Dear Sir—Encouraged by the suggestion of Mayor Gaynor to present to yourself and through you to your honorable Board the subject of Street Numbers, especially on business buildings, permit me to solicit you to take active steps in the matter. This subject has been held up for a long time. The Merchants' Association have filed their petitions in the past, but so far of no avail. If you will secure the services of a dozen police officers to report the missing street numbers in every block of their beat you will ascertain with a certainty the large deficiency of street numbers, specially in the downtown sections. It is certainly not to the credit of our great City to have thousands of business men and women come to the City to hunt by numbers the different addresses they are looking for.

In the residential part there is also a great want of a proper display of street numbers, often by reason of a front door being turned into the vestibule, where no one can see them or possibly may have no numbers at all.

Permit me, therefore, to solicit your honorable Board to pass a resolution to require every house owner or tenant to place the street numbers of his building in a conspicuous place on their signs or over their doors where they can be seen without special effort, and also that the police officers on their beats are required to enforce this ordinance, and asked to report to the proper authorities any neglect of complying with same within thirty days after notice has been served or published.

Although this appeal comes from me personally, it is endorsed by many of my friends, who hope to secure by your action a benefit to the public at large.

## COMMUNICATIONS FROM CITY, COUNTY AND BOROUGH OFFICERS.

Department of Health, City of New York, S. W. Corner 55th Street and 6th Avenue, Borough of Manhattan, Office of the Secretary, New York, October 10, 1911.

Hon. P. J. SCULLY, City Clerk, City of New York:

Sir—I beg to acknowledge receipt of a resolution adopted by the Board of Aldermen on July 25, 1911, requesting the Department of Health to exercise all its powers, including the police powers of the State, to bring about as far as possible a correction of the evils alleged to exist in the subway and which are more particularly specified in the preamble to said resolution, and to report its action and recommendations to the Board of Aldermen. All investigations made showed that the excessive heat and lack of ventilation complained of are defects of construction of the subway that have been present since the first day of its use. These conditions cannot be changed without extensive alterations to the whole system. This is a matter over which the Public Service Commission has entire jurisdiction, together with the jurisdiction over the frequent delays in traffic. This the Department of Health does not control at all.

It is true that track walkers and other employees are in constant danger of being killed or injured, but this danger is not more than is incidental to the work of such employees, and frequent observations lead the Department to an expression of belief that these dangers are in nowise unusual in the operation of railroads.

The station platforms and their approaches and the water closets and water closet apartments were found in clean and good sanitary condition.

The recommendation of the department is, that the matter be referred to the Public Service Commission for attention. Very truly yours,

Hon. JOHN PURROY MITCHEL, President of the Board of Aldermen:

Dear Sir—The records of the former Commissioners of Electrical Subways, which commission was superseded by the Board of Electrical Control under chapter 716 of the Laws of 1887, have never been arranged in any systematic order or indexed so that they might be easily and readily located. The printed minutes of the Board of Electrical Control from July, 1887, to December, 1897, were indexed, and, later, printed volumes of the minutes were issued by one of the former Commissioners of this Department. My recent investigation into the question of the unlawful use of the streets by companies which now operate telephone, fire and signal wires has shown that the indexing of these minutes is so incomplete that it is only with a great deal of difficulty I have been able to locate the records which related to some of these companies. I have also found that very few of the documents referred to in the minutes of the Board of Electrical Control have ever been indexed or recorded. It appears now that these records are of considerable value and of material assistance to the Corporation Counsel. The records and documents are contained in twenty-six wooden chests, and it is only with difficulty and at a great sacrifice of time that the Department has been able to find reports or records which the Corporation Counsel has had to ask for recently. The arranging and cataloguing of these records should be done by an experienced person and one accustomed to this class of work.

I would, therefore, recommend that \$1,000 special Revenue Bonds be authorized for the employment of a Librarian to index and catalogue the records of the former Commissioners of Electrical Subways and the Board of Electrical Control.

Dear Sir—I have just received a report of the financial condition of the Bureau of Highways, this Office, and find a peculiar state of affairs existing as to the appropriation fund for the employment of the laboring force, to wit: Fund No. 1830, Bureau of Highways, Wages Temporary Employees, Schedule Line Foremen, allotment \$34,888 exhausts itself on November 14; Schedule Line of Assistant Foremen, allotment \$22,304.75 exhausts itself on November 20; Schedule Line Laborers, allotment \$6,279 and \$231,942.50 exhausts themselves on December 39, 1911. Fund 1831, Bureau of Highways, Hired Teams, Horses and Carts, original allotment of \$80,000 is practically exhausted.

For proper performance of the functions of this Bureau it is imperative that the different classes of labor work simultaneously. As this cannot be done with the present condition of the funds, our position being that we can employ only laborers without a supervisory force, or the necessary adjuncts of horses and carts, it is absolutely necessary to apply to your Honorable Board for the necessary funds to continue the work of repairing the roads in this Borough until the last of the year, and for that purpose I beg to enclose copy of a resolution for adoption by your honorable Board, authorizing the Comptroller to issue special revenue bonds to an amount not exceeding \$35,393.67, the proceeds whereof to be used by the President of the Borough of Queens for the purpose of hiring hired teams, horses and carts, replenishing Fund 1831 to the amount of \$25,600.16; Foremen, \$6,733, replenishing Fund 1830; Assistant Foremen, \$3,060.51, replenishing Fund 1830. I cannot too strongly impress upon your Honor the necessity of favorable action by the Board of Aldermen in order that I can continue the work of repairing the streets for the balance of the year. I desire to submit a plan, which, if approved, should relieve the situation, save millions of dollars and much valuable time, and the adoption of which would be a great benefit both to The City of New York and the taxpayers.

First—The City of New York should acquire all the land not now owned by it, lying north of Reade st. and south of the newly constructed Police Headquarters, and within the territory known as Lafayette st. and Centre st., excluding the property on the west side of Lafayette st., and that lying on the east side of Centre st.—about seven (7) small blocks.

Second—This property could be purchased at a reasonable price, as it is mostly occupied by old buildings.

Third—The City now owns within the territory above mentioned, the Municipal Building, the Criminal Courts Building, the Tombs, the Police Headquarters Building, and, if the above suggestion be put in effect, every Department of the City government (after the new buildings have been erected for the purpose), could be properly housed therein, making one continuous stretch of City buildings, with every department of the City government, stretching from the City Hall to new Police Headquarters (with ample building space to construct a building to house the Health Department).

Fourth—The lower section of the City will always be the official, financial and commercial centre; real estate values would certainly increase in this vicinity, and the enormous amount of money paid by the City each year for rentals to private corporations or individuals would cease.

