COMMISSIONER OF ACCOUNTS.

Hon. JOHN PURROY MITCHEL, Mayor:

Sir—In conformity with the requirements of section 119, chapter 466, Laws of 1901, Greater New York Charter, I transmit herewith the RESULTS OF AN EXAMINATION OF THE RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHAMBERLAIN FOR THE SECOND QUARTER OF 1917.

I find that the balances in the city treasury, sinking funds and miscellaneous accounts on June 30, 1917, aggregated \$21,010,239.76, which agrees with the aggregate of the balances as shown by the Chamberlain's accounts and summaries accompanying this report. (See Exhibits "A," "B" and "C.")

STATE INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION—DEPARTMENT OF LABOR.

Resolution Adopted.

WHEREAS, THERE HAS BEEN SUBMITTED by the Division of Factory Inspection requests for modification of orders issued by the said Division, same having been made by the parties named herein against the premises noted, the granting of which requests would constitute a variation of law; and

Whereas, the said Division of Factory Inspection has had a reinspection made in each case and, according to the reports submitted, recommends as follows:

(1) Premises affected, Buffalo; appellant, The Pullman Company. 2—Provide 3 water closets in Storeroom No. 1. 3—Provide eight water closets in electric building. 1—Provide fifteen water closets in No. 1 stall car shop. 12—Provide seven water closets in machine, tin and blacksmith's shop. 24—Provide 15 water closets in mill and upholstering buildings.

Company has two service buildings in yard, one containing thirty individual closets and the other twenty-four individual closets; there is one water closet in engine room; one in boiler room; in the timbers are two urinals; stall shop, sixteen urinals; electric shop, three urinals; thirty-six in all. Separate water closet compartment in a toilet room provided for females, wherein are three water closets. These toilet rooms have an attendant and are properly kept, being clean and sanitary. This company contemplates providing additions to their present buildings, wherein are to be provided adequate inside water closet accommodations for all except in the stall car shop, wherein it is impractical to install as doors are continually being open to bring cars in and out and trucking. Men in stall shop clothed for all weathers and are therefore not inconvenienced by outside toilet accommodations.

Recommendation: Accept water closets as at present provided in service buildings and throughout the premises, with the understanding that adequate accommodations in buildings will be provided for all employees except those in stall shop when additions are made to buildings.

(2) Premises affected, Amsterdam, Lyon st.; appellant, Frank Spitzmiller. 1—Additional exit. 2—Prohibit all belts within 6 feet of floor, 2 3, 4 and 5 floors. Mills 8, 8a, 9 and 10. About one-half of the belts driving looms drive vertically and about one-half drive at an angle of about 60 degrees. All such belts are effectively guarded on front and both sides to height of about 2 feet. Maleable belt clamps used. The guards on the vertically driven looms belts are satisfactory; the guards on belts of looms that drive at an oblique angle should be guarded further to effectively guard same. These guards accepted heretofore according to instructions of Chief Inspector Jackson, who directed that they be thus guarded.

Recommendation: In view of the fact that the guards were approved by a former inspector, accept same on condition that all belts be protected with the present type of guard, and further that when the Code on Dangerous Machinery is adopted all belts will be protected in accordance therewith.

(3) Premises affected, Amsterdam, Lyon st.; appellant, Frank Spitzmiller. 1—Additional exit. 2—Prohibit occupancy. Four-story nonfireproof building erected before October 1, 1913; open loft; no sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm; 36 in building; 9 factory employees, 27 nonfactory; above 1st floor, 13; above 2nd floor, 7; above 3rd floor, 14; above 4th floor, and one from 2nd to 4th floors; 2nd floor level with roof of one-story section; at the west end there is an iron ladder from roof to ground; iron railing; an imperfect fire escape on west wall with nonfireproof windows; exits remote; no egress from roof.

Recommendation: Accept imperfect fire escape and exit to one-story roof from iron stairs to ground as 2nd exit while conditions and occupancy remain as is.

(11) Premises affected, Buffalo, 135 Tonawanda st.; appellant, U. S. Hame Co. 3—Arrange doors opening to stairway to open outwardly. Three-story semi-fireproof building erected before October 1, 1913, open loft except on 3rd floor; sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 104; above the 1st floor, 60; above the 2nd floor, 12 to 20. One interior staircase properly enclosed, equipped with sliding self-closing doors; two perfect fire escapes on the side; openings to balconies fireproof; exits remote, no egress from roof; hinged doors, opening outwardly would obstruct the stairway unless the building was reconstructed.

Recommendation: Waive order to open doors outwardly on condition that doors be left open at all times while building is open or any one employed therein.

(12) Premises affected, Buffalo, 378 Main st.; appellant, Eugene Tanke. Prohibit occupancy. Three-story nonfireproof building, measuring 23 by 34 feet; erected before October 1, 1913; open loft; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 23; above the 2nd floor, 7; above the 1st floor, 14; exits, one interior staircase from 1st to 3rd floors, doors to which open outwardly. (This stairway runs from 2nd to 3rd floors at one side of building, and continued from 2nd floor to ground on the other side of the building.) There is one exterior iron stairway, not screened, from 3rd floor to iron balcony and stairway in building adjoining; no egress on 2nd floor to this outside stairway; opening 3rd floor fireproof.

Recommendation: Accept the exits above described, viz., interior stairway from 1st to 2nd floor at one side, and 2nd to 3rd floor at opposite side of building, and exterior iron stairway with fireproof brick and concrete building erected before October 1, 1913; open loft; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 10; above the 2nd floor, 12 to 20. One interior staircase properly enclosed, equipped with sliding self-closing doors; two perfect fire escapes on the side; openings to balconies fireproof; exits remote, no egress from roof; hinged doors, opening outwardly would obstruct the stairway unless the building was reconstructed.

