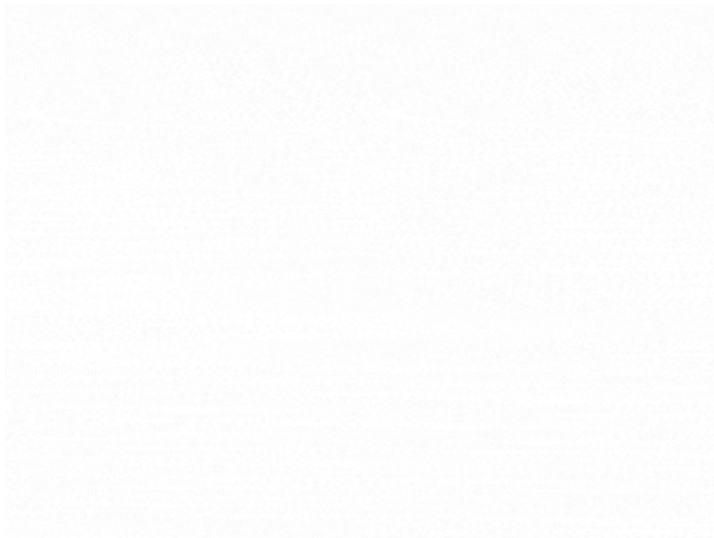

**Did you know?** More than **1 in every 5** Christmas tree fires were caused by a heat source too close to the tree.

**As you deck the halls this season, be fire smart.** Read manufacturer's instructions for the number of light strands to connect.

Make sure your tree is **at least 3 feet away** from heat sources like fireplaces, radiators and space heaters.

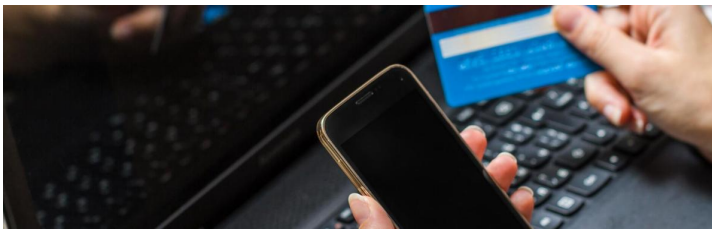

## Cyber Secure for the Holidays



'Tis the season for gift giving and shopping online has become a convenient solution for many since 1994. A cyberattack can happen any time of the year. We shared ways to protect yourself from a cyberattack. Here are ways to respond during a cyberattack:

- Check your credit card and bank statements for unrecognizable charges.
- Check your credit reports for any new accounts or loans you didn't open.
- Be alert for emails and social media users that ask for private information.
- If you notice strange activity, limit the damage by changing all of your internet account passwords immediately.
- Remember: A company will not call you and ask for control of your computer to fix it. This is a common scam.
- Let work, school or other system owners know what happened.
- If you find a problem, disconnect your device from the Internet and perform a full system restore.

Last week's question:

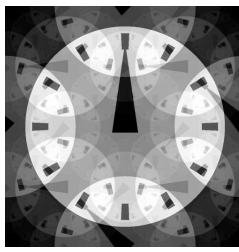
As a CERT member, if you were on the block at the time either of these incidents occurred, what actions would you take?

Correct Answer(s): C is correct. All other answers involve you assisting at an active emergency. This is the task of first responders, like FDNY and NYPD. CERT members NEVER self-deploy. If it is determined that there is a role for CERT on-scene, it will be AFTER the scene is deemed safe and you will receive an email from NYCEM CERT Staff with the role and all of the details you will need to assist. Your safety is our priority! Possible CERT roles after emergencies like these two in the Bronx: Registration assistance at a service or reception center, pedestrian or vehicular traffic management around the perimeter of the incident location, or escorts for building residents into building to retrieve personal items.

As NYC CERT, you are asked: what is NYCEM is doing about local flooding? You should tell them:

a) you are a CERT member, and this is not what you do.

