Minutes of Meeting of the Municipal Civil Service Commission of New York, Held Thursday, May 21, 1914, at 10.15 o'Clock A. M.

Present—Dr. Henry Moskowitz, President, and Commissioner Alexander Keogh. The President presided.

Hon. George McAneny, President of the Board of Aldermen; Hon. William A. Prendergast, Comptroller, and Hon. Marcus M. Marks, President of the Borough of Manhattan, appeared in behalf of the request of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for the exemption of the following positions:

Secretary, Committee on City Plan; Secretary, Committee on Social Welfare; Secretary, Committee on Port and Terminal Facilities; Secretary, Committee on Education; Secretary, Committee on Markets; Secretary, Committee on Revision of City Charter.

Hon. Samuel H. Ordway, Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Civil Service Reform Association, appeared in opposition. The matter was again laid over. The Commission then went into regular session.

Upon the recommendation of the Committee on Special and Temporary Appointments, the following appointments were authorized in accordance with the requests of the several departments on the dates specified:

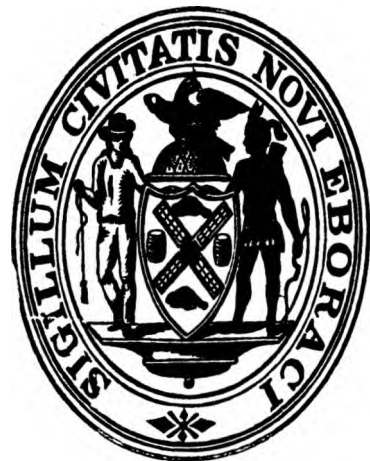
