

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH AMENDING COVID-19 VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS FOR DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION EMPLOYEES, CONTRACTORS, VISITORS AND OTHERS

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020, the Commissioner of Health and Mental Hygiene ("Commissioner") declared the existence of a public health emergency within New York City to address the continuing threat posed by COVID-19 to the health and welfare of City residents, and such declaration and public health emergency continue to be in effect; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3.01(d) of the Health Code, when urgent public health action is necessary to protect the public health against an existing threat and a public health emergency has been declared, the Commissioner is authorized to issue orders and take actions that are deemed necessary for the health and safety of the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS, on September 15, 2021, the Commissioner issued, and on September 17, 2021, the Board of Health ratified and continued, an Order requiring proof of COVID-19 vaccination by September 27, 2021, for Department of Education ("DOE") employees, visitors to school buildings, charter school staff, and individuals who work inperson in a DOE or charter school setting or DOE building ("September 15, 2021 Order"); and

WHEREAS, on September 28, 2021, the Commissioner extended the deadline by which DOE employees, visitors to school buildings, charter school staff, and individuals who work in-person in a DOE or charter school setting or DOE building were required to comply with the September 15, 2021 Order ("September 28, 2021 Order"), which extension was ratified and continued by the Board of Health on October 18, 2021; and

WHEREAS, as of January 26, 2023, more than 7.5 million City residents, representing 90% of residents of all ages, have received at least one dose of vaccination against COVID-19, with more than 81% of residents having completed a primary series of vaccination; among 5- to 12-year-olds, 58% have received at least one dose and 51% have completed a primary series; among 13- to 17-year-olds, 93% have completed at least one dose and 83% have completed a primary series; and

WHEREAS, as of February 1, 2023, 171,371 DOE employees, representing 99% of all DOE employees, have completed a primary series of vaccination; and

WHEREAS, high vaccination rates correlate with lower rates of hospitalization and death, and the high rate of vaccination among City residents has proven effective in lessening the burden of COVID- 19 on the City's healthcare system; and

WHEREAS, on September 20, 2022, based on guidance from New York State, the Commissioner issued an Order to Rescind the Covid-19 Vaccination Requirement for Participation in High Risk Extracurricular Activities, which was ratified and continued by the Board of Health on October 25, 2022;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Health hereby orders that the September 15, 2021 Order, as amended by the September 28, 2021, Order is further **AMENDED** as follows:

1. Paragraph 1 of the September 15, 2021 Order, as amended by

the September 28, 2021 Order, is amended to **REPEAL** the requirement for new DOE staff and new City employees to provide proof of vaccination and **REPEAL** the requirement for staff of any charter school and staff of contractors working in DOE schools or buildings to provide proof of vaccination to their employee, and to **AMEND** the requirement that DOE staff and City employees who worked in- person in a DOE school setting, DOE building, or charter school setting were required to provide proof of vaccination to the DOE or their employee by October 1, 2021 or prior to beginning their employment, so that if any current staff or employee did not provide such proof, they are no longer required to do so.

- 2. Paragraph 3 of the September 15, 2021 Order, requiring visitors to DOE school buildings to have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, as amended by the September 28, 2021 Order, is **REPEALED**.
- 3. Paragraph 4 of the September 15, 2021 Order, relating to remote participation in public meetings and hearings in DOE school buildings, is **REPEALED**.

<u>Notice of Adoption of Amendments to</u> <u>Article 207 of the New York City Health Code</u>

In compliance with section 1043(b) of the New York City Charter ("the Charter") and pursuant to the authority granted to the New York City Board of Health ("Board of Health") by section 558 of the Charter, a notice of intention ("NOI") to amend Article 207 of the New York City Health Code ("the Health Code") was published in the New York City Record on November 4, 2022, and a public hearing was held on December 6, 2022. No one testified at the hearing and two written comments were received. There were comments made by members of the Board of Health when the NOI was introduced at the Board meeting on October 25, 2022, regarding the documentation required to make birth certificate changes. For the reasons discussed below, no changes have been made to the proposed amendment to Article 207 based on these comments and at its meeting on February 9, 2023, the Board of Health adopted the following resolution.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