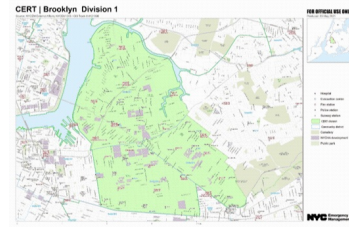

Christmas is observed annually on December 25th as a religious and cultural holiday celebrated by billions of people, globally. The traditions of recognizing the birth of Jesus Christ, the spirit of Santa Claus, Christmas trees, gifts, charity, and goodwill are ubiquitous, but did you know these fun facts about this festive time in the United States of America (USA):

- On December 21, 2023, the U.S. Postal Service's holiday tracker reported 8 billion packages processed, so far. Last year, December 2022, the holiday tracker reported 12 billion packages processed.
- Christmas trees have an ancient tradition that dates to the Egyptians and Romans, but it wasn't until 1850 when they made their debut as an essential holiday item and were available for purchase across the USA, after Prince Albert of Germany popularized it when he bought a Christmas tree for Queen Victoria of England in 1848.
- 35 million Christmas trees are sold and more than 45 million are planted, annually. A Christmas tree has an average growth rate of about 15 years.
- Saint Nickolas of Myra, Sinter Klaas, is not only the inspiration for Santa Claus, but is also the patron saint of banking, orphans, sailing, and New York City.
- Christmas trees were banned from the White House, in 1901, by then president, Teddy Roosevelt, who was an environmentalist.
- The first musical interlude in space was "Jingle Bells." It was performed by Astronauts Wally Shirra, on harmonica, and Tom Stafford, on sleigh bells, aboard Gemini VI, after telling Mission Control they spotted an unidentified object entering the Earth's atmosphere at the North Pole on December 16, 1965.
- Construction workers, who were working at Rockefeller Center, during the 1931 holiday season, were the first to place a small, undecorated tree to brighten their spirits. A couple years later, a Christmas tree appeared in the same spot, but this time decorated with string lights. Over the years, the Christmas tree at Rockefeller Center attracts visitors in the millions from all

NYC Emergency Management wishes all New Yorkers a Happy Kwanzaa as we celebrate African American culture from December 26th through January 1st

Here are some interesting facts about Kwanzaa:

- Kwanzaa was created by Dr. Maulana Karenga in 1966. The name Kwanzaa comes from a Swahili phrase that means "first fruits of the harvest". Some people combine aspects of Kwanzaa and Christmas together today in order to celebrate their race as well as their religion
- Kwanzaa is celebrated by ceremonies throughout the week. Many people celebrate by decorating their home in African art as well as the traditional Kwanzaa colors of green, black, and red. They may also wear traditional African clothing. Women may wear a colorful wrap called a kaftan. Men may wear a colorful shirt called a dashiki and a hat called a kufi.
- On the last day of Kwanzaa, families often gather for a large feast called karamu. Sometimes karamu is celebrated at a local church or community center. Here they enjoy traditional African dishes.

**There are seven main principals, one for each day of the celebration:**

- Umoja - Unity: To remain united in the community
- Kujichagulia - Self-Determination: To be responsible for yourself and your community
- Ujima - Collective Work and Responsibility: To work together
- Ujamaa - Cooperative Economics: To create African-American owned businesses
- Nia - Purpose: To build and develop the community
- Kuumba - Creativity: To improve our community and make it more beautiful

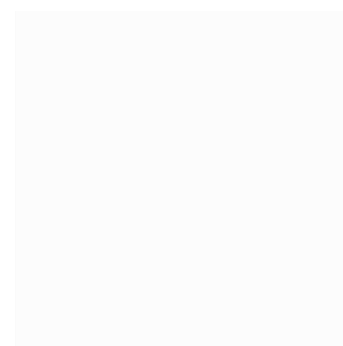

## THINGS TO KNOW



### How To Request NYC CERT

If approached to support an event in your community, the following steps must be taken:

- Event organizer submits an official request using the [NYC CERT External Request Form](#).
- NYC CERT Leadership *should not* submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT Division, volunteer leadership (Ready New York Liaison, if a preparedness event) should submit this [Event Request form](#)

NYC CERT program staff will review all requests. If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the [NYC CERT Event Calendar](#)

with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.

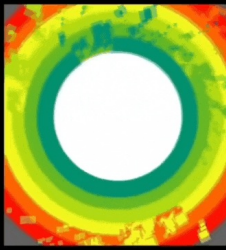
