## ASSESSMENT COMMISSION.

No. 27 CHAMBERS STREET,  
FRIDAY, January 15, 1886—3 o'clock P. M. }

The Commission created by chapter 550 of the Laws of 1880, to revise, vacate, or modify assessments for local improvements in the City of New York, met pursuant to adjournment.

Present—Commissioners Daniel Lord, Jr. (Chairman), Allan Campbell, Joseph Garry, and John W. Marshall.

The Clerk presented copies of the CITY RECORD and "Daily Register" of January 14 and 15, 1886, showing the publication of notices of the meeting.

The minutes of the meeting held on January 12, 1886, were read and approved.

The Clerk reported that he had filed in the Finance Department on January 15, 1886, certificates reducing assessments in cases specified in resolution adopted on January 12, 1886.

### Calendar.

No. 5561. Matter of Edward C. Donnelly—Assessment for Tenth avenue regulating, grading, etc., from Manhattan street to One Hundred and Fifty-fifth street; confirmed November 12, 1885.

Charles E. Miller, Esq., counsel for the petitioner, presented additional evidence, and closed his case.

John A. Beall, Esq., the Counsel representing the City, presented his evidence, after which the case was closed, argument of counsel to be heard at the next meeting.

No. 4774. Matter of Edward Matthews—Assessment for Church street paving, from Fulton to Morris street; confirmed October 20, 1873.

No. 4781. Matter of M. and S. Sternberger—Assessment for South Fifth avenue paving, from Canal to Fourth street; confirmed October 20, 1873.

The Commissioners heard the argument of John C. Shaw, Esq., counsel for the petitioners, and of John A. Beall, Esq., the Counsel representing the City, after which the case was closed, and decision reserved.

Assessment for Tenth Avenue Regulating, Grading, etc., from One Hundred and Tenth Street to Manhattan Street; Confirmed February 3, 1876.

No. 5543. Alphonse Kalischer reduced from \$1,977 97 to \$949 43
