

The Mayor's Office to End Domestic and Gender-Based Violence (ENDGBV) develops policies and programs, provides training and prevention education, conducts research and evaluations, performs community outreach, and operates the New York City Family Justice Centers (FJCs) in each borough. The NYC Family Justice Centers are co-located multidisciplinary service centers providing vital social services, civil legal, and criminal justice assistance for survivors of domestic and gender-based violence and their children—all under one roof. The FJCs have contracted providers and community partners that provide services to clients.

This is the fourth annual report to be provided in compliance of Local Law 38 of 2019, covering the time period January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023. Information provided in Tables 3, 4 and 5 reflect only FJC contracted providers as required by the local law. This report provides an overview of select ENDGBV program activities and initiatives.<sup>1</sup>