Fifth—The City would thus have a Court House within its limits worthy of our metropolis. The plan here outlined appears feasible; the building would be centrally located, considering the Boroughs of Brooklyn and Richmond, as nearly all the lawyers practicing in our great City have their offices in the immediate locality. All the main arteries of travel are accessible, the subway, the elevated railroads, the ferries, and the bridges. The Criminal Courts Building, the Tombs, the Federal Courts, the Municipal Building, Hall of Records, and a great many departments of the City and Federal Governments are all near by. The site seems most convenient, accessible, and, from every viewpoint, a most popular location, as it would be of great convenience to the public, which could thus transact its business speedily, with but a few minutes' walk from one building to the other.

## BELLEVUE AND ALLIED HOSPITALS.

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals was held on Thursday, September 7, 1911.

Present: Dr. Brannan, the President, in the chair; and Messrs. Farley, O'Keeffe, Robbins, Sachs and Stern, Trustees. Excused: Messrs. Drummond and Paulding.

The minutes of the meeting of June 20, June 23, and July 6, copies of which had been sent to each member, were held as read and approved.

Bills amounting to \$105,960.35 were presented for approval and ordered forwarded to the Comptroller for payment.

Dr. George O'Hanlon, the General Medical Superintendent, reported as follows:

The plans and specifications for lighting ward 34 of Bellevue Hospital have been returned by the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity. As the estimates received for this work are over \$1,000, approval and authority to advertise are requested.

The revised plans and specifications for the laundry machinery have been

received. These have been changed in accordance with the suggestions of Dr. Goldwater and Dr. Smith, and would seem to be satisfactory.

It is respectfully reported in the matter of the recent inspection of the hospital by the State Board of Charities that Mr. Hunn, the Inspector, in summarizing, called attention to fifteen needs of the hospital; six of these have already received attention, three of them are either anticipated or under way, and six of them are neither necessary nor would it be advisable to carry them out.

For information of the Board, the resignation of Miss Julia Stimson, Assistant Superintendent of Nurses at Harlem Hospital, to take effect on October 6, is reported.

Action was taken upon the report of the General Medical Superintendent as follows:

Authority was granted to advertise for bids for the installation of lighting fixtures in ward 34 of Bellevue Hospital.

The revised plans and specifications for machinery for the new laundry at Bellevue Hospital were approved.

The report of the disposition of the recommendations of the State Board of Charities was approved.

The Special Budget Committee, consisting of Mr. O'Keeffe, Mr. Sachs and Dr. Brannan, submitted a report of a meeting of the Committee held on August 21, at which the recommendations of the heads of the various departments had been carefully considered and scrutinized; and recommended that in the new budget provision be made for increases in salaries and wages to the amount of \$8,800 and for the sum of \$37,866 for new and additional positions, according to a detailed list, a copy of which had been sent to each member of the Board of Trustees. The Committee further recommended that an increase be asked for all appropriations other than salaries over the funds provided for 1911 in the amount of \$21,000. The report was adopted.

The Budget Committee submitted a communication, dated September 1, which had been received from the Commissioner of Public Charities, requesting that the Trustees make provision for taking care of the nursing at Gouverneur Hospital after January 1, 1912, as it will be impossible for that department to supply nurses after that date. It was reported that there is no place available for the accommodation of nurses at Gouverneur Hospital, and that no suitable place can be found in the vicinity. It was resolved to comply with the request of the Department of Public Charities, and to provide for thirty graduate nurses in place of the thirty-three pupil nurses; and it was resolved to allow the nurses to board outside and to pay them \$800 each.

The Budget Committee also submitted communications received from the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity dated August 31 and September 6, stating the amounts which should be included for the use of water in the various hospitals of the Department and for the installation of water meters. After considering these reports, with particular reference to the many structural changes to be made in Bellevue Hospital within the next few years, it was resolved to provide for the installation of meters in Bellevue Hospital at an estimated cost of \$2,500, and for the use of water in the various hospitals in the sums as follows: Bellevue, \$18,250; Gouverneur, \$4,380; Harlem, \$2,190, and Fordham, \$5,130. Total, \$29,950.

Upon the further recommendation of the Budget Committee, resolutions were adopted as follows:

Resolved, That a uniform wage for trained nurses be established at \$600 with maintenance or \$800 without maintenance.

Resolved, That the request of the General Superintendent of Training Schools dated August 15, for the revision of the schedule of wages for the Training School for Midwives, be denied.

Resolved, That the training school be directed to arrange the vacations of nurses at intervals throughout the year, so as not to handicap the service during the limited period of the summer months, and so as to obviate the need of requesting revenue bonds for vacation relief each year.

Resolved, That all social employees be placed on the payroll, and that in future no assistance towards payment of the salary of any employee in the Department shall be accepted without the approval of the Board of Trustees.

Resolved, That the General Medical Superintendent be instructed to arrange for the employment of an electrician to overhaul the elevators at regular intervals, and that the request of the Supervising Engineer for the employment of a permanent electrician for this purpose be denied.

Resolved, That the General Medical Superintendent be directed to order every possible economy in the appointment of special nurses, bringing this to the attention of the visiting staff if thought desirable.

Resolved, That the General Medical Superintendent in his discretion may grant an additional \$180 to employees who are obliged to live outside.

Resolved, That the salary of the assistant to the Assistant Superintendent of Training Schools at each of the allied hospitals be fixed at the uniform rate of \$720.

Resolved, That all employees now paid from revenue bonds which are available until December 31, 1911, be provided for in the Budget for 1912.

Resolved, That in the Budget for 1912 fifty hospital attendants at \$240 be included in place of fifty hospital helpers at that wage.

It was resolved to authorize the President to transmit the estimate together with a letter explaining in detail the cause of the increases over the appropriations for the current year.

The Budget Committee also recommended that approval be granted to the request of the General Superintendent of Training Schools that the appropriation of Revenue Bonds for additional nurses for the alcoholic service, viz.: 1 trained nurse at \$600 and 10 hospital attendants at \$480, \$5,400, be changed to read, "9 trained nurses at \$600, \$5,400," in view of the difficulty of obtaining experienced nurses at the lower figure. This recommendation was adopted.

The Conference Committee of the Fourth Division of Bellevue Hospital recommended the appointment of Dr. William H. McKay as Assistant Physician to Out-Patients and Dr. John F. McGrath as Assistant Gynecologist to Out-Patients. This recommendation was adopted.

The Conference Committee also reported that Dr. Albert G. Swift, who had been nominated by the Medical Board as Assistant Surgeon to Out-Patients on the Fourth Division, had withdrawn his application.