Section 207.01 of the Health Code allows the Department to correct or amend birth certificates of minors upon application of their parents, surviving parent, or legal guardians in limited instances. Pursuant to Section 207.01, all applications must be accompanied by supporting documentation and no application may be approved unless the Department is satisfied that the evidence submitted shows the true facts and that an error or omission was made at the time of preparing and filing of the certificate or confidential medical report of birth or that the name of a person named in a birth certificate has been changed pursuant to court order. New corrected birth certificates are issued when the change is made within one year of birth.

This seemingly simple process for a name change does not work for the roughly 75 to 80 child welfare cases a year where parental rights have not been terminated and a child has been placed in the care and custody of the Administration for Children's Services (ACS), such as when a child has been placed in foster care. Currently, Section 207.01 does not allow ACS or any other social services agency to apply for a name change in these circumstances. The need for a birth certificate correction is most pressing when a placeholder such as "Baby Boy," "Girl," or "No Name Given," is on a birth certificate, because without an actual first name, it is difficult to establish the child's identity for services, including Social Security and Medicaid coverage. Social services agencies must therefore obtain a court order to permit the Department to correct a birth certificate, which adds time and expense to an already lengthy process of placing children in foster care families, while also delaying the children's access to social services.

To address this issue, at the October 25, 2022 Board of Health meeting the Department proposed amending Section 207.01(a) to allow a government agency — ACS in New York City, the Office of Children and Family Services in the rest of New York State, and social services agencies of other states and localities — to apply for corrections to a birth certificate, on behalf of a child, when a court has granted care and custody of that child to the agency. During this meeting, Board of Health members expressed concern that these changes might be made without appropriate documentation of the child's name. In response, the Department notes that Health Code section 207.01(b) currently requires that "[e]very application shall be accompanied by supporting documentary evidence," which requires the requesting agency to provide evidence as to why the name requested is the proper one to use, and the Department reviews this documentation to ensure its accuracy. In response to another Board member's query, the Department notes that this amendment will apply to children already in foster care. Therefore, the Board of Health is adopting the amendments as proposed so that the needs of children in the foster care system will more readily and seamlessly be met.

Statutory Authority

Section 558(b) and (c) of the Charter empower the Board to amend the Health Code and to include in the Health Code all matters to which the Department's authority extends. Section 558(c) of the Charter authorizes the Board to include in the Health Code provisions related to maintaining a registry of births and deaths. Section 556(c)(1) of the Charter authorizes the Department to supervise and control the registration of births and deaths. Section 1043(a) of the Charter grants rulemaking powers to the Department.

The amendments are as follows:

<u>New material is underlined.</u> [Deleted material is in brackets.] Asterisks (***) indicate unamended text.

"Shall" and "must" denote mandatory requirements and may be used interchangeably in the rules of this department, unless otherwise specified or unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

RESOLVED, that subdivision (a) of section 207.01 of Article 207 of the New York City Health Code, set forth in Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York, is amended to read as follows:

The Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee may approve (a) the amendment of a birth, termination of pregnancy or death termination of a confidential medical report of birth, spontaneous termination of pregnancy or death. Application shall be made on a form furnished by the Department. Application for amendment of a birth certificate [shall] may be made <u>only by the person whose</u> birth certificate is to be corrected if such person is 18 years of age or over, or by the parents or surviving parent of a child that is deceased, [or] by the legal guardian of the person whose birth certificate is to be corrected, or by an agency in accordance with subdivision (e) of this section [or by the person] if such person is under 18 years of age[or over]. Application for amendment of a spontaneous termination of pregnancy shall be made by the parents or surviving parent. Application for amendment of a death certificate, or of a confidential medical report of death shall be made by the person in control of disposition as defined in Article 205 of this Code or by the person identified on the death certificate as providing the personal particulars pursuant to Article 205 of this Code.

