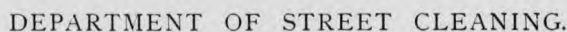

NOTICE TO PROPERTY-OWNERS.

IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 927 OF THE
"New York City Consolidation Act of 1882," the Comptroller of the City of New York hereby gives public notice to property owners, on the day of the year, by the assessment list for the opening of Pleasant avenue, between One Hundred and Fourteenth and One Hundred and Twenty-fourth streets, which was confirmed by the Supreme Court of the City of New York, on the 16th day of September, 1884, in the Record of Titles of Assessments, kept in the "Bureau for the Collection of Assessments and Arrears of Taxes and Assessments and of Water Rents," that unless the amount assessed for benefit on any person or property shall be paid within sixty days after the date of said entry of the assessment, interest will be collected thereon as provided in section 928 of said "New York City Consolidation Act of 1882." M. and 2 P. M., and all payments made thereon, on or before November 21, 1884, will be exempt from interest as above provided, and after that date will be subject to a charge of interest at the rate of seven per centum from the date of entry in the Record of Titles of Assessments in said Bureau to the date of payment.
