COMMISSIONERS OF THE SINKING FUND OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

Proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund at a Meeting Held in Room 16, City Hall, at 11.30 o'Clock A. M., on Wednesday, May 20, 1914.

Present—John Purroy Mitchel, Mayor; Wm. A. Prendergast, Comptroller; Henry Bruere, Chamberlain; George McAneny, President, Board of Aldermen; Henry H. Curran, Chairman Finance Committee, Board of Aldermen.

The following communication was received from the Department of Taxes and Assessments relative to the premises leased for use of the Department, in the Offerman Building, No. 503 Fulton and 236 Duffield street, Borough of Brooklyn.

This matter was brought up and laid over at meetings held May 6 and 13, 1914.

April 25, 1914.

To the Honorable Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of The City of New York:

Gentlemen—On March 25 you adopted a resolution by which you directed that a lease be made of the second floor of the Offerman Building, in the Borough of Brooklyn, at 503 Fulton street, and a part of this second floor was assigned for the use of the Department of Taxes and Assessments. Immediately thereafter representations were made by this Department to Mr. O'Malley, the head of the Real Estate Bureau of the Finance Department, to the effect that the space assigned to this Department was entirely inadequate, and that to house the Receiver of Taxes, Collector of Assessments and Arrears and this Department in the same non-fireproof building was an exceedingly hazardous thing to do. It was then suggested to us that the Collector of Assessments and Arrears and the Receiver of Taxes were to have fireproof vaults constructed for the housing of their valuable records. In order that this Department might have sufficient space Mr. O'Malley suggested that we should

have the entire sixth floor and that a fireproof vault could be constructed on that floor of similar character to the vaults designed for the Receiver of Taxes and the Collector of Assessments and Arrears.

Thereafter the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund on April 1 rescinded the resolution adopted on March 25 and adopted a resolution directing that a lease be entered into of the entire sixth floor of the Offerman Building for the use of the Department of Taxes and Assessments. The lease was thereafter executed in accordance with this resolution.

The Board of Tax Commissioners being mindful of the very great loss which would accrue to the City from the destruction of the records of this Department and of the Receiver and Collector and of the risk of housing all these records in the same non-fireproof building, requested the Fire Department to inspect the building and advise the Tax Board as to whether or not a fireproof vault could be constructed on the sixth floor which would be a safe place for the storage of the Department's records. In conformity with this request the Fire Commissioner caused an inspection to be made and has sent to the Tax Department the following letter:

"I have received a report from Deputy Chief William H. Swartout of the Bureau of Fire Prevention on his inspection of the Offerman Building. I suppose that you are familiar with his findings as he states that the full Board met at the building. I transmit to you the substantial portion of his report, which contains the information you wish, as follows:

"While this building is of brick and stone construction, the floor beams are of wood, resting on iron girders, with wooden floors, open spaces between the beams, unprotected iron columns supporting interior girders, and an open floor area throughout.

"There are two open stairways and elevator shafts leading to the sixth floor. In addition an enclosed smokeproof stairway is being built and two present unused enclosed elevator shafts, on the Duffield street side, are going to be repaired and used.

"In order to properly provide against the possibility of a fire getting such headway as to destroy this building, which by reason of the unprotected iron columns, the center portion of same would collapse, I would recommend that a fireproof compartment be built in such manner that the entire compartment or vault, in case of such an occurrence, would be supported by the outside walls and remain in position, and built of the following materials and somewhat on the lines of the floor and sectional drawings submitted herewith.

"Not less than an eight-inch eye or channel beam, running the length of the front, from which section eye or channel beams will be bolted, running back and resting into the east wall (which is a blank wall 16 inches thick at this floor level), upon which will rest a sufficient number of beams for a covering of cement flooring. Angle iron stanchions, properly bolted to this iron framework, so as to form the room, with angle or channel iron trusses securely fastened to the front eye beam, in the manner shown in accompanying sketch, running up and securely bolted to the outer face of the wall, in such manner as will not obstruct the head room of a four-foot passageway running parallel with the entire room, for the use of a truck to convey the books to and from the vault whenever necessary.

"The weight and strength of these iron trusses and beams should be submitted on a plan and specification, to be approved by the Building Department.

"The entire compartment to be enclosed with 6-inch hollow tile blocks, covered on both sides with a ¾-inch coat of King's Windsor plaster, and to have a 4-foot opening provided with a pair of approved combination fireproof doors and locks, safe pattern, ceiling to be constructed of T irons, placed about two feet apart and of fireproof blocks and plastered.

"Plans showing the complete construction of this vault to be submitted for approval before commencement of the work."

"I should be very glad to be advised by you of any further steps which your Board desires taken by this Department in connection with the matter."