The Committee on Officers and Employees reported that consideration had been given to the request made by the General Superintendent of Training Schools on August 3 that Revenue Bonds be asked for to provide for fifteen additional graduate nurses to be appointed in Bellevue Hospital from November 1, and to provide an increase in salary to the social service nurses who will be required to live outside from that date, and that a report thereon had been received from the General Medical Superintendent, from which it appeared that arrangements could be made to cover the wards affected without the appointment of additional nurses, and also possibly to meet the increases to the nurses who will be obliged to live outside. The Committee therefore recommended that the request be denied, and this recommendation was adopted.

The General Medical Superintendent submitted a statement showing in detail the estimated saving through the purchase of meat in carcass form at the allied hospitals, which will be possible after a central store is established as authorized at last meeting. This saving was shown to be \$3,672.90. The estimate referred to a further saving which would be possible on the distribution of dry goods and groceries.

The minutes of the meeting of the Medical Board of Bellevue Hospital held on September 1 were presented. The recommendation therein that one-half of the present children's service at Bellevue Hospital be assigned to the care of the Fourth Medical Division, in order to provide a more equitable division of the medical work of the Hospital, was referred to the Conference Committee of the Fourth Division for consideration and report.

The minutes of the meeting of the Medical Board of Fordham Hospital held on August 18 were presented. The resignation of Dr. Dominick A. DiPasca as Assistant Physician to Out-Patients was accepted, and diplomas were authorized to be awarded to Dr. Hoy and Dr. Grossman as recommended. Mr. O'Keeffe and Mr. Robbins, of the Conference Committee of Fordham Hospital, reported that a meeting of that committee had been held that day, and recommended that the nominations therein of Dr. Harrigan and Dr. Breglia be approved. This recommendation was adopted, and Dr. John E. Breglia appointed Assistant Surgeon to Out-Patients and Dr. Anthony H. Harrigan as Surgeon to Out-Patients and Assistant Visiting Surgeon to Fordham Hospital.

A copy of a resolution adopted by the Board of Aldermen on July 21, au-



thorizing an amendment of the appropriation of \$2,500, to provide for the replacement of the flooring of the balconies at Harlem Hospital, was received.

A communication dated August 25 was received from Dr. Morton E. Hall, requesting to be allowed to resign his place as one-year interne on the First Medical Division of Bellevue Hospital in order to accept an appointment as pathologist in that hospital. The resignation of Dr. Hall was accepted, to date from August 31, 1911.

A communication dated September 6 was received from the Phillips Manufacturing Company, requesting approval of the assignment of all moneys due on their contract for the installation of a fire alarm system at Harlem Hospital, to the International Bank, 60 Wall street. It was resolved to grant consent to this assignment without guarantee as to amount and expressly subject to any claim, set-off, or equity which The City of New York now has, or may hereafter have, against the moneys or any part thereof covered by said assignment.

A communication dated September 7 was received from the John T. Brady Company, requesting permission to work Sundays, holidays and nights on the excavation for pavilions L and M. A communication dated September 5 was presented from the architects in regard thereto, and in accordance with the recommendation therein, the request was denied.

The General Medical Superintendent presented a list of special nurses who had been authorized at Bellevue Hospital from August 18 to September 7. The appointments were approved.

A communication dated August 31 was received from the John H. Parker Company, giving in detail their reasons for requesting an extension of time on their contract, as requested by resolution adopted at last meeting. This communication had been referred to the architects, and a reply received from McKim, Mead & White under date of September 6 was presented, certifying that the delay for which extra time was requested was due to causes for which the contractors were not responsible, and recommending that an extension of time until September 30 be granted. Mr. Farley, Chairman of the Building Committee, reported that he had investigated the circumstances, and recommended that the request be granted. A further extension of time was granted until September 30, 1911.

The President reported that subsequent to last meeting, at which it was resolved to request the sum of \$29,000 in Revenue Bonds to meet deficits in the appropriations of the Department, the General Medical Superintendent had received a communication from the Contract Clerk and Auditor, stating that the estimate had been inadequate and recommending that an additional \$1,000 be asked and that the request before the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for a transfer of \$1,000 from one appropriation to another be withdrawn. The President further reported that, in view of the fact that much difficulty had been experienced in meeting the needs of the Department, he had withdrawn the request for the transfer of funds referred to, and had authorized a request to the Board of Aldermen for Revenue Bonds to the amount of \$30,000, instead of \$29,000 as at first proposed. The action of the President was approved, and after further consideration, the General Medical Superintendent was directed to scrutinize all requisitions drawn against appropriations in which the funds are exhausted, and he was authorized to issue orders for such supplies as he may consider essential and to incur liabilities therefor although funds may be temporarily exhausted.

Mr. Edward Lazansky, of the firm of Jonas, Lazansky & Neuberger, appeared before the Board in reference to the deduction which was made from the contract of Daniel J. Ryan for the extension of the psychopathic ward in view of the failure of the contractor to complete the work in the time specified therefor. Mr. Lazansky referred to the delays which resulted through the bankruptcy of a sub-contractor, and the bricklayers' strike, and to the additional expense to which Mr. Ryan was placed in order to comply with the requirements of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity in regard to the lighting fixtures. Mr. Lazansky also submitted a letter dated September 2, addressed to him by Reis & O'Donovan, sub-contractors for the lighting fixtures. It was resolved to comply with his request to authorize the transmission to the Department of Finance of a certificate to the effect that the contract of Daniel J. Ryan was properly executed so far as material and workmanship were concerned, and that no money damage was caused to the Hospital through the delay in the completion of the work, the issue of this certificate, however, to be dependent upon the request of the Department of Finance for information on this subject.

It was reported that before further progress could be made in planning the new Out-patient Department at Gouverneur Hospital, it would be necessary to decide how the building should be heated, and the Building Committee was authorized to consider this subject and report. In view of the necessity which has arisen of caring for the nurses at Gouverneur Hospital, it was suggested that accommodations for them be provided in the new Out Patient Department, and this question was also referred to the Building Committee.

The General Medical Superintendent was instructed to issue a general order directing the isolation of all typhoid patients, the installation of screens in windows, the screening of beds, the destruction of flies, and such other action as may be necessary to secure proper isolation of typhoid patients in all of the hospitals of the Department.

The General Medical Superintendent was directed to submit a report at the next meeting in regard to the structural alterations recently made in the Board room at Harlem Hospital.

Adjourned.

