COMMISSIONERS OF THE SINKING FUND OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

Proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund at a Meeting Held in Room 16, City Hall, at 11 o'Clock A. M., on Monday, August 24, 1914.

Present-O. Grant Esterbrook, Acting Mayor; Alexander Brough, Deputy and Acting Comptroller; Henry Bruere, Chamberlain, and Henry H. Curran, Chairman, Finance Committee, Board of Aldermen.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the following report and offered the following resolution relative to the removal of buildings at Nos. 3985-3991 Bronx Boulevard, in the Borough of The Bronx:

August 24, 1914. To the Honorable the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

Gentlemen-A request has been received from the President of the Borough of the Bronx for the removal of buildings known as 3985-3991 Bronx Boulevard, in the Borough of The Bronx, because of their dangerous condition, and also from the Police Department, under date of August 11, 1914, in which it is stated:

There are two unsafe buildings at 226th Street and Bronx Boulevard which are in constant danger of falling, necessitating the stationing of a policeman to guard the same since July 9th, 1914. This means that three Police officers are doing nothing else at a cost to the City of about \$300 a month."

I therefore request that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, pursuant to the authority vested in them by Section 205 of the Revised Charter, adopt a resolution authorizing and ordering the President of the Borough of the Bronx to demolish and remove said buildings as encumbrances upon a public street and such a resolution is herewith transmitted. ALEX. BROUGH, Deputy and Acting Comptroller. Whereas, The President of the Borough of The Bronx has requested the removal of the buildings known as 3985-3991 Bronx Boulevard, in the Borough of The Bronx,

because of their dangerous condition. Whereas, These buildings if allowed to remain would be a menace to life and

limb, it is therefore Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund by virtue of the powers vested in them by law hereby authorize and order the President of the Borough of

The Bronx to demolish and remove these encroachments upon a public highway, in the manner provided by Section 205 of the Revised Charter, as amended by Chapter 398 of the Laws of 1909.

The report was accepted and the resolution adopted, all the members present voting in the affirmative.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the following report and offered the following resolution relative to the transfer of equipment of the Brooklyn Disciplinary Training School for Boys, and employment of two caretakers to act as watchmen:

August 24, 1914. To the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, The City of New York:

Gentlemen-The Brooklyn Disciplinary Training School for Boys will be discontinued on August 31, 1914, and it will be necessary that some one representing the City be placed in charge of the premises to look after the safety of the personal

property of the school until such time as the equipment and other movable effects may be formally transferred to other city departments or sold at public auction.

A representative of the Bureau of Municipal Investigation and Statistics, of the Department of Finance, has been assigned to make an inventory of all of the equipment and other personal property in the school grounds. In order to expedite the transference of such equipment as may be available for the use of other city departments, I would ask that you empower the Comptroller to make arrangements to have such equipment transferred with the understanding that a complete list of all property so disposed of shall be reported to your Commission at an early date.

I would ask further that the Comptroller be authorized, on behalf of your Board, to retain, during the month of September, the services of two caretakers, now on the payroll of the school, to act as watchmen until the movable property on the premises has been disposed of. Respectfully, ALEX. BROUGH, Deputy and Acting Comptroller.

Resolved, That the Comptroller be and he is hereby authorized to transfer the equipment and other personal property of the Brooklyn Disciplinary Training School for Boys to the various city departments having use for same, providing, however, that an inventory of the property so transferred to each department be furnished this board at the earliest possible date; and be it further

Resolved, That the Comptroller be authorized to retain the services of two caretakers now in the employ of the Brooklyn Disciplinary School to act as watchmen on the premises until September 30, 1914, at the same rate of compensation as they are now receiving, the expense thereof to be charged to the salary appropriation provided in the budget for the said school.

The report was accepted and the resolution adopted, all the members present voting in the affirmative.

Banking Commission.

The quarterly meeting of the officers to designate City depositories, in accordance with section 196, chapter 466, Laws of 1901, was held on Saturday, August 1, 1914. Present-William A. Prendergast, Comptroller; Henry Bruere, Chamberlain.

The Chamberlain offered the following:

"Resolved, That the present City depositories be redesignated."

Which was unanimously adopted.
The Chamberlain offered the following:

"Resolved, That the minimum rate of interest on deposits be fixed at two (2) per cent., that the Chamberlain be empowered, wherever he may do so in his best judgment, to enter into contract for such higher rate of interest as may be obtained, provided that in each such case the specific approval of the Mayor and Comptroller be obtained. The Chamberlain is empowered in his discretion to require from any or all such depositories bonds to secure the deposits made therein, such bonds to be approved by the Comptroller."

Which was unanimously adopted.

The following report of the action taken by the Commission was approved and signed by the Comptroller and Chamberlain:

Report on the Meeting of the Banking Commission.

August 1, 1914. The Banking Commission met to-day to fix the rate of interest on City deposits

for the three months ending October 31, 1914. The minimum rate was fixed at 2 per cent., but the Chamberlain was authorized to make better arrangements with banks which offered to pay a higher rate of interest.

In accordance with the usual practice, a letter was sent to the banks by the Chamberlain ten days ago, asking what rate of interest would be paid on city balances for the quarter beginning August 1. The replies received show that it will be possible to place \$43,000,000 in banks at rates higher than 2 per cent., the average rate for this amount being 2.6 per cent.

Under the law, which permits a deposit in any one bank of an amount equal to 50 per cent. of the capital and surplus, \$113,000,000 could be deposited in banks paying better at the following locations on said avenue: than 2 per cent., but the Chamberlain has limited the regular deposits in banks to 20

per cent. of the capital and surplus, as a conservative policy. Under the offers received at the beginning of the first quarter of the year, it was possible to place \$27,000,000 above 2 per cent., the second quarter \$26,000,000, and as

stated above \$43,000,000 for the coming quarter. Eighty-six institutions have agreed to pay rates in excess of 2 per cent., as

Twenty, 3 per cent.; one, 25-6 per cent.; two, 23/4 per cent.; fifty-nine, 21/2 per cent.; four, 21/4 per cent.

The increased earnings during the past six months ended July 31, due to the rates better than 2 per cent., were \$71,000.

The method of distribution employed during the past six months whereby banks impartially received sums on deposit in proportion to their size, strength and amount of interest paid, will be continued during the succeeding quarter.



NOTICE TO BIDDERS AT SALES OF OLD

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expira-

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so inter-ested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose. and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.