RESOLVED, that a new subdivision (e) be added to section 207.01 of Article 207 of the New York City Health Code, set forth in Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York, to read as follows:

(e) When a court of competent jurisdiction has remanded or placed a child to the care and custody of the Administration for Children's Services or an authorized government social services agency outside of the City of New York responsible for the welfare of a child, as determined by the department, such agency may make an application for correction of a first name when none or a placeholder was provided on the original birth certificate.

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ORDER OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH RESCINDING ORDERS REQUIRING COVID-19 VACCINATION IN CHILD CARE AND EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAMS, FOR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL STAFF, AND FOR INDIVIDUALS WORKING IN CERTAIN CHILD CARE PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020, the Commissioner of Health and Mental Hygiene ("Commissioner") declared the existence of a public health emergency within New York City to address the continuing threat posed by COVID-19 to the health and welfare of City residents, and such declaration and public health emergency continue to be in effect; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3.01(d) of the Health Code, when urgent public health action is necessary to protect the public health against an existing threat and a public health emergency has been declared, the Commissioner is authorized to issue orders and take actions that are deemed necessary for the health and safety of the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2021, the Commissioner issued, and on September 17, 2021, the Board of Health ratified and continued, an Order requiring staff of early childhood programs or services that are provided under contract with the Department of Education or the Department of Youth and Community Development to provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination (the "September 12, 2021 Order"); and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2021, the Commissioner issued, and on November 19, 2021 the Board of Health ratified and continued, an Order requiring COVID-19 vaccination and face coverings in child care and Early Intervention programs (the "November 17, 2021 Order"), which was modified by the Board of Health on July 21, 2022, to rescind the mask requirement (the "July 21, 2022 Order"); and

WHEREAS, on December 2, 2021, the Commissioner issued, and on December 20, 2021, the Board of Health ratified and continued, an Order requiring COVID-19 vaccination for nonpublic school staff (the "December 2, 2021 Order"); and

WHEREAS, as of January 26, 2023, more than 7.5 million City residents, representing 90% of residents of all ages, have received at least one dose of vaccination against COVID-19, with more than 81% of residents having completed a primary series of vaccination, and 58% of children ages 5 to 12 years have received at least one dose and 51% have completed a primary series of vaccinations; and

WHEREAS, high vaccination rates correlate with lower rates of hospitalization and death and the high rate of vaccination among City residents has proven effective in lessening the burden of COVID-19 on the City's healthcare system; and

WHEREAS, on September 20, 2022, based on guidance from New York State, the Commissioner issued an Order to Rescind the Covid-19 Vaccination Requirement for Participation in High Risk Extracurricular Activities, which was ratified and continued by the Board of Health on October 25, 2022; and

WHEREAS, on October 25, 2022, the Board of Health rescinded, as of November 1, 2022, the December 13, 2021 Order to Require COVID-19 Vaccination in the Workplace, which had required nongovernmental workers to provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination said rescission which took effect November 1, 2022;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Health hereby orders that the September 12, 2021 Order, the November 17, 2021 Order as modified by the July 21, 2022 Order, and the December 2, 2021 Order are **RESCINDED**.

All written comments and a summary of the oral comments received by the Department will be made available to the public within a reasonable period of time by the Department's Office of the General Counsel.

What authorizes the Department to make this amendment? Section 558(b) and (c) of the Charter empower the Board to amend the Health Code and to include in the Health Code all matters to which the Department's authority extends. Section 558(c) of the Charter authorizes the Board to include in the Health Code provisions related to maintaining a registry of births and deaths. Section 556(c)(1) of the Charter authorizes the Department to supervise and control the registration of births and deaths. Section 1043(a) of the Charter grants rulemaking powers to the Department. The Department did not include the proposed amendment in its regulatory agenda for this fiscal year because it did not contemplate this amendment at the time.

