

Prepare for Extreme Heat!



There is hot, and then there is hot!

Extreme heat is a period of high heat and humidity with temperatures above 90 degrees for at least two to three days. In extreme heat, your body works extra hard to maintain a normal temperature. 350 New Yorkers died prematurely last year from preventable heat illness. If you're older or have other health conditions like heart disease or asthma, you're at even higher risk. If you don't have an air conditioner at home, view our map of cool options and call locations ahead of time before heading out: Cool Options NYC.


Did you know that eligible households can get help to buy and install an air conditioner or fan? The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) provides a limited number of units on a first-come, first-served basis. The 2023-2024 Cooling Assistance Component benefit application period opened on April 15, 2024.

In circumstances where an air conditioner cannot be safely installed, a fan will be provided. Only one air conditioner or fan, not to exceed \$800 with installation for a window, portable air conditioner, or fan and not to exceed \$1,000 for an existing wall sleeve unit, will be provided per applicant household. No additional HEAP cash benefits are available.

You can apply online, by mail, or in person. If you submit an application, you will receive the HEAP Cooling Assistance Notice of Eligibility Decision after your application is reviewed. **For more information about eligibility and**



Grant Program or the RISE: NYC Program

All required licenses and permits are current

one-on-one risk assessment. Experts will review your physical location, business operations, and insurance needs to provide you with personalized recommendations to help reduce the risk to your business and/or property in the case of disruptive events. Program participants can receive a grant of up to \$5,000 to cover the costs of recommended measures or certain types of resiliency equipment such as portable flood barriers, generators, and fire-proof storage containers.

Application Priority Deadline: Business PREP Risk Assessment and Grant Program will be prioritizing applicants whose annual revenue does not exceed \$17 million until **July 26**, **2024**. REQUESTING FEEDBACK: FEMA Engaging Faith-Based and Community Organizations

FEMA and the DHS Center for Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships are seeking feedback on the draft, "Engaging Faith-Based and Community
Organizations: Planning Considerations for Emergency Managers." This





document, originally released in 2018, outlines best practices for engaging faith-based and community organizations before, during, and after disasters to help jurisdictions improve their resilience and emergency management capabilities. Once engaged, these organizations become significant force multipliers, particularly in reaching high-risk and historically underserved community members. Lessons learned from real-world events and updates to FEMA programs since 2018 have resulted in additional considerations and resources for faith-based and community organizations.

FEMA is hosting <u>several 60-minute webinar sessions</u> to provide an overview of the draft and facilitate discussion with participants to gather feedback on additional ways to improve the guide. FEMA seeks input, especially real-world experiences, that can be incorporated into the guide. Advance registration is required.

A line-numbered version of the draft guide is provided to help identify specific areas or topics for potential update. The feedback form can be used to capture any recommendations. To provide input, download the line-numbered version of the document "Engaging Faith-Based and Community Organizations: Planning Considerations for Emergency Managers" and feedback form, then submit the completed feedback form to NPD-Planning@fema.dhs.gov. New York City Emergency Management (NYCEM) is responsible for coordinating citywide emergency planning and response for all types and scales of emergencies. It is staffed by more than 200 dedicated professionals with diverse backgrounds and areas of expertise, including individuals assigned from other City agencies.

BUREAU: Office Of Strategic Operations

Director, Continuity of Operations (COOP), \$101,000-\$106,000 – Job ID# 638054

The COOP Unit manages internal and external continuity planning for New York City, to include City agency outreach, training, exercises, technology coordination, reporting, and program support. With latitude for independent initiative and judgment, the COOP Director will oversee a team of COOP Project Managers (PMs) and Specialists. This team is responsible for coordinating with City agency COOP teams to build and maintain the City's ability to continue operations during emergencies. The Director will be responsible for citywide COOP program administration and key initiatives such as the essential service review. The Director will also work within NYCEM to continuously improve the agency's internal continuity program.

The ideal candidate will have COOP and emergency management experience, project management expertise, the ability to effectively communicate and facilitate, demonstrated experience with stakeholder engagement, and the ability to work in a fast-paced environment.

BUREAU: Response

Public Warning Program Manager, \$84,872-\$84,872 – **Job ID#** 638057

The Public Warning unit operates 24 hours per day and seven days per week out of Watch Command, NYCEM's operations center. Public Warning staff work in conjunction with the Watch Command staff to monitor citywide radio frequencies; local, national, and international media; and social media to identify incidents impacting NYC and are responsible for the corresponding dissemination of Notify NYC alerts and notifications. The NYCEM Public Warning unit is also responsible for activation of the City's Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA) and Emergency Alert Systems.

Reporting to the Director of Public Warning with latitude for independent initiative and judgment,

the Program Manager is responsible for strategic, administrative, and operational support of New York City's Public Warning Unit, including, but not limited to, the Notify NYC program, Wireless Emergency Alerts, social media, and the Emergency Alert System.

BUREAU: External Affairs Bureau

Strategic Partnerships Specialist, \$68,428-\$68,428 – Job ID# 637903

The Strategic Partnerships Unit supports the resiliency of the City's private sector through information sharing, partnership building, training and education; facilitates the integration of private sector concerns into New York City's emergency planning, preparedness, response and recovery activities, and coordinates with businesses of all types and sizes to create a culture of preparedness that extends beyond the workplace.

Reporting to the Director of Strategic Partnerships, this person will work on private sector outreach efforts, as well as provide assistance and business continuity planning to ensure the resiliency of New York City. The Specialist will work closely with other units in NYCEM, as well as City, State, Federal, and non-governmental agencies to maintain, and continue to improve upon, existing plans and programs.
