Funeral Arrangements for Sanitation Enforcement Sergeant Frank Musella

Sgt. Musella is First Line-of-Duty Death in 34-year History of Enforcement Division

Sanitation Enforcement Sergeant Frank Musella died on July 29, while on duty on Staten Island. He was hired in October 2006 and was 37 years old. He leaves behind his wife, Alessandra, and two sons, Frank, Jr., 8 and Anthony, 4. When off duty, Sgt. Musella volunteered his time and efforts to support DSNY's Autism Speaks campaign.

About the Enforcement Division:

The Enforcement Division monitors compliance with administrative, recycling, and health laws governing the maintenance of clean streets, illegal posting and dumping, theft of recyclables, and proper storage and disposal of recycling and garbage by NYC residents and businesses.

About the New York City Department of Sanitation

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) promotes a healthy environment through the efficient management of solid waste and the development of environmentally sound long-range planning for handling refuse, including recyclables. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of 2,022 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 365 salt/sand spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,000 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
