Bellevue and Allied Hospitals.

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals was held on Tuesday, October 6th, 1914, at 3.30 P. M.

Present—Dr. Brannan, the President, in the chair; and Messrs. Paulding, O'Keefe, Farley and Sachs, Trustees.

Excused—Messrs. Robbins, Stern, Trustees, and Mr. Kingsbury, Commissioner of Public Charities.

The minutes of the meeting of September 15th were held as read and approved.

Bills amounting to \$75,490.84 were approved and forwarded to the Comptroller for payment.

Dr. George O'Hanlon, the General Medical Superintendent, reported as follows:

The daily average census at the various hospitals during the month of September, 1914, was as follows: Bellevue, 1,163; Gouverneur, 186; Harlem, 180; Fordham, 173.

On September 18th, 1914, Hazel Darrow, an affiliating pupil, was transferred from Bellevue to the Minton Hospital, suffering from diphtheria. She had been on duty in the gynaecological service, and, so far as can be learned, had not been exposed to the disease.

Mr. Arthur W. Yergin, who was in the service of the hospital for three years as Employment Agent, tendered his resignation, effective on October 1st, and I would recommend for your favorable consideration as his successor Mr. Robert Link, of 154 Ainsley Street, Brooklyn. He comes well recommended and has had experience along employment and social lines.

At the School for Midwives the following pupils have completed their course of training, and your authorization is requested for the granting of the usual diploma: Minnie Gurto, Margaret Fitzgerald, Bessie Brown, Emmeline Voigt, Antoinette P. Shidlewskis, Marie Gabrielson, Elizabeth Nyakas, Anna Kozozak, Anna Paris, Fanny M. Grippo, Anna V. Guerra.

Permission is requested to adopt in the Out Patient Department of Gouverneur Hospital blank forms containing a number of questions for the purpose of gathering

information pertaining to the activities of that department.

On separate motion, duly seconded and carried in each instance, action was taken upon the report of the General Medical Superintendent as follows:

The transfer of Hazel Darrow, affiliating pupil nurse, from Bellevue to Minton Hospital, was approved.

The resignation of Mr. Arthur W. Yergin as Employment Agent at Bellevue Hospital, was accepted with regret, and it was resolved, to appoint Mr. Robert Link as his successor.

The granting of diplomas to the graduating midwives named by the General Medical Superintendent was authorized.

It was Resolved, to authorize the General Medical Superintendent to adopt for an experimental period of one month the blank forms outlined for use in the Out-Patient Department of Gouverneur Hospital.

COMMITTEE REPORTS.

The Chairman of the Building Committee reported that he had considered the selection of the color of paint for the sash and balconies for the new ward wing of Harlem Hospital, and recommended the adoption of the color scheme suggested by J. H. Freedlander, the architect, in his letter of September 14th, 1914. The report of the Committee was approved.

The Building Committee reported that it had considered the plans and specifications submitted by the architects, Messrs. McKim, Mead and White, with their letter of July 2nd, relative to changes in the laundry building of Bellevue Hospital, which could be made without extra charge. On the recommendation of the Building Committee, duly seconded and carried, these changes were approved.

The Chairman of the Building Committee presented samples of colors for the flooring of the new ward wing of Harlem Hospital. On the recommendation of that Committee it was moved, seconded and carried, to approve the selection of a dark red composite floor.

The Building Committee reported that they had considered the plans and specifications for the equipment of the new ward wing of Harlem Hospital and for the alterations of the mechanical plant in the power house and for the vault space of that hospital. On the recommendation of the Building Committee it was moved, seconded and carried to approve these plans and specifications, and to transmit them to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for approval.

The President referred to the need of having a plan for assigning the administrative duties of the Department to the various superintendents. After discussion it was moved, seconded and carried to direct the General Medical Superintendent to prepare such an outline.

The President called attention to the meeting of the Sub-Committee of the Committee on Tax Budget of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, which would be held in the Municipal Building on Thursday, October 8th, 1914, at 10.30 A. M., to consider the departmental estimate for 1915 of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried to designate Mr. John G. O'Keeffe to represent the Board of Trustees at this hearing in the absence of the President.

The President reported that on September 22nd he had attended a conference with the Comptroller in regard to the contracts for the lighting fixtures of the nurses' residence of the Harlem Hospital, and the equipment and painting of pavilions I, K, L and M. The Comptroller promised that he would release the contracts for the lighting fixtures at once and the remaining ones as soon as the Department is ready to make awards. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this report was approved.

