# HIGHLIGHTS

#### Over \$2 Million Raised for Haiti **Relief Fund**



Immediately following the January 12th earthquake, Mayor Bloomberg established New York City's Haiti Relief Fund, administered by the Mayor's Fund, to provide a secure vehicle for donations to aid the victims. As of May 1, we received over \$2 million in donations from caring individuals citywide and from around the globe.

In consultation with the Clinton Foundation, we have dispersed funds to nearly a dozen organizations

You can see a complete list of the recipients at www.nyc.gov/fund. On February 20th New York Road Runners sponsored the Run for Haiti. With

approximately 10,000 runners and walkers, it was one of the largest runs in Central Park history and helped raise almost \$500,000 for the Relief Fund.

City students and employees also joined the fundraising efforts. Over 200 New York City public schools held bake sales, craft sales and other creative events to bring in over \$200,000 to support the Fund. Employees of the Health and Hospitals Corporation and of the Department of Correction held notable fundraising drives, bringing in more than \$125,000 and \$50,000 respectively. Mayor Bloomberg and Council Speaker Quinn also called on City workers to donate through a payroll deduction program, raising over \$211,000.

### **NYC School Gardens Initiative** Announcea





On May 13th, Mayor Bloomberg launched the NYC School Gardens Initiative. Supported by Rachael Ray and her Yum-o! organization, new resources will help schools to build gardens or connect schools to local community gardens. The City is also launching new cooking and nutrition programs at New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) sites including instruction for teens on the culinary arts as a career path begining this fall.

There are now three "learning gardens" at City Hall Park, Gracie Mansion, and Randall's Island where students can gain hands-on experience.

Prior to the startof the coming school year, a new website will be in place that lists available resources, including technical assistance, and a mini-grants program for schools that want to start a garden. The website is supported by funds raised from a recent benefit dinner hosted by Mario Batali at his restaurant Del Posto. Recently Bank of America announced a \$120,000 donation to fund mini-grants for schools who want to start a garden. 
## **NYC Service Celebrates Its One Year Anniversary**

## MillionTreesNYC Training **Program Graduates Its Second Class**



Participants of the MillionTreesNYC Training Program (MTTP) graduated on April 27th. This year 28 New Yorkers, ages 18 - 24, completed the seven-month program, which provides extensive specialized training and education in arboriculture, forestry and landscape design. Trainees participated in over 1,000 hours of

educational programs and numerous in-the-field trainings in areas such as tree climbing, chainsaw use and community garden planning. As a result of the strength of this training, the growing need for tree care professionals and expanding partnerships with private tree care companies, the majority of graduates already have job offers. ## Third Family Justice Center **Opens**



The Bronx Family Justice Center, the third in the Family Justice Center Initiative, opened its doors on April 19th. The center brings together domestic violence prosecutors, civil attorneys, and social service providers to help victims of domestic violence and their families. In the five years

since the first center opened, over 80,000 victims have accessed the services they need.