From this letter the Board of Tax Commissioners are assured that the vault proposed would undoubtedly furnish some protection, but they infer that in the judgment of the Chief of the Fire Prevention Bureau the vault would not furnish a protection to the records in the event of the total destruction of the building by fire. In view of the importance to the City of this matter the Board of Tax Commissioners have deferred action until you should be advised of the facts set forth in this letter. If we are to be housed in the Offerman Building we should advise the owners as speedily as possible of the improvements they must make.

The Committee, consisting of the Chamberlain and Chairman of the Finance Committee, Board of Aldermen, to which this matter was referred at the last meeting, reported verbally as to their findings and views in regard to the matter.

Mr. Mullen and Mr. Shipley, of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, were also heard.

Mr. Meier Steinbrink, representing the owners of the Offerman Building, was heard at length in regard to the matter, and concluded his remarks by offering to build a vault either in the basement or on the sixth floor, as the City might prefer, or else build a light vault on the sixth floor and a heavy one in the basement if the City so desires. Mr. Steinbrink also agreed to furnish plans and specifications for the vault for approval.

Mr. Lewis H. Pounds, President of the Borough of Brooklyn, was also heard in regard to the matter, and called attention to the very low rental at which the City secured the premises.

The Comptroller explained the situation which confronted the Department of Finance when the question of finding quarters for the Receiver of Taxes, the Bureau for the Collection of Assessments and Arrears and for the Department of Taxes and Assessments, housed in the Brooklyn Municipal Building, was being considered, and stated the reasons why the Offerman Building was unquestionably the most suitable to be had for the purposes desired, and at a very low rental.

A general discussion of the matter followed.

It was the sense of the Board that the owners should complete the alterations and improvements to the building required to be made under the terms of the lease as speedily as possible, leaving the question as to just what vault space was needed, for future consideration and action.

On motion of the Comptroller, the question of vault space was referred to his Honor the Mayor. The Mayor then stated that he would submit his findings to the Board for consideration and action.

The following communication was received from the Commissioner of Parks, Borough of Brooklyn, turning over as no longer required the old Dreamland Pier, in the front of the Park property at Coney Island:

The Commissioner of Docks requested that immediate action be taken in the matter, in order that the pier may be put in condition for use during the summer, after which time it would be returned to the Park Department for demolition.

May 20, 1914.

Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, Municipal Building, New York City:

Gentlemen—In accordance with an understanding resulting from conferences with the Mayor and other City officials, I herewith turn over to the Sinking Fund the so-called "Dreamland Pier" in front of park property at Coney Island. This is done with the understanding that it be turned over by you to the Department of Docks and Ferries for the purpose of controlling it during the season as a landing place for steamers. The following resolution was then offered for adoption:

Resolved, That, pursuant to the provisions of section 205 of the Greater New York Charter, as amended, the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund hereby assign to the Department of Docks and Ferries, the old Dreamland Pier, in front of the Park property at Coney Island, Borough of Brooklyn, turned over to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund by the Department of Parks, Borough of Brooklyn, under date of May 20, 1914, as no longer required by that Department.

Which resolution was unanimously adopted.

A communication was received from the Commissioner of Docks transmitting for approval plan for the alteration and amendment of the plan for the improvement of the water-front and harbor of The City of New York, as determined by the Department of Docks, April 13, 1871, and approved by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund April 27, 1871, in the vicinity of Pier 13, Wall street, East River, which was made and adopted by the Commissioner of Docks May 14, 1914.

A public hearing being necessary, the following resolution was offered for adoption:

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund hereby fix 11 o'clock in the forenoon on Wednesday, June 10, 1914, in Room 16, City Hall, Borough of Manhattan, as the time and place for a public hearing, relative to a request of the Commissioner of Docks, that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund approve the plan for alteration and amendment to the plan for improvement of the water-front and harbor of The City of New York, in the vicinity of Pier 13, Wall street, East River, made and adopted by the Commissioner of Docks in accordance with law May 14, 1914.

Which resolution was unanimously adopted.

BOARD OF REVISION OF ASSESSMENTS.

Proceedings of the Board of Revision of Assessments at a Meeting Held in the Mayor's Reception Room, City Hall, at 10.30 o'clock A. M., on Thursday, May 21, 1914.

Present—Alexander Brough, Deputy and Acting Comptroller; Louis H. Hahlo, Assistant and Acting Corporation Counsel, and Lawson Purdy, President, Department of Taxes and Assessments.

The minutes of the meeting held April 23, 1914, were approved as printed.

BOROUGH OF THE BRONX.

Regulating, Etc., East 165th Street.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the assessment list for regulating, grading, setting curbstones, flagging sidewalks, a space four (4) feet wide, laying crosswalks, building approaches and erecting fences where necessary in a strip 30 feet in width on each side of East 165th street from about 122 feet west on Grant avenue to about 76 feet west of Walton avenue, together with all work incidental thereto, with objections and applications for awards for damages of Annie C. Hanning, filed by Benjamin Trapnell, attorney, having been received from the Board of Assessors, under date of May 9, 1914.