COMMUNICATIONS.

The minutes of the Executive Committee of the Medical Board of Bellevue Hospital for September 23rd were presented. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the nomination of Dr. Hervey C. Williamson was referred to the Conference Committee; the nomination of Dr. Max Spencer Rohde for appointment on the house staff of Bellevue Hospital, second division, to date from January 1st, 1914, the time he began his service as substitute, was approved; the preparation of the sixth volume of the Medical and Surgical Reports of the department was authorized.

The minutes of the Medical Board of Bellevue Hospital for October 2nd were presented. The nomination of Dr. Fenwick Beekman for appointment as Adjunct Assistant Visiting Surgeon to the Second Division for the remainder of the year was referred to the Conference Committee. As there was nothing further requiring the action of the Board the minutes were ordered placed on file.

The minutes of the Medical Board of Harlem Hospital, held on September 29th, were presented. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the resignation of Dr. Eastman of the House Staff was accepted, to date from September 5th, 1914. The

nomination of Drs. J. Cohen, E. A. Jennings and A. B. Brasted for appointment to the house staff, service to begin November 1st, was referred to the Conference Committee. The resolutions calling attention to the non-issuance of special cards for use in the Out-Patient Department, and also the need of cabinets for the preservation of radiographic plates of the hospital, were referred to the General Medical Superintendent for attention.

A letter, dated September 22nd, was presented from McKim, Mead & White, transmitting an estimate of \$997 for changes in the elevator enclosures of pavilions I and K. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this communication was referred to the Building Committee for recommendation.

A letter, dated September 22nd, was presented from McKim, Mead & White, transmitting plans and specifications for changes and additions to pavilions I and K, involving a temporary admitting office and changes in the radiographic department, laundry extension and temporary dining rooms, as well as providing for a covered passageway leading to the morgue. On motion, duly seconded and carried, they were referred to the Building Committee.

A letter was presented from the Mayor, under date of September 23rd, calling attention to educational courses offered to city employees in the Municipal Building, and setting forth that the departmental employees who attend these courses and whose duties are in other ways satisfactory may be excused from their duties in the departments during that time in order to attend these courses. After discussion, on motion, duly seconded and carried, the General Medical Superintendent was directed to report at the next meeting on the number of employees in the department likely to attend these courses.

A letter dated September 28th was presented from the Mayor, calling attention to the establishment of a legislative bureau in the office of the Corporation Counsel, and requesting that legislation desired by the Department be transmitted to that Bureau at once. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this communication was placed on file.

A certified copy of a resolution was presented from the Board of Aldermen, approving the issue of Corporate Stock in the amount of \$59,000 for equipment of the ward wing and enlarging the power plant of Harlem Hospital. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this copy was ordered placed on file.

A letter dated September 25th was presented from the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, transmitting a copy of a resolution adopted on September 21st, approving the transfer of \$2,000 from schedule 2089, General Repairs, to 2093, Contingencies, and revising the schedules accordingly. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this communication was ordered placed on file.

A letter dated September 25th, 1914, was presented from the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, transmitting a copy of a resolution adopted on July 30th, 1914, and also copy of standard specifications for iron, steel and other metals, including castings. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the General Medical Superintendent was directed to comply with the resolution.

A letter was presented from Dr. Edward L. Keyes, dated October 1st, requesting the temporary appointment of Dr. Herbert Mohan to the Out-Patient Department of Bellevue Hospital for the period of one month, to take the place of Dr. L. B. Mackenzie. On motion, duly seconded and carried, this appointment was approved.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was seconded and carried.

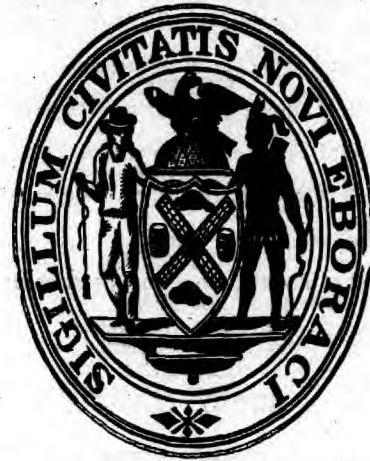

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof.