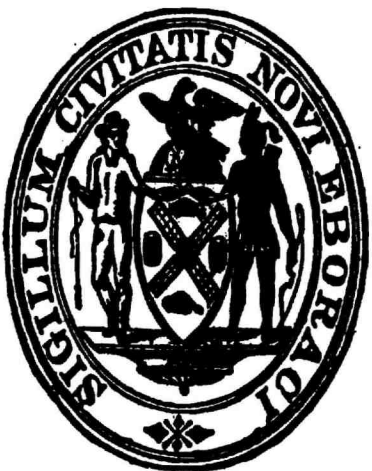

Whereas, The Union Railway Company of New York City, has under date of October 27, 1910, made application to this Board for the grant of the right, privilege and franchise to construct, maintain and operate a double track street surface railway as an extension to its existing system, from the intersection of Audubon and Boscobel avenues in the Borough of The Bronx, and thence upon and over the Washington Bridge and its approaches, and upon and along 181st street to Broadway, Borough of Manhattan; and

Whereas, Section 172 of the Railroad Law and Sections 72, 73 and 74 of the Greater New York Charter, as amended by chapters 629 and 630 of the Laws of 1905, provide for the manner and procedure of making such grants; and

Whereas, In pursuance of such laws, this Board adopted a resolution on November 11, 1910, fixing the date for public hearing thereon as December 9, 1910, at which citizens were entitled to appear and be heard, and publication was had for at least fourteen (14) days in the "World" and "The New York Times," newspapers designated by the Mayor, and in the City Record for ten (10) days immediately prior to the date of hearing, and the public hearing was duly held on such day; and

Whereas, In further pursuance of such laws this Board adopted a resolution on March 2, 1911, entering on the minutes of the Board the proposed form of contract for the grant of the franchise or right applied for, ordering said contract advertised and fixing April 13, 1911, as the date for the final public hearing thereon; and

Whereas, This Board on April 13, 1911, at the request of the Company, adopted a resolution rescinding the resolutions adopted March 2, 1911, and

Whereas, The counsel for the Company has in a communication dated September 11, 1911, stated the terms and conditions on which the Company will accept the grant; and

Whereas, This Board has made inquiry as to the money value of the franchise or right applied for, and proposed to be granted to the Union Railway Company of New York City, and the adequacy of the compensation to be paid therefor; now, therefore, it is

Resolved, That the following form of the resolution for the grant of the franchise or right applied for by the Union Railway Company of New York City, containing the form of proposed contract for the grant of such franchise or right, be hereby introduced and entered in the minutes of this Board, as follows, to wit:

Resolved, That the Board of Estimate and Apportionment hereby grants to the Union Railway Company of New York City the franchise or right fully set out and described in the following form of proposed contract for the grant thereof, embodying all the terms and conditions, including the provisions as to rates, fares and charges, upon and subject to the terms and conditions in said proposed form of contract contained, and that the Mayor of The City of New York be and he hereby is authorized to execute and deliver such contract in the name and on behalf of The City of New York, as follows, to wit:

##### Proposed Form of Contract.

This contract, made this ..... day of ..... 1911, by and between The City of New York (hereinafter called the City), party of the first part, by the Mayor of said City, acting for and in the name of said City, under and in pursuance of the authority of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of said City (hereinafter called the Board), and the Union Railway Company of New York City (hereinafter called the Company), party of the second part, witnesseth:

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

Section 1. The City hereby grants to the Company, subject to the conditions and provisions hereinafter set forth, the right and privilege to construct, maintain and operate a double track extension to its present street surface railway with the necessary wires and equipment, for the purpose of conveying passengers only in the Boroughs of Manhattan and The Bronx, in The City of New York, upon the following route, to wit:

Beginning at and connecting with the existing tracks of the Company in Boscobel avenue, at or near its intersection with Audubon avenue, in the Borough of The Bronx; thence upon and along Boscobel avenue to Audubon avenue; thence westerly upon and over the easterly approach to the Washington Bridge and upon and over the said bridge and its westerly approach to the intersection thereof with 181st street, Borough of Manhattan, and thence upon and along 181st street to the easterly side of Broadway, and to cross such other streets and avenues, named and unnamed, as may be encountered in said route.

The said route, with turnouts, switches and crossovers, hereby authorized is shown upon a map entitled:

"Map showing proposed extension of the Union Railway Co. of New York City, in the Boroughs of Manhattan and The Bronx, City of New York, to accompany petition dated October 27, 1910, to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment."

and signed by F. W. Whitridge, Receiver; Edward A. Maher, General Manager, and T. F. Mullaney, Chief Engineer, a copy of which is attached hereto, is to be deemed a part of this contract, is to be construed with the text thereof and is to be substantially followed, provided that deviations therefrom and additional turnouts, switches and crossovers which are consistent with the foregoing description and the other provisions of this contract may be permitted by resolution of the Board.

Nothing in this contract shall be construed as permitting the construction of more than one double-track street surface railway upon the route hereinafter described.

Section 2. The grant of this privilege is subject to the following conditions, which shall be complied with by the Company:

First—The consent in writing of the owners of half in value of the property bounded on said streets and avenues to the construction and operation of said railway shall be obtained by the Company within three (3) months from the signing of this contract by the Mayor, and a copy of such consents shall be filed with the Board within such time, or in the event that such consents cannot be obtained within such time, the Company shall within said three (3) months or within one (1) month thereafter, make application to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court for the appointment of Commissioners in the manner provided by the Railroad Law, to determine if said railway ought to be constructed; otherwise this grant shall cease and determine.

Second—The said right to construct, maintain and operate said railway shall be held and enjoyed by the Company from the date upon which this contract is signed by the Mayor until March 1, 1924, with the privilege of renewal of said contract for the further period of twenty-five (25) years, upon a fair revaluation of such right and privilege.

If the Company shall determine to exercise its privilege of renewal it shall make application to the Board, or any authority which shall be authorized by law to act for the City in place of the Board. Such application shall be made at any time not earlier than two (2) years and not later than one (1) year before the expiration of the original term of this contract. The determination of the revaluation shall be sufficient if agreed to in writing by the Company and the Board, but in no case shall the annual rate of compensation to the City be fixed at a less amount than the sum required to be paid during the last year prior to the termination of the original term of this contract.

