No Trash, Curbside Composting, or Recycling Collection on Lincoln's Birthday, Saturday, February 12, 2022

The New York City Department of Sanitation announced that in observance of the Lincoln's Birthday holiday, there will be no trash, curbside composting or recycling collection on Saturday, February 12, 2022.

- Residents who normally receive **Saturday trash or curbside composting** collection may place their material at the curb between 4 p.m. and midnight **Sunday** evening for collection beginning **Monday**, however delays are to be expected, as is common after holidays and winter storms. We appreciate patience as we work to collect the backlog of material.
- Residents who normally receive **Saturday recycling collection** should place their material out at curbside between 4 p.m. and midnight on Friday, February 18 for pickup on Saturday, February 19.

EDITOR'S NOTE:

Please note this guidance is given in advance of the actual holiday, and Mother Nature can be unpredictable this time of year. As such, snow operations could be taking place. Please refer to our website or social media channels for updated operational information.

About the New York City Department of Sanitation

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) keeps New York City healthy, safe and clean by collecting, recycling and disposing of waste, cleaning streets and vacant lots, and clearing snow and ice. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 705 salt spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
