter registration form to an application document provided to the client. DHS's solution has been to provide access to voter registration

forms at intake by placing them in waiting areas for applicants and clients to pick up if they are interested in registering to vote.

Describe how your agency distributes applications.

Due to COVID-19, the Department suspended the majority of in-person and volunteer services program provision. As a result, in advance of the November election, the Department distributed voter packets to all people in custody. Each packet included voter registration paperwork and absentee ballot request paperwork in both English and Spanish. The packets also included NYCCFB instructions for completing both forms, also in English and Spanish. The packets additionally included an instructional cover page, which listed the key election and registration deadlines, as well as voter eligibility criteria with specific information for incarcerated persons. The Department also partnered with the health provider in NYC jails, Correctional Health Service (CHS), to conduct on-unit engagement and assistance.

Describe any special registration activities, if any.

Please see above response. In-person DOC activities were suspended during the reporting period and therefore the Department was unable to conduct special civic engagement activities. However, CHS staff conducted in-person engagement.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

The major challenge during the reporting period was conducting civic engagement and registration activities amidst a global pandemic and contagious disease outbreak in City jail facilities. The creation and widespread distribution of non-partisan voter registration information and materials, while not an ideal solution, was successful in enabling all eligible individuals in custody to the opportunity and information to register and vote in the November election. In addition to the voter packets, the Department additionally provides individuals in custody three free stamps or pre-paid envelopes each week, which could be used for sending absentee ballot request paperwork. The Department additionally partnered with CHS to collect voter registration forms, absentee ballot request forms, and completed absentee ballots, which the Department delivered by hand to the appropriate BOE office. The Department additionally operates a social services request system using paper request slips. This system was utilized to provide voter documents in various other languages to individuals upon request, and to provide voter assistance when appropriate and requested.

Forms are available in the lobby of most of our Health Centers as well as inside some of our program offices. The forms are arranged on a literature rack or on a stand/table along with other information relevant to the location. Visitors take forms and assistance is provided by staff when requested.

Describe any special registration activities, if any.

Despite the restrictions with Covid-19 pandemic, the agency continued to spread the word about voter registration during Employee Resource Group meetings and staff meetings.

Additionally, the agency participated in National Voter Registration Day on 9/22/20. Although, we did not host any face-to-face programs, participation was done through agency wide email reminders to staff, partner programs, vendors and awareness through posters at our health centers.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

Many of our sites provide health care services to the general public. Promoting voter registration or anything else not directly related to a visitor's health circumstance remains a challenge.

Additionally, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, some of our health centers have been closed since March 2020 and many of our public facing programs are now providing services remotely. Thus, there has been a significant reduction in the distribution of voter registration forms from late march to date.

Describe how your agency distributes applications.

DOT remains committed to registering voters during the Covid-19 pandemic. At the end of March 2020, due to Covid-19, DOT's public service centers (PSCs), closed. Prior to the pandemic, printed voter registration material was distributed. Since July 2020, physical voter registration packets have been replaced by PDFs emailed directly to customers:

- 1) CSLACU includes voter registration packets with every piece of correspondence and DOT literature now emailed to customers.
- 2) DOT customers calling 311 are sent voter registration materials.
- 3) The DOT website has a "Register to Vote" tile on its landing page. The hyperlink sends DOT customers directly to "nyc votes".

DOT will resume distributing voter registration materials at all of DOT's Public Service Centers (PSCs) throughout the five boroughs when Covid-19 is no longer an issue.

Describe any special registration activities, if any.

Pre-Covid-19, DOT distributed voter registration materials at all DOT outreach events. DOT will resume outreach activities once it is safe to do so, thus resuming distribution of voter registration materials.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

It is not possible to know which customers receiving the voter registration packets with their correspondence, or visiting DOT's PSCs (when they reopen) are already registered to vote. DOT can readily disseminate the voter registration materials, but cannot compel customers to complete the forms and return them to the board of Elections, or submit them to the PSC managers (when the PSCs reopen). If completed forms are not collected on-the-spot and sent to the Board of Elections by the PSC managers, it is difficult to monitor the number of forms being sent to the Board of

Elections and effectively track the number of customers participating. Tracking the number of forms distributed is not an accurate measure of the number of people ultimately registering to vote.

• Our agency provides registration cards through a dispenser, so we do not have a count on the number of registration forms distributed. These areas generally service the Section 8 program participants and property owners. The forms are on open display for all to take.

- HPD provides a voter spotlight link on our website and intranet to the voter registration website.
- Voter registration cards are available when clients drop off or pick up documentation at the front desk during appointments with property owners and managers.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

 Due to COVID-19 and the temporary closing of HPD to the public we have had a significant drop in our application numbers.

- Our biggest challenge is while servicing over 5,000 clients every month; we do not have the resources to track this particular type of manual data. When cards are filled out, clients are able to drop them in the onsite mailbox or any out-going mailbox without the assistance of front line staff.
- Voter cards are made available to the public, employees and vendors. There is no way to manually track how many are taken and sent to the BOE.
- Our next challenge is the ability to offer the forms electronically to staff and clients.
- HPD will work with units with the passive display and face-to-face encounters to increase tracking and voter registration.

Describe how your agency distributes applications.

The TLC currently maintains a staff of approximately 600 employees, many of whom interface daily with TLC licensees. The agency also provides TLC employees with helpful resources from organizations and other city agencies.

We are targeting these two groups by distributing forms in four separate ways to various TLC divisions and departments:

- **Human Resources** (located in Lower Manhattan) includes registration forms in hiring packets for new employees.
- Policy/External Affairs (located in Lower Manhattan) distributes voter registration forms at outreach events and presentations to licensees and driver industry stakeholders across all 5 boroughs.
- **Licensing Division** (located in Long Island City, Queens) has forms available for visitors to take at its licensing transaction counters. We keep about 300 applications available for distribution at all times. Also, information on how to contact the Board of Elections is included on many TLC-issued forms for licensees.
- Safety + Emissions Division located in Woodside, Queens & Staten Island) has forms available for distribution at its counter operations that licensees must visit on a regular basis (ranging from three times a year to once every two years) for inspection on their vehicle.

By using these targeted strategies, TLC helps all TLC licensees, and incoming employees to receive voter registration information.

Describe any special registration activities, if any.

COVID-19 limited in person voter registration activities. However, we continue to promote voter registration information to our Drivers. Voter registration information was featured in the August and October issue of our bi-monthly newsletter Keys to the City. Drivers also received emails with information on voter registration including important deadlines. Our email list includes over 200,000 licensees.

Additionally, the TLC <u>Driver Resources</u> page has a permanent link to the NYC Board of Elections where Drivers can find information about voter registration.

Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

Encouraging drivers to take the time to fill out voter registration forms at tabling events, continues to be a challenge.