If the Company and the Board shall not reach such agreement on or before the day, one (1) year before the expiration of the original term of this contract, then the annual rate of compensation for such succeeding twenty-five (25) years shall be reasonable, and either the City (by the Board) or the Company shall be bound upon request of the other to enter into a written agreement with each other fixing the rate of such compensation at such amount as shall be reasonable, but in no case shall the annual rate so fixed be less than the sum required to be paid for the last year prior to the termination of the original term of this contract, and if the parties shall not forthwith agree upon what is reasonable, then the parties shall enter into a written agreement fixing such annual rate and at such amount as shall be determined by three disinterested freeholders selected in the following manner:



base their judgment upon their own experience and upon such information as they may obtain by inquiries and investigations, without the presence of either party. They shall have the right to examine any of the books of the Company and its officers under oath. The valuations so ascertained, fixed and determined shall be conclusive upon both parties, but no annual sum shall, in any event, be less than the sum required to be paid for the last year of the original term of this contract. If in any case the annual rate shall not be fixed prior to the termination of the original term of this contract, then the Company shall pay the annual rate thereafter prevailing until the new rate shall be determined, and shall then make up to the City the amount of any excess of the annual rate then determined over the previous annual rate. The compensation and expenses of the said appraisers shall be borne jointly by the City and the Company each paying one-half thereof.

Third—The Company shall pay to the City for the privilege hereby granted the following sums of money:

(a) The sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) in cash on or before the date on which operation over any portion of the route hereby authorized is commenced.

(b) During the first term of five (5) years an annual sum which shall in no case be less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), and which shall be equal to three (3) per cent. of its gross annual receipts if such percentage shall exceed the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

During the second term of five (5) years an annual sum which shall in no case be less than seventeen hundred dollars (\$1,700) and which shall be equal to five (5) per cent. of its gross annual receipts, if such percentage shall exceed the sum of seventeen hundred dollars (\$1,700).

During the remaining term expiring March 1, 1924, an annual sum which shall in no case be less than nineteen hundred dollars (\$1,900), and which shall be equal to five (5) per cent. of its gross annual receipts if such percentage shall exceed the sum of nineteen hundred dollars (\$1,900).

The gross annual receipts mentioned above shall be that portion of the gross receipts of the Company from all sources within the limits of the City as shall bear the same proportion to its whole gross receipts as the length of the extension hereby authorized shall bear to the entire length of the railway of the Company in operation within the limits of the City.

The annual charges shall commence from the date upon which this contract is signed by the Mayor.

(c) For the use of the Washington Bridge and its approaches during the term expiring March 1, 1914, an annual sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000); during the succeeding term of five (5) years expiring March 1, 1919, an annual sum of one thousand two hundred and fifty dollars (\$1,250); and during the remaining term of five (5) years expiring March 1, 1924, an annual sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500). The compensation herein reserved shall commence from the date on which this contract is signed by the Mayor.

All annual charges as above shall be paid into the treasury of the City on November 1 of each year and shall be for the amount due to September 30 next preceding. Provided that the first annual payment shall be only for that proportion of the first annual charge as the time between the date upon which this contract is signed by the Mayor and September 30 following shall bear to the whole of one year.

Whenever the percentage required to be paid shall exceed the minimum amount as above, then such sum over and above such minimum shall be paid on or before November 1 in each year for the year ending September 30 next preceding.

The annual charges herein provided are intended to include the percentages of gross receipts now required to be paid by railway companies to the City pursuant to the Railroad Law as amended, and such charges as are required under chapter 340 of the Laws of 1892 to be paid by the Company for this extension if said act applies to or controls the Company in relation to the right and privilege hereby granted.

The City does not and shall not demand or require the payment by the Company of a percentage of gross receipts under the provisions of chapter 340 of the Laws of 1892 on the gross receipts earned on the extension constructed pursuant to this contract.

Any and all payments to be made by the terms of this contract to the City by the Company, shall not be considered in any manner in the nature of a tax, but such payments shall be made in addition to any and all taxes of whatsoever kind or description, now or hereafter required to be paid by any ordinance of the City, or resolution of the Board, or any law of the State of New York.

Fourth—The annual charges or payments shall continue throughout the whole term of this contract (whether original or renewal), notwithstanding any clause in any statute or in the charter of any other railway or railroad company providing for payment for railway or railroad rights or franchises at a different rate, and no assignment, lease or sublease of the rights or privileges hereby granted (whether original or renewal), or of any part thereof, or of any of the routes mentioned herein, or of any part thereof, shall be valid or effectual for any purpose unless the said assignment, lease or sublease shall contain a covenant on the part of the assignee or lessee that the same is subject to all the conditions of this contract; and that the assignee or lessee assumes and will be bound by all of said conditions, and especially said conditions as to payments, anything in any statute or in the charter of such assignee or lessee to the contrary notwithstanding, and that the said assignee or lessee waives any more favorable conditions created by such statute or its charter, and that it will not claim by reason thereof or otherwise exemption from liability to perform each and all of the conditions of this contract.

Fifth—Nothing in this contract shall be deemed to affect in any way the right of the City to grant to any individual or other corporation a similar right or privilege, upon the same or other terms and conditions, over the route hereinbefore described.

The use of the railway constructed by the Company under this contract, including the tracks, wires and other equipment, or any structures used in connection therewith in streets and avenues hereinbefore described, shall be permitted by the Company to any individual or corporation to which the City may have granted, or may hereafter grant, the right or privilege to use such streets and avenues for street railway purposes, upon payment of an annual sum by such individual or corporation to the Company which shall equal the legal interest on such proportion of the actual cost of the construction of such railway and structures, and additions and betterments thereto, as the number of cars operated by such individual or corporation shall bear to the number of cars operated by the companies then using the same; and also such proportion of the cost of keeping the tracks and electrical equipment in repair, and the cost of additions and betterments thereto, such proportion of laying and repairing of pavement and removal of snow and ice, and all other duties imposed upon the Company by the terms of this contract in connection with the maintenance or the operation of said railway so used, as the number of cars operated by such individual or corporation shall bear to the number of cars operated by the companies then using the same, together with the actual cost of the power necessary for the

operation of the cars thereon of such individual or corporation. Provided, however, that if, in the opinion of the Company, the legal rate of interest upon the cost of such railway shall be an insufficient sum to be paid for the use of such tracks, it may appeal to the Board and the Board may fix a percentage upon the cost to be paid to the Company, at a sum in excess of the legal rate of interest, if, in its opinion, such action is justified.

The Company shall not at any time oppose but shall upon the request of the Board, consent to the construction or operation of any street surface railway which may necessitate the use of any portion of the railway which shall be constructed by the Company, pursuant to this contract.

Sixth—The rights and privileges hereby granted shall not be assigned, either in whole or in part, or leased or sublet in any manner, nor shall the title thereto, or right, interest or property therein, pass to or vest in any other person or corporation whatsoever, either by the act of the Company, or by operation of law, whether under the provisions of the statutes relating to the consolidation or merger of corporations or otherwise, without the consent of the City, acting by the Board, evidenced by an instrument under seal, anything herein contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding, and the granting, giving or waiving of any one or more of such consents shall not render unnecessary any subsequent consent or consents.

