For the reporting period September 16, 2018 through December 15, 2018, City agencies and offices have reported disclosures made under exigent circumstances or in violation of the Identifying Information Law as summarized below.

Type of disclosure reported	Summary description
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Inadvertent disclosure of identifying information provided in response to request for certain information regarding property. Source agency reported that affected individuals were provided notification containing an explanation of the circumstances of the disclosure, a description of the information that was inadvertently disclosed, and contact information for the Agency Privacy Officer if follow-up was necessary.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Inadvertent public posting of two additional data fields of identifying information (zip code, age range), due to administrative error. The two fields were promptly removed by the source agency in an abundance of caution to prevent an occurrence where the multiple data fields, if strung together with other data, could identify a person. No individual names, addresses, or contact information were published.