Where can I find the Department's rules? The Department's rules and the Health Code are located in Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What laws govern the rulemaking process? The Department must satisfy the requirements of Section 1043 of the Charter when adding or amending rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043(b) of the Charter.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

Since 2019, the New York State ("NYS") Reproductive Health Act (NYS Public Health Law Article 25-a) has protected the right to an abortion throughout the State. The Act permits abortions when the patient is within twenty-four weeks from the commencement of pregnancy, there is an absence of fetal viability, or the abortion is necessary to protect the patient's life or health. NYS Public Health Law § 2599-bb(1).

In contrast and as a result of the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, No. 19-1392, 597 U.S. (2022), abortions are mostly banned in 12 states and have been severely restricted in many other states.¹ Some of these antiabortion laws make it more difficult to receive standard surgical procedures or medication for the loss of desired pregnancies. There are reports of providers in the affected states refusing to perform procedures needed to fully evacuate the uterus after a spontaneous termination of pregnancy, *e.g.*, a dilation and curetage ("D&C"), lest they be accused of performing an abortion. Women have faced life-threatening infections and other complications as a result.² In addition, some lawmakers in states that have mostly banned abortions have considered targeting people traveling to other states to seek abortion care.³ Whether state abortion-restricting laws can apply extraterritorially is an open constitutional question.⁴

In anticipation of the *Dobbs* decision, New York State and New York City took legislative action in 2022 to protect abortion patients

and those helping patients access abortions. The State adopted laws generally prohibiting (1) courts and county clerks from issuing subpoenas in connection with out-of-state proceedings related to abortions lawfully performed in New York;⁵ and (2) State and local law enforcement agencies from cooperating with, or providing information to, any individual or out-of-state agency or department regarding abortions lawfully performed in New York.⁶ The City separately adopted a law prohibiting the use of City resources to cooperate with, or provide information to, any individual or out-of-state agency or department that would confirm, deny, or identify any person associated with an abortion that has been lawfully performed.⁷ This local law defines "abortion" as "the procedure to terminate a pregnancy for purposes other than producing a live birth, including a termination using pharmacological agents, and any services related to such procedure, including pre-procedure and post-procedure counseling."

In New York City, fetal deaths must be reported to the Department as part of its vital records-keeping function.⁸ The Department is not permitted to include the name or any identifying information about an individual whose termination of pregnancy was induced unless the individual requests it to be collected.⁹ Rather, the Department uses unique, confidential identifiers to "monitor the quality of care provided by any individual or entity licensed to perform an abortion in this state and to permit coordination of data concerning the medical history of the woman for purposes of conducting surveillance scientific studies and research."¹⁰ In addition, the City's Administrative Code provides that records of fetal death "shall be issued upon request unless it does not appear to be necessary or required for a proper purpose."¹¹

In New York City, Health Code Section 203.03(a) requires that all terminations of pregnancy be reported to the Department. "Termination of pregnancy" ("TOP") is defined in Health Code § 203.01(a) as "the expulsion or extraction of a conceptus, regardless of the duration of pregnancy, other than a live birth ... , and includes fetal death." Section 203.01(b) defines "spontaneous termination of pregnancy," commonly referred to as a miscarriage, as the "unplanned termination of a pregnancy," while section 203.01(c) defines "induced termination of pregnancy," commonly referred to as an abortion, as "the purposeful interruption of an intrauterine pregnancy with the intention other than to produce a live-born infant and which does not result in a live birth." Health Code § 203.07(c) requires that the certificate of induced TOP "be confidential and not subject to compelled disclosure or to inspection by persons other than the Commissioner or authorized personnel of the Department." In contrast, Health Code § 203.07(a) offers *less protection* to confidential medical reports of spontaneous TOPs by allowing disclosure of the records "in a criminal action or criminal proceeding, or for official purposes by a federal, State, county or municipal agency charged by law with the duty of detecting or prosecuting crime. The Commissioner may, however, approve the inspection of such medical reports for scientific purposes."