Seventh—Upon the termination of this original contract, or if the same be renewed, then at the termination of the said renewal term, or upon the termination of the rights hereby granted for any cause, or upon the dissolution of the Company before such termination, the tracks and equipments of the Company constructed, pursuant to this contract within the streets and avenues and upon the bridge shall become the property of the City without cost, and the same may be used or disposed of by the City for any purpose whatsoever, or the same may be leased to any company or individual.

If, however, at the termination of this contract as above, the Board shall so order by resolution, the Company shall, upon thirty (30) days' notice from the Board, remove any and all of its tracks and other equipment constructed pursuant to this contract and the said streets and avenues and the bridge shall be restored to their original condition at the sole cost and expense of the Company.

Eighth—The Company shall commence construction of the railway herein authorized within three (3) months from the date upon which the consents of the property owners are filed with the Board or from the date of the order of the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court, made pursuant to section 174 of the Railroad Law, confirming the determination of the Commissioners appointed thereunder that such railway ought to be constructed, and shall complete the construction and place the same in full operation within six (6) months from the date of filing such consents or the date of such order, otherwise this right shall cease and determine, and all sums paid, and the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) deposited with the Comptroller of the City, as hereinafter provided, shall thereupon be forfeited to the City; provided that the period for commencement and the period for completion and placing the railway in full operation may be extended by the Board, but the total extension of time for either of such periods shall not exceed in the aggregate six (6) months; and provided further that when the commencement or completion of said construction shall be prevented by legal proceedings in any Court, or by works of public improvement, or from other causes not within the control of the Company, the time for the commencement or completion of such construction may be extended for the period of such prevention, but no delay shall be allowed for unless the Court proceedings shall be diligently prosecuted by the Company, and provided further, that in no case shall such delay be deemed to begin until the Company shall have given written notice to the Board of any such Court proceedings or other occasion of delay, and deliver to the Board copies of any injunction or other orders, and the papers upon which the same shall have been granted, and unless upon the request of the Board the Company shall, in writing, consent that the Board, either in its own name as a party or in the name of the City as a party, may intervene in any such proceedings.

Ninth—Said railway shall be constructed and operated in the latest approved manner of street railway construction and operation, and it is hereby agreed that the Board may require the Company to improve or add to the railway equipment, including rolling stock and railway appurtenances, from time to time, as such additions and improvements are necessary, in the opinion of the Board. Upon failure on the part of the Company to comply with the direction of the Board within a reasonable time, the rights hereby granted shall cease and determine.

Tenth—Said railway shall be constructed, maintained and operated subject to the supervision and control of all the authorities of the City who have jurisdiction in such matters, as provided by the Charter of the City.

No construction upon said railway shall be commenced until written permits have been obtained from the proper City officials.

In any permits so issued such officials may also impose such conditions, as a condition of the granting of the same, as are necessary for the purpose of protecting any structures, in the streets and avenues and upon the bridge, over which such officials have jurisdiction and the Company shall comply with such conditions.

The electrical equipment to be installed by the Company for the operation of the railway within the limits of the City, whether the same be upon streets and avenues, or upon the bridge and its approaches, or upon private property, shall be constructed and maintained under the supervision and control of the Commissioner of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity.

Eleventh—Said railway may be operated by overhead electric power substantially similar to the overhead electric system now in use by street surface railways in the Borough of the Bronx, or by any other motive power, except locomotive steam power or horse power, which may be approved by the Board, and consented to by the abutting property owners, in accordance with the provisions of law, and by the Public Service Commission for the First District of the State of New York.

Provided, however, that the Board, upon giving to the Company one (1) year's notice, may require the Company to operate its railway upon the whole or upon any portion of the route herein authorized to be constructed, except upon the Washington Bridge structure, by underground electric power substantially similar to the system now in use on the street surface railways in the Borough of Manhattan, or upon the whole or any portion of said route by any other practical motive power then in use which does not require the use of poles and overhead wires in the streets and avenues and upon the bridge and its approaches, and thereupon to discontinue the use of the overhead trolley system, and to remove its poles, wires and other structures used by it for that purpose from the streets, avenues and bridge of the City upon said route.

Twelfth—Upon six (6) months' notice by the Board to the Company, all wires for the transmission of power, except trolley wires, for the operation of the railway, upon all or any portion of the route hereby authorized, shall be placed in conduits beneath or alongside of the railway. The Company shall provide in such conduits two

(2) ducts not less than three (3) inches in diameter for the exclusive use of the City. Such ducts shall be used only by the Company for the operation of its railway and by the City, as above.

Thirteenth—The rate of fare for any passenger upon said railway shall not exceed five (5) cents and the Company shall not charge any passenger more than five (5) cents for one continuous ride, from any point on its road or on any road, line or branch operated by it or under its control to any other point thereof, or any connecting branch thereof within the limits of the City.

The Company shall carry free upon the railway hereby authorized during the term of this contract all members of the Police and Fire Departments of the City, when such employees are in full uniform.

Fourteenth—No cars shall be operated upon the railway hereby authorized, other than passenger cars and cars necessary for the repair or maintenance of the railway, and no freight cars shall be operated upon the tracks of said railway.

Fifteenth—The Company shall attach to each car run over the said railway proper fenders and wheel guards, in conformity with such laws and ordinances as are now in force, or may hereafter, during the term of this contract, be enacted or adopted by the State or City authorities, or as may be required by resolution of the Board.

Sixteenth—All cars which are operated on said railway shall be heated during the cold weather, in conformity with such laws and ordinances as are now in force, or may hereafter, during the term of this contract, be enacted or adopted by the State or City authorities, or as may be required by resolution of the Board.

Seventeenth—All cars operated on said railway shall be well lighted by electricity, or by some lighting system equally efficient, or as may be required by resolution of the Board.

Eighteenth—Cars on the said railway shall run at intervals of not more than thirty (30) minutes both day and night, and as much oftener as reasonable convenience of the public may require, or as may be directed by the Board.

Nineteenth—The Company, so long as it shall continue to use any of the tracks upon the streets and avenues or bridge in or upon which said railway shall be constructed, shall cause to be watered at least three (3) times every twenty-four (24) hours when the temperature is above thirty-three (33) degrees Fahrenheit, the entire width of the streets, avenues and bridge, except when the width of such streets, avenues and bridge shall exceed sixty (60) feet between curb lines, in which case the Company shall cause to be watered only sixty (60) feet in width of such roadway, and the Company shall provide for such purpose at least one tank car, the capacity of which shall be sufficient to water such streets, avenues and bridge in a satisfactory manner.

