DEPARTMENT OF DOCKS.

At a meeting of the Board of Docks held March 19, 1884.

Present—The full Board.

The minutes of the meetings held March 6th and 12th instant were read and approved.

The following communications were received, read, and

On motion, laid on the table to await action as stated, to wit :

From J. J. and William Astor—In reference to building a crib-bulkhead and filling in on the north side of the Harlem river, at One Hundred and Sixty-first street. Engineer-in-Chief to be directed to examine and report. Secretary directed to advise that it is proper and necessary that the application should be made to this Department for permission to do the work, and to request that a map of the premises be furnished to this Department.

From Cornell Steamboat Company—Requesting that a berth be assigned to them at Pier, old 33, North river, and that the slip be dredged to give sufficient depth of water. Engineer-in-Chief to be directed to examine and report as to dredging required thereat.

From Engineer-in-Chief :

1st. Reporting as to damage to one of the columns in Pier, new 27, North river. Engineer-in-Chief to be directed to report further in the matter.

2d. Reporting that the Manhattan Dredging and Elevating Company had not made repairs to Scows 3 and 12, as directed by the Board. Referred to the Treasurer.

3d. Report on Secretary's Order No. 3497, submitting diagram of premises used for ferry purposes by the Astoria Ferry Company.

4th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 3511, in reference to premises at One Hundred and Fiftieth street, Harlem river.

The following communications were received, read, and,

On motion, ordered to be placed on file, action being taken where necessary, as stated, to wit :
From Counsel to the Corporation—Enclosing forms of contract for building a new pier at Thirty-sixth street, North river, and for repairing Pier at Twenty-fifth street, East river, with his approval as to form endorsed thereon.

From Old Dominion Steamship Company—Requesting permission to drive piles at the bulkhead at Pier, new 26, North river. Secretary stating that, by direction of the Commissioners he had granted a permit therefor, the work to be done under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-in-Chief, his action was approved.

From Simpson, Spence and Young—Requesting that the annual rental for Pier, new 56, North river, be reduced. Secretary directed to advise that the Board have no authority to make any change in the rental provided to be paid by the terms of the lease.

From Pilot Commissioners—In reference to canal boat reported as being sunk in the slip, between Thirty-seventh and Thirty-eighth streets, North river.

From Mangan and Bunnell—In reference to derrick on the bulkhead at Pier 6, North river, and requesting that permission be granted to M. Stripp to erect one thereat. Secretary to direct the Dock Master to notify the owner of the derrick to remove the same within three days, or the same will be removed by this Department, at his cost and expense. Engineer-in-Chief to be directed to examine and report on application for new portable derrick, and to take down and remove the old derrick, if not removed by the owner within three days.

From Thomas Manning—In reference to ownership of the Steam yacht "Midget." Secretary directed to advise that the Board have no knowledge, as to the ownership of the same.

From James J. Ebert—Requesting permission to repair the platform at One Hundred and Thirtieth street, Harlem river. Permission granted, the work to be done under the supervision and direction of the Engineer-in-Chief.

From Engineer-in Chief :

1st. Reporting assignments of employees to special duty other than that to which they were appointed. Secretary directed to notify the bookkeeper of the same.

2d. Reporting amount of work done during the week ending March, 15, 1884.

3d. Reporting that cleats were required on the bulkhead, between Piers, new 37 and 38, and also, between Piers, new 39 and 40, North river. Engineer-in Chief to be directed to do the work.

4th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 3530, submitting specifications for paving with cobble stones, the bulkhead between Piers, new 41 and 42, North river. Treasurer to get estimates for doing the work.

5th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 3505, that he had superintended the erection of a platform on piles north of Fifty-fourth street, East river.

6th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 3557, that the work of driving four piles at the south side of Pier, new 26, North river, had been done under his supervision.

7th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 3467, that the dumping-boards at Seventeenth and Forty-sixth streets, East river, had been dredged under his supervision.

8th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 3518, that he had superintended the repairing of fender-piles at Pier, new 26, North river.

From George W. Wanmaker, Dock Master :

1st. Reporting that the outer end of Pier, old 22, North river, was in bad condition. Engineer-in-Chief to be directed to examine and report.

2d. Reporting that a spring pile on the south side of Pier, new 1, North river, was broken. Engineer-in-Chief to be directed to examine and report.

From Edward Abeel, Dock Master—Reporting that there was a dangerous hole in Pier 55, East river, ; also, that the fenders on the lower side of the pier needed replacing. Engineer-in-Chief to be directed to examine and report.

From Edward Gilon, Dock Master—Reporting that the Piers at Forty-sixth, Forty-seventh and Fifty-fifth streets, North river, needed cleaning. Secretary directed to request the Department of Street Cleaning to have the same cleaned.

From Robert Hall, Dock Master—Special report in reference to loss of horse at the bulkhead at Sixty-second street, East river. Secretary directed to advise Messrs. Shafer & Gottgetreu, the attorneys for Henry Bormann, that from the information obtained by this Department, it appears that the loss was occasioned by the carelessness of the driver, and that the city is not liable for the loss sustained.

A communication from M. S. Driggs & Co., and others, protesting against the location of a dry dock on the upper side of Pier 52, East river, was received, read, and ordered to be placed on file, and,

On motion, the application of Wm. Jenkins and James Tregarthen for permission to make spur shores fast to the upper side of Pier 52, East river, to protect their dry dock from coming in contact with the pier, was taken from the table, and ordered to be placed on file, and the Secretary directed to advise that their application was denied, objection having been made to the location of the dry dock thereat.

