Monkeypox Alert

Monkeypox is an infection that typically causes fever, flu-like symptoms and a rash, and is currently spreading in many countries and cities, including New York City.













Immediately notify a health care worker if:

- + You have a new rash, sores, or blisters anywhere on your body
- + You have been in close contact with someone who is sick or has a new rash

Protect yourself and others:

- + Wear a mask covering your nose and mouth
- + Keep a safe distance from others
- + Cover any rash, blisters or sores

At this time, monkeypox vaccinations are not available at NYC Health + Hospitals locations.



New York City Mayor Eric Adams and New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH) Commissioner Dr. Ashwin Vasan have recently declared a public health emergency due to the monkeypox outbreak.

A buddy check is a CERT deployment that can be performed for known vulnerable residents in response to extreme weather — snow, or heat events — or during an emergency, especially emergencies

that span a few days or weeks. CERT volunteers performed buddy checks often during the COVID pandemic, where many vulnerable residents were shut in due to fears of the virus. Buddy checks can save lives! Think about your neighborhood and who your vulnerable neighbors might be.




New Graduate Orientation