Twentieth—The Company shall at all times keep the streets, avenues and bridge, upon which the said railway is constructed, between its tracks, the rails of its tracks and for a distance of two (2) feet beyond the rails, on either side thereof, free and clear from ice and snow provided, however, that the Company shall, at the option of the Commissioner of Street Cleaning, enter into an agreement for each winter season, or part thereof, to clean an equivalent amount of street surface from house line to house line.

And provided further, that the Company shall, at the option of the Commissioner of Bridges, enter into an agreement for each winter season, or part thereof, to clean an equivalent amount of roadway upon the bridge and its approaches.

Twenty-first—As long as said railway, or any portion thereof, remains in any street or avenue, or upon the bridge, the Company shall pave and keep in permanent repair that portion of the surface of the street, avenue or bridge in or upon which the said railway is constructed, between its tracks, the rails of its tracks and for a distance of two (2) feet beyond the rails on either side thereof, under the supervision of the local authorities, whenever required by them to do so, and in such manner as they may prescribe.

In case of the neglect of the Company to pave or repair the pavement on the streets after the expiration of thirty (30) days' notice to do so from the President of the Borough having jurisdiction, or in case of the neglect of the Company to pave or repair the pavement on the bridge after the expiration of thirty (30) days' notice to do so from the Commissioner of Bridges, said President or said Commissioner, as the case may be, may pave or repair the same at the expense of the Company. And the City shall have the right to change the material or character of the pavement of any street or avenue, and in that event the Company shall be bound to replace such pavement in the manner directed by the proper City official, at its own expense, and the provisions as to repairs herein contained shall apply to such renewed or altered pavement.

Twenty-second—Any alteration to the sewerage or drainage systems, or to any other subsurface or to any surface structures in the streets, required on account of the construction or operation of the railway, shall be made at the sole cost of the Company, and in such manner as the proper City officials may prescribe.

Twenty-third—It is agreed that the right hereby granted to operate a street surface railway shall not be in preference or in hindrance to public work of the City, and should the said railway in any way interfere with the construction of public works in the streets and avenues, or upon the bridge, whether the same is done by the City directly or by a contractor for the City, the Company shall, at its own expense, protect or move the tracks and appurtenances in the manner directed by the City officials having jurisdiction over such public work.

Twenty-fourth—Should the grades or lines of the streets and avenues in which the railway is hereby authorized be changed at any time after the railway has been constructed and during the term of this contract, the Company shall, at its own expense, change its tracks and appurtenances to conform with such new grades and lines, and during the construction of any public improvement upon said streets and avenues the Company shall take care of and protect the tracks and appurtenances at its own expense, all to be done subject to the direction of the City official having jurisdiction over the construction of such change.

Twenty-fifth—Upon one (1) year's notice from the Board the Company shall, if the Board shall so determine by resolution, cease the operation of the stub-end terminal at East 181st street and Broadway, and shall within sixty (60) days from the date of such notice make application to the Board for the right to construct, maintain and operate a loop terminal upon streets to be designated by the Board and shall on or before the expiration of said one (1) year enter into a contract for such loop terminal in substitution for the stub-end terminal hereby authorized.

Twenty-sixth—The Company shall keep and maintain the tracks and the electrical equipment upon the bridge and its approaches necessary for the operation of cars thereon in good order and repair and in such manner as shall be approved and directed by the Commissioner of Bridges, and shall furnish all motive power required by the Commissioner of Bridges for the operation of its cars. If deemed necessary by the Commissioner of Bridges, the Company shall install and operate a system of signals to insure the safe and efficient operation of cars, such system to be approved by the Commissioner of Bridges. In the event of any necessity for changing the layout of tracks, curves, switches, sidings or platforms on the bridge in order to facilitate operation of cars by the Company, said Company must do all the work and furnish all the labor and tools necessary for effecting such changes, which shall all be made

under the control and direction of the Commissioner of Bridges, and no such changes or construction connected therewith, or relating thereto, shall be made unless the plan or plans for the same have been first submitted to the Commissioner of Bridges and approved by him.

Twenty-seventh—Before beginning the operation of cars, the Company shall file with the Commissioner of Bridges a statement for his approval and assent as to the type of car which it proposes to operate and a sketch showing clearance dimensions, weight on axles and wheel spacing or such other information as may be required by said Commissioner. All cars operated over the bridge by the Company and all equipment and appliances relating to such operation shall be subject at all times to the inspection of the Commissioner of Bridges or his authorized representatives, who shall have power to forbid the entrance to the bridge of cars which may for any reason be unsatisfactory, and who shall have power to direct the removal of any old or inadequate appliance and the substitution thereof of appliances of approved character.

Said Commissioner may adopt rules and regulations in regard to the number of cars to be operated over the bridge, the rate of speed of said cars, the movement and headway thereof, the type and weight of cars to be used and the condition thereof, the switching of cars and the use of platforms and the control of the electrical current used by the Company, and the said Commissioner may alter and amend any such rules and regulations so as to secure the safety and comfort of persons using the bridge and preserve the purposes for which the bridge was constructed, and upon serving notice upon the Company that such rules and regulations have been made, amended or altered, the Company shall comply with all the requirements thereof.

Twenty-eighth—Nothing in this contract shall be deemed to affect in any way the right of the Commissioner of Bridges to make alterations or changes in the construction, operation or management of the bridge or to affect in any way the control of such Commissioner over such bridge, as provided by the Charter of the City.

Twenty-ninth—The Company shall submit to the Board a report not later than November 1 of each year for the year ending September 30 next preceding, and at any other time, upon request of the Board, which shall state:

1. The amount of stock issued, for cash, for property.
2. The amount paid in as by last report.
3. The total amount of capital stock paid in.
4. The funded debt by last report.
5. The total amount of funded debt.
6. The floating debt as by last report.
7. The total amount of floating debt.
8. The total amount of funded and floating debt.
9. The average rate per annum of interest on funded debt.
10. Statement of dividends paid during the year.
11. The total amount expended for same.
12. The names of the directors elected at the last meeting of the corporation held for such purpose.
13. Location, value and amount paid for real estate owned by the Company as by last report.
14. Location, value and amount paid for real estate now owned by the Company.
15. Number of passengers carried during the year.
16. Total receipts of Company for each class of business.
17. Amounts paid by the Company for damage to persons or property on account of construction and operation.
18. Total expenses for operation, including salaries—and such other information in regard to the business of the Company as may be required by the Board.

Thirtieth—The Company shall at all times keep accurate books of account of the gross receipts from all sources within the limits of the City, and shall, on or before November 1 of each year, make a verified report to the Comptroller of the City of the business done by the Company, for the year ending September 30 next preceding, in such form as he may prescribe. Such report shall contain a statement of such gross receipts, the total miles in operation within the limits of the City and the miles of railway constructed and operated under this contract, and such other information as the Comptroller may require. The Comptroller shall have access to all books of the Company for the purpose of ascertaining the correctness of its report, and may examine its officers under oath.