The lesser protections afforded spontaneous TOPs by Health Code § 203.07(a) are no longer be in sync with the State and City laws enacted in 2022 and described above: under the current Code provisions, it is possible that an out-of-state law enforcement agency could try to access spontaneous TOP records of an out-of-state resident in order to commence an action against an alleged "illegal abortion" under that state's laws. The Department therefore proposes amending Health Code § 203.07 to afford both induced and spontaneous TOPs the same level of protection and to allow the Department to assess any subpoenas or other requests for spontaneous TOP records to determine whether the underlying use is permitted by State and City law.

The proposed amendment is as follows:

RESOLVED, that section 203.07 of Article 203 of the New York City Health Code, set forth in Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York, be amended to read as follows:

§ 203.07 Confidential medical report of spontaneous termination of pregnancy and certificate of induced termination of pregnancy; not subject to [compelled disclosure or] inspection.

- (a) The confidential medical report of a spontaneous termination of pregnancy and <u>the certificate of induced termination of pregnancy</u> shall be confidential and not subject to [compelled] disclosure or to inspection by persons other than the Commissioner or authorized personnel of the Department[, except in a criminal action or criminal proceeding, or for official purposes by a federal, State, county or municipal agency charged by law with the duty of detecting or prosecuting crime]. The Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee may, however, approve the inspection by others of such medical reports <u>and certificates</u> for scientific <u>or lawful</u> purposes.
- (b) Within the context of this section, scientific purposes shall mean epidemiologic surveillance and investigation by a governmental public health agency, research, or the compilation of statistics relating factors bearing on disease incidence, prevalence, mortality or treatment.
- [(c) The certificate of induced termination of pregnancy shall be confidential and not subject to compelled disclosure or to inspection by persons other than the Commissioner or authorized personnel of the Department.]

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ORDER OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH TO AMEND THE REQUIREMENT FOR COVID-19 VACCINATION FOR CITY EMPLOYEES AND EMPLOYEES OF CERTAIN CITY CONTRACTORS

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020, the Commissioner of Health and Mental Hygiene ("Commissioner") declared the existence of a public health emergency within New York City to address the continuing threat posed by COVID-19 to the health and welfare of City residents, and such declaration and public health emergency continue to be in effect; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3.01(d) of the Health Code, when urgent public health action is necessary to protect the public health against an existing threat and a public health emergency has been declared, the Commissioner is authorized to issue orders and take actions that are deemed necessary for the health and safety of the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS, on October 20, 2021, the Commissioner issued an "Order to Require COVID-19 Vaccination for City Employees and Certain City Contractors" that required all City employees, except certain Department of Correction employees and certain employees of some City contractors, to provide proof to the agency or office where they work that they had been vaccinated against COVID-19, and required certain employees of some City contractors to provide the same proof to their employer (the "October 20, 2021 Order"); and

WHEREAS, on October 31, 2021, the Commissioner issued a "Supplemental Order to Require COVID-19 Vaccination for City Employees and Employees of Certain City Contractors," delaying until November 8, 2021, application of the October 20, 2021 Order for certain employees or contractors, and requiring additional City contractors not covered by the October 20, 2021 Order to ensure that certain of their employees, provide proof that they had been vaccinated against COVID-19 (the "October 31, 2021 Order"); and

WHEREAS, on November 1, 2021, the Board of Health ratified and continued both the October 20, 2021 Order and the October 31, 2021 Order; and

WHEREAS, as of February 1, 2023, 331,955 City employees, representing 96% of all City employees, have completed a primary series of vaccination, and high vaccination rates correlate with lower rates of hospitalization and death; and

WHEREAS, as of January 26, 2023, more than 6.6 million adults residing in New York City, representing 99% of all such adults, have received at least one dose of vaccination against COVID-19, and more than 5.9 million adults residing in New York City, representing 90% of all such adults, have completed a primary series of vaccination, and high vaccination rates correlate with lower rates of hospitalization and death; and

WHEREAS, the high rate of vaccination among adults in New York City has proven effective in lessening the burden of COVID-19 on the City's healthcare system;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Health hereby orders that the October 20, 2021 Order, and the October 31, 2021 Order, as ratified and continued by the Board of Health on November 1, 2021, are hereby **AMENDED** as follows:

- 1. Paragraph 3 of the October 20, 2021 Order is **REPEALED**, so that a City employee who does not provide the required proof of vaccination as described in paragraph 2 of that Order no longer need be excluded from the premises at which they work.
- 2. Paragraph 4 of the October 20, 2021 Order, and paragraph 2 of the October 31, 2021 Order, are **MODIFIED**, so that a City human services contractor or other City contractor described in those paragraphs no longer needs to require their covered employees to provide proof of vaccination against COVID-19.

