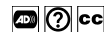

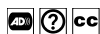

In order to implement a PLA that would govern the SCA's Design Build projects, the SCA must, pursuant to Labor Law Section 222, Section 2.a.2 (New York Labor Law Section 222), determine that the PLA would further the SCA's "interest in obtaining the best work at the lowest possible price, preventing favoritism, fraud and corruption, and other considerations such as the impact of delay, the possibility of cost savings advantages, and any local history of labor unrest". The selected Consultant will be tasked with undertaking, or supporting an SCA-led, "Feasibility Study" specific to a Design Build Project Labor Agreement.

- (3) "Master Planning Services": In response to this RFQEI we are also asking interested firms to demonstrate their ability to perform Master Planning Services with the goal of updating the SCA's Design Standards for its large portfolio of school buildings. Interested firms should respond with prior examples of their master planning experience relating to standards.