Mr. Tobias, representing Mr. Trapnell, attorney, was heard in opposition to the assessment.

On motion of the Assistant and Acting Corporation Counsel, the objections filed against the assessment were overruled and the assessment list was confirmed, all the members voting in the affirmative.

Regulating, Etc., Jerome Avenue.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the assessment list for regulating, grading, setting curbstones, flagging sidewalks, laying crosswalks, building approaches and erecting fences where necessary in Jerome avenue from 190th street to a grade point 600 feet north of Van Cortlandt avenue, and from Mosholu parkway north to northerly line of the City and all work incidental thereto, together with a list of awards for damages caused by a change of grade, with objections and applications for awards for damages caused by the change of grade of G. C. Clarke et al., filed by Julia Alice Gainey, attorney, and an opinion received from the Corporation Counsel dated May 4, 1914, relative thereto, having been returned from the Board of Assessors under date of May 9, 1914.

At meeting held March 26, 1914, this list was referred back to the Board of Assessors for further consideration and to obtain an opinion of the Corporation Counsel with regard to the objections raised by attorney for objectors.

On motion, the assessment list was again referred back to the Board of Assessors, all the members voting in the affirmative.

Sewers and Appurtenances, East 170th street.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the assessment list for sewers and appurtenances in East 170th street between Morris avenue and the Grand Boulevard and Concourse, in the Grand Boulevard and Concourse east side between East 167th street and East 172d street, and objections of Vincent Astor, filed by Deering & Deering, attorneys, and A. Rogers, filed by John P. Dunn, attorney, together with reports of the Chief Engineer, Bureau of Sewers, Borough of The Bronx, maps, etc., relative thereto and a copy of testimony taken in the matter having been received from the Board of Assessors under date of May 9, 1914.

Mr. J. J. Dunn, representing Deering & Deering, attorneys, and Mr. John P. Dunn were heard in opposition to the assessment.

Laid over.

BOROUGH OF THE BRONX AND MANHATTAN.

Regulating, Etc., Kingsbridge Road.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the assessment list for regulating, grading, setting curbstones, flagging the sidewalks a space four feet wide, laying crosswalks, building approaches, erecting fences where necessary, and all work incidental thereto, in Kingsbridge road, from Bailey avenue to the boundary line between the Borough of The Bronx, and the Borough of Manhattan, City of New York, excepting the space between the tracks of the New York and Putnam Railroad; and for regulating, grading and regrading, setting and resetting curbstones, flagging and reflagging sidewalks, laying and relaying crosswalks, building approaches and erecting fences where necessary in Kingsbridge road, from Heath avenue to Bailey avenue, together with all work incidental thereto; regulating and grading West 225th street (Muscota street) from Broadway to the line between Boroughs of Manhattan and The Bronx and objections of the New York Central & Hudson River Railroad Company, filed by Alexander S. Lyman, attorney, and Emma L. Moller, filed by Deering & Deering, attorneys, having been received from the Board of Assessors under date of May 14, 1914.

Mr. James J. Dunn, representing Deering & Deering, attorneys, was heard in opposition to the assessment.

No others appearing in opposition after notice, on motion of the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments the objections filed against the assessment were overruled and the assessment list was confirmed, all the members voting in the affirmative.

BOROUGH OF THE BRONX.

Paving Garrison Avenue.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller brought up the matter of the assessment for paving with bituminous concrete on a cement concrete foundation the roadway of Garrison avenue from Tiffany street to Hunts Point avenue, adjusting curb where necessary, together with all work incidental thereto (preliminary pavement), and objections thereto, laid over at meeting of April 23, 1914.

Mr. Charles Donohue, representing Charles M. Sheafe, attorney, was heard in opposition to the assessment.

On motion of the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, the assessment list was referred back to the Board of Assessors with directions to reduce the amount of assessment on Lot 30 in Block 2734, five (5) per cent. and as so modified that the assessment be confirmed, all the members voting in the affirmative.

At 12.15 p. m. the Board adjourned.

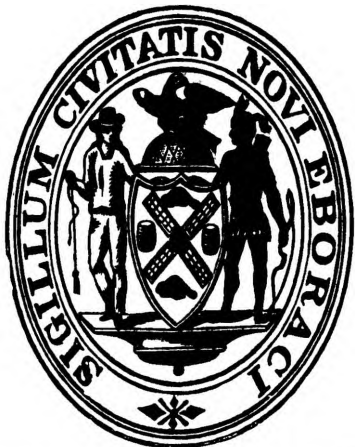

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof.