Recommendation: Waive order to open doors outwardly on condition that doors be left open at all times while building is open or any one employed therein.

(13) Premises affected, Buffalo, 231-235 Elm st.; appellant, Frank Spitzmiller. 4—Arrange all doors leading from workrooms to stairway to open out or be double swing. Three-story fireproof brick and concrete building erected before October 1, 1913; open loft; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 14; above the 1st floor, 6; above the 2nd floor, 12 to 20. One interior staircase properly enclosed, equipped with sliding self-closing doors; two perfect fire escapes on the side; openings to balconies fireproof; exits remote, no egress from roof; hinged doors, opening outwardly would obstruct the stairway unless the building was reconstructed.

RECOMMENDATION: Inasmuch as building is used only two months in year and occupancy small, accept present wooden stairs as one means of exit, and waive orders 9, 10, 11, 12 and as additional exit accept a 36-inch interior wooden stairway, properly handrailed, provided at west end. When exit provided as specified herein, No. 7 to be automatically waived.

(17) Premises affected, Maspeth, Mt. Zion Cemetery, near Maurice ave.; appellant, Lerman and Lichtenstein & Co., Inc. 1—Inside water closet for use of males as per Rule 102. Open space where 4 or 5 men work at granite cutting when weather is mild enough to permit them to work; there is no other structure or building except a small shed; no water closets near where the men are working; nearest closet in garden across the street; same is of privy type and kept in fairly good condition. In winter time these men work in firm's shop at 160 Broome st., New York City.

RECOMMENDATION: While conditions and occupancy remain unchanged, permit use of present accommodations and waive order.

(18) Premises affected, Port Chester, 1-5 Mill st.; appellant, John Ryan. 1—Additional means of exit. Five- and two-story building with open lofts; no sprinkler; combustibles (flour and feed mill); no fire alarm. Occupancy, 6; above the 1st floor, 1 twice a day to oil machinery; exit, one unenclosed interior stairway.

RECOMMENDATION: Accept as emergency exit, while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged, a vertical ladder from south window on east side of building, 5th floor down east side of building, passing windows on 2nd, 3rd and 4th floors, to roof over loading platform with ladder from thence to ground.

(19) Premises affected, Port Chester, Ft. Highland st.; appellant, Abdenroth Brothers. 1—Provide proper and adequate exhaust system for removal of dust from grinding wheels. Orders refer to 14 double emery grinding wheels located on 3rd and 4th floors of company's Building No. 7; wheels used by stove mounters for purpose of fitting castings on mounting stoves; same are used intermittently and no one works constantly at any of them. The work done makes the installation of a hood impracticable inasmuch as it is necessary to use the wheels on all sides.

RECOMMENDATION: Waiver of order in so far as it applies to wheels in mounting shop.

(20) Premises affected, Syracuse, 241-243 W. Adams st.; appellant, C. Per Lee Nixon. 5—Reconstruct both stairs of combustible material with treads not less than 10 inches wide, exclusive of nosing. Four-story nonfireproof factory building erected subsequent to October 1, 1913; with open lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm. Occupancy, 13; factory 11, other 2; above the 1st floor, 9; above the 2nd floor, none. Treads and railings of stairway are of wood, enclosed in hollow tile shafts measuring 10 by 10 by 6 inches, National Fireproof Co. Both stairways lead direct to open air. Doors to stairway enclosure are fireproof, self-closing, open outwardly; front stairway is 38 inches wide, 10-inch treads, 8-inch rise; rear stairway is 39 1/2 inches wide, 9 1/2-inch treads, 8-inch rise; building approximately 25 by 90 feet.

RECOMMENDATION: Acceptance of present stairways with 8-inch rise, treads of rear stairway 9 1/2 inches wide, stairs 39 inches and 39 1/2 inches, respectively; said stairways being constructed of wood and enclosed in hollow tile; waiver of order.

AND it appearing that there are practical difficulties and unnecessary hardships in complying with the strict letter of the law and the rules and regulations of the Industrial Code on the premises noted herein; and

It further appearing that each of the appellants herein has been notified that he would be given an opportunity to appear and be heard at this time and place, and such of the appellants who appeared having been heard by the Commission, therefore

Be it resolved that the Commission grant the variation recommended in each case with the understanding that said variation is to be effective only during the time that conditions remain as of this date.





of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances or fixtures as shall then be left standing, together with all money paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder agrees to the above conditions being understood as to be implied by the act of bidding, and the City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the date of possession and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials of labor and machinery necessary thereto,

and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furring, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls shall be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flushed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the Contractor.

"No buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery, sold for removal under these terms and conditions shall in any case be relocated or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, and if any such buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery, etc., shall be relocated or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, title thereto shall thereupon become vested in The City of New York and a sale at public or private sale may be made in the same manner as if no prior sale thereof had been made."

The Comptroller of The City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids, and be it further

Resolved, That while the said sale is held under the supervision of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, the Comptroller is authorized to cause the sale to be advertised and to direct the sale thereof as financial officer of the City.

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS ON WORK TO BE DONE FOR OR SUPPLIES TO BE FURNISHED TO THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

The person or persons making a bid for any service, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the bids will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also that it is made without any connection with any other person making a bid for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer or employee of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the bid that the several matters stated therein are in all respects true.

No bid will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of such bid, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks or trust companies of The City of New York, or a check of such bank or trust company signed by a duly authorized officer thereof, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement with the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

All bids for supplies must be submitted in duplicate.

The certified check or money should not be enclosed in the envelope containing the bid, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid.

For particulars as to the quantity or quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation of the City.

The contract must be bid for separately.

The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done or the supplies are to be furnished. Plans and drawings of construction work may be seen there.