Thirty-first—In case of any violation or breach or failure to comply with any of the provisions herein contained, or with any orders of the Board or of the Commissioner of Bridges acting under the powers herein reserved, the franchise or consent herein granted may be forfeited by a suit brought by the Corporation Counsel, on notice of ten (10) days to the Company, or at the option of the Board by resolution of said Board, which said resolution may contain a provision to the effect that the railway constructed and in use by virtue of this contract shall thereupon become the property of the City without proceedings at law or in equity. Provided, however, that such action by the Board shall not be taken until the Board shall give notice to the Company to appear before it on a certain day not less than ten (10) days after the date of such notice, to show cause why such resolution declaring the contract forfeited should not be adopted. In case the Company fails to appear, action may be taken by the Board forthwith.

Thirty-second—If the Company shall fail to give efficient public service at the rates herein fixed, or fail to maintain its structures and equipment as herein provided in good condition throughout the whole term of this contract, the Board may give notice to the Company specifying any default on the part of the Company, and requiring the Company to remedy the same within a reasonable time; and upon failure of the Company to remedy such default within a reasonable time, the Company shall, for each day thereafter during which the default or defect remains, pay to the City the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250), as fixed or liquidated damages, or the Board, in case such structures or equipment which may affect the surface of the streets or of the bridge shall not be put in good condition within a reasonable time after notice by the Board as aforesaid shall have the right to make all needed repairs at the expense of the Company, in which case the Company shall pay to the City the amount of the cost of such repairs, with legal interest thereon, all of which sums may be deducted from the fund hereinafter provided for.

Thirty-third—The Company shall assume all liability to persons or property by reason of the construction or operation of the railway authorized by this contract, and it is a condition of this contract that the City shall assume no liability whatsoever to either persons or property on account of the same, and the Company hereby agrees to repay to the City any damage which the City shall be compelled to pay by reason of any acts or default of the Company.

Thirty-fourth—This grant is upon the express condition that the Company, within thirty (30) days after the signing of this contract by the Mayor, and before anything is done in exercise of the rights conferred hereby, shall deposit with the Comptroller of the City the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000), either in money or securities, to be approved by him, which sum together with any and all sums of money or any securities heretofore deposited with the Comptroller by the Company under and pursuant to franchises heretofore granted to it by the City for the faithful perform-



ance by the Company of the several franchises so granted, shall form a fund for the performance by the Company of all of the terms and conditions of this contract and compliance with all orders of the Board or of the Commissioner of Bridges acting under the powers herein reserved, especially those which relate to the payment of the annual charges for the privilege here granted, the rendering of efficient public service at the rates herein fixed, the repairs of the street and bridge pavement, the repair and maintenance of tracks and equipment upon the bridge and its approaches, and the removal of snow and ice and the quality of construction of the railway and the maintenance of the property in good condition throughout the whole term of this contract, and in case of default in the performance by the Company of such terms and conditions or compliance with such orders, or either or any of them, the City shall have the right to cause the work to be done and the materials to be furnished for the performance thereof after due notice, and shall collect the reasonable cost thereof from the said fund without legal proceedings; or after default in the payment of the annual charges, shall collect the same with interest, from the said fund after ten (10) days' notice to the Company; or in case of failure to observe the said terms and conditions of this contract and orders of the Board hereunder, relating to the headway, heating and lighting of cars, fenders, wheel guards and watering of street pavements, the Company shall pay a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50) per day for each day of violation, and the further sum of ten dollars (\$10) per day for each car that shall not be properly heated, lighted or supplied with fenders or wheel guards, in case of a violation of the provisions relating to those matters.

The procedure for the imposition and collection of the penalties in this contract shall be as follows:

The Board, on complaint made, shall give notice to the Company, directing its President, or other officer to appear before the Board on a certain day not less than ten (10) days after the date of such notice, to show cause why the Company should not be penalized in accordance with the foregoing provisions. If the Company fails to make an appearance, or, after a hearing appears in the judgment of the Board to be in fault, said Board shall forthwith impose the prescribed penalty, or where the amount of the penalty is not prescribed herein, such amount as appears to the Board to be just, and without legal procedure direct the Comptroller to withdraw the amount of such penalty from the security fund deposited with him. In case of any drafts made upon the security fund the Company shall, upon ten (10) days' notice in writing, pay to the City a sum sufficient to restore said security fund to the original amount, and in default thereof this contract shall be cancelled and annulled at the option of the Board, acting in behalf of the City. No action or proceeding or right under the provisions of this contract shall affect any other legal rights, remedies or causes of action belonging to the City.

Thirty-fifth—The words "notice" or "direction," wherever used in this contract, shall be deemed to mean a written notice or direction. Every such notice or direction to be served upon the Company shall be delivered at such office in the City as shall have been designated by the Company, or if no such office shall have been designated, or if such designation shall have for any reason become inoperative, shall be mailed in the City, postage prepaid, addressed to the Company at the City. Delivery or mailing of such notice or direction as and when above provided shall be equivalent to direct personal notice or direction, and shall be deemed to have been given at the time of delivery or mailing.

Thirty-sixth—The words "streets or avenues," and "streets and avenues," wherever used in this contract, shall be deemed to mean "streets, avenues, highways, parkways, driveways, concourses, boulevards, bridges, viaducts, tunnels, piers, places or any other property to which the City has title or over which the public has an easement," encountered in the route hereinabove described, and upon or in which authority is hereby given the Company to construct a railway.

Thirty-seventh—If at any time the powers of the Board or any other of the authorities herein mentioned or intended to be mentioned, shall be transferred by law to any other board, authority, officer or officers, then and in such case such other board, authority, officer or officers, shall have all the powers, rights and duties herein reserved to or prescribed for the Board or other authorities, officer or officers.

Sec. 3. Nothing in this contract shall be construed as in any way limiting the present or future jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission under the laws of the State of New York.

Sec. 4. This grant is also upon the further and express condition that the provisions of Article 5, and the other provisions of the Railroad Law pertinent hereto shall be strictly complied with by the Company.

Sec. 5. The Company promises, covenants and agrees on its part and behalf to conform to and abide by and perform all the terms and conditions and requirements in this contract fixed and contained.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department, and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a Department, chief of a Bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

Each bid or estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders in The City of New York, or of a guaranty or surety company duly authorized by law to act as surety, and shall contain the matters set forth in the blank forms mentioned below.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money to the amount of five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.