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 227 October 7, 2022

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2021, the federal monitor in the *Nunez* use-of-force class action stated steps must be taken immediately to address the conditions in the New York City jails; and

WHEREAS, on June 14, 2022, the federal court in Nunez approved the Nunez Action Plan, which "represents a way to move forward with concrete measures now to address the ongoing crisis, at Rikers Island"; and

WHEREAS, while there has been improvement in excessive staff absenteeism, the Department of Correction's (DOC's) staffing levels continue to contribute to a rise in unrest and disorder and create a serious risk, to the necessary maintenance and delivery of sanitary conditions; access to basic services including showers, meals, visitation, religious services, commissary, and recreation; and prompt processing, at intake; and

WHEREAS, this Order is given to prioritize compliance with the *Nunez* Action Plan and to address the effects of DOC's staffing levels, the conditions, at DOC facilities, and health operations; and

WHEREAS, additional reasons for requiring the measures continued in this Order are set forth in Emergency Executive Order No. 140; and

WHEREAS, the state of emergency existing within DOC facilities, first declared in Emergency Executive Order No. 241, dated September 15, 2021, and extended most recently by Emergency Executive Order No. 211, dated September 22, 2022, remains in effect;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant, to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited, to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency: Section 1. I hereby direct that section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 221, dated October 2, 2022, is extended for five (5) days.

2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified, at an earlier date.

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 228 October 7, 2022

WHEREAS, the public safety was imperiled by a flash flood emergency caused by the remnants of Hurricane Ida that flooded roads, impacted mass transit, stranded motorists, and caused widespread damage to residential and commercial buildings throughout the City, causing unsafe conditions in those buildings and imperiling health and safety; and

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant, to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited, to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. <u>State of Emergency</u>. I hereby order that sections 2 through 4 of Emergency Executive Order No. 224, dated October 7, 2022, are extended for five (5) days.

§ 2. I hereby suspend: (i) Sections 28-111.1.1 and 28-111.1.2 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, but only, to the extent such provisions limit temporary structures or uses to no more than 90 days; (ii) sections 28-118.3.1 and 28-118.3.2 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, Chapter 2 of Article 2, Chapter 2 of Article 3, Chapter 2 of Article 4 and any other applicable district use regulations, including in Special Purpose Districts, of the Zoning Resolution of the City of New York and any other provisions of such code, resolution or rules,, to the extent that they would prevent the alteration and/or use of buildings as temporary humanitarian relief centers ("Humanitarian Emergency Response and Relief Centers" or "HERRCs") that will provide assistance for arriving asylum seekers, provided that such structures or buildings, regardless of length of stay, shall be occupied in a manner that will not endanger public safety, health, or welfare as certified by a registered design professional.

 \S 3. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified, at an earlier date.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant, to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited, to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency, it is hereby ordered:

Section 1. I hereby order that section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 225, dated October 7, 2022, is extended for five (5) days.

Violations of the directives set forth in this Order may be issued as if they were violations under Health Code sections 3.07 and 3.11, and enforced by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene or any other agency.

 \S 3. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified, at an earlier date.

WHEREAS, the state of emergency existing within DOC facilities, first declared in Emergency Executive Order No. 241, dated September 15, 2021, and extended most recently by Emergency Executive Order No. 211, dated September 22, 2022, remains in effect;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant, to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited, to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct that section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 227, dated October 7, 2022, is extended for five (5) days.
