My DEAR Sir.— In repaying Fitth avenue it was my intention to lay sheet asphalt in the centre of the roadway between Thirty-fourth and Thirty-sixth streets, with a strip of granite on either side of the asphalt next to the curb.

In good weather the asphalt will be perfectly practicable for all kinds of vehicles, but would not be in certain conditions of atmosphere and weather.

Recently I have become impressed with the knowledge that a cork pavement, much used in Europe, and which I have been experimenting with for over a year on First avenue, offers an equally good resistance as granite and is perfectly noiseless.

As there are three club-houses on these two blocks, I desire to secure a noiseless pavement, if I can do so consistently with every other essential requirement.

I am satisfied that the cork will accomplish what I desire.

It will be necessary to lay 1,102 square yards of it, which would cost \$5,785.50, but as the Barber Asphalt Paving Company is now under contract to lay the concrete, at a cost of \$3.85 per yard, the additional cost for laying the surtace with cork will amount to only \$1,542.80.

I therefore request that your Board will pass a resolution authorizing me to modify the Barber Asphalt Paving Company's contract, if they so consent, so that cork may be substituted for granite wherever, in my opinion, it may be necessary on Fifth avenue, at a cost not to exceed \$1,600, and that the necessary indebtedness may be incurred to furnish this amount.

SIR—On the 2d of July, 1897, Mr. F. J. Jenner, sales agent for cork paving bricks, wrote to you as per copy inclosed. After several conferences between Mr. Jenner and yourself, at which I was present, I wrote as per inclosed copy on the 24th of September.

You will notice that Mr. Jenner proposes to lay concrete. This is unnecessary, as the Barber Asphalt Paving Company contract co pavement, namely, at \$3.85 per square yard, and the cork brick pavement, at \$5.25 per square yard, making a difference of \$1.40. The area is 1,102 square yards, so that, while the amount of Mr. Jenner's contract will be \$5,785.50, the difference between the two pavements will amount to only \$1,542.80.

As said in my letter of September 24, I regard the cork pavement as offering a superior foothold As said in my elected of september 24, regard the contract as offering a superior footnote to granite, and I may add, any other paving substance with which I am acquainted. It is also less noisy than sheet asphalt, and I hope you will see your way clear to asking the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to allow you to lay that material.

years, the appropriation for salary account has been inadequate, and transfers had to be made each year to enable the Department to perform the service required under that appropriation.

4th. The sum of \$8,000 to the appropriation "Public Buildings—Construction and Repairs for 1897," from the appropriation for "Lamps, Gas and Electric Lighting for 1897," from which the amount can be spared. The present appropriation for public buildings, construction and repairs is nearly exhausted. Necessity and ultimate economy requires that all the municipal buildings shall be put in the best possible condition, especially as to roofs, for the coming winter season, and it is for that purpose that the transfer is needed.

5th. The sum of \$68,000 to the appropriation for "Repairs and Renewal of Pavements and Regrading for 1897," from the appropriation for "Repairing Streets and Avenues for 1897." The Department has made special efforts this year to place the stone-block pavements, of which there are over six million square yards, in the best possible condition, and in these efforts the present appropriation for repairs of pavements has been nearly exhausted, as for instance Sixth avenue, between Twenty-third and Fifty-ninth streets.

It is eminently desirable that the work shall be continued, so that the pavement shall be in the best possible condition at the close of the working season, and that there shall be no danger that during the winter season, when paving work has to be practically suspended, they should become dangerous in places through neglect of work which could be done before winter sets in.