Commissioner Voorhis presented a report submitting estimates received by him for repairing the bulkhead at Twenty-ninth street, East river, and for furnishing yellow pine required for use by the Department and the disposition made of the Treasurer's orders issued therefor, as follows :

AQUEDUCT COMMISSION.

Minutes of Stated Meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, held at their office, No. 78 Tribune Building, Wednesday, March 19, 1884, at 2 o'clock P. M.

Commissioners present—The Mayor, the Comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Works, Commissioners James C. Spencer, William Dowd, and C. C. Baldwin.

Also Counsel to the Corporation, George P. Andrews; Chief Engineers Church, Principal Assistant Engineer Feeley, and Consulting Engineer Davis; also Chief Engineer Newton, and Consulting Engineer Adams of the Department of Public Works.

The meeting was opened for public hearing, pursuant to notice, and was attended by many property-owners and other persons interested, among whom were Messrs. Cyrus W. Field, Horace B. Clafin, William H. Arnoux, George Hart, Joseph P. Disbrow, Benjamin Odell and Joseph Benedict; James E. Serrel and others of the Central Taxpayers' Association.

Upon invitation of the President, Mayor Edson, those present, who desired to be heard, addressed the Commissioners, and full reports of the statements made were recorded by the official stenographer.

Upon the statement of William H. Arnoux, Esq., that he desired more time for himself—and others whom he represented—to make further examinations as to the proposed new Aqueduct, dams, etc., based upon the plans, specifications, and estimates of the Commissioner of Public Works, now under consideration by this Commission, the Mayor announced that to give Judge Arnoux, and all others who may desire, full opportunity to be heard, the hearing would be adjourned to Saturday next, the 22d instant, at 3 o'clock P. M., and thence until Wednesday, the 26th instant, at 3 o'clock P. M., on which last-named day the hearing would be concluded.

The hearing was then adjourned until Saturday next, the 22d instant, at 3 o'clock P. M., and the regular order of business taken up.

The minutes of the Stated Meeting of March 5th were read and approved.

The Committee on Finance and Audit presented the following vouchers for expenditures of the Commission, viz.: Nos. 106 to 121 inclusive, which, having been duly examined and certified by said Committee, were approved by the Board, and certified to the Comptroller.

A communication was received from Theo. Weston, C. E., relative to the size of the new aqueduct, and was referred to Chief Engineer Church for consideration and report.

A communication was presented from Everett P. Wheeler, Esq., enclosing one relating to the cost of the construction work of the Aqueduct.

Which was ordered placed on file.

Applications were received from several persons seeking employment in the Engineer Corps, and were referred to the Chief Engineer.

The following resolution was offered by Commissioner Dowd and seconded by Commissioner Thompson:

Resolved, "That the Secretary is hereby directed from and after this date, to publish the minutes of the stated meetings of this Commission in the CITY RECORD within ten days after each of said meetings."

Which was passed unanimously.

Matters relating to the right of way to be acquired, were then discussed, and after conference with the Engineers present, it was

"Resolved, That it is the sense of this Commission, that a right of way for the new Aqueduct, whether the fee in the lands, or an easement right is to be acquired, be obtained of the width of sixty-six (66) feet; excepting where additional widths are required for cuts and embankments, and for shafts, portals, dumping grounds, and other appurtenances of said Aqueduct; and that the property maps for said right of way be prepared in accordance therewith, unless where it may be otherwise directed by this Commission hereafter."

Chief Engineer Church asked authority to select an assistant for duty in the office of the Engineer of Construction; and to obtain suitable offices at or near Tarrytown for said engineer, his assistants and draftsmen; which matters were referred to the Committee on Finance and Audit with power.

The meeting was then adjourned.

FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE PUBLIC, and especially of those using the Wharf Property of the City of New York, the following extracts from the rules and regulations established for the guidance of the Dock Masters appointed by the Board governing this Department, and to be observed by them in the performance of their duties, are hereby promulgated and published:

Resolved, For the proper supervision of the waterfront of the city, the care of the wharf property located thereon placed in the charge of this Department, the rendering of necessary facilities for the prompt berthing of vessels thereat, and the collection of the wharfage accruing therefrom, that the water-front of the City of New York be and hereby is arranged and divided into nine districts, and that for each of the said districts there shall be appointed, designated, or assigned, from time to time, at the pleasure of the Board, a suitable and competent person to be known and entitled as "Dock Master," who shall perform such duties and render such services in relation to the supervision, regulation, and occupation of the wharf property and water-front in their respective districts, as the laws of the United States and of the State of New York, the ordinances of the City of New York, and the by-laws of this Board, and its rules, or orders, shall or may require, prescribe, or direct.

The several districts so made and created, and the Dock Masters assigned thereto, are as follows, to wit:

District No. 1.—Embracing all that portion of the East river, extending from Castle Garden, on the Battery, to and including Pier 21, East river.

Charles H. Thompson, Dock Master; office, 33 Coenties Slip.

District No. 2.—All that portion of the North river extending from Castle Garden, to and including Pier old 42, North river.

George W. Wanmaker, Dock Master; office, foot of Duane street, N. R.

District No. 3.—From east side Pier 21, East river, to and including Pier 55, East river.

Edward Abel, Dock Master; office, 262 South street.

District No. 4.—From north side Pier, old 42, North river, to and including pier at foot of West Twenty-third street, North river.

John M. Smith, Dock Master; office, Pier, new 43, N. R.

District No. 5.—From north side Pier 55, East river, to north side of Thirty-fourth street, East river.

Bernard Kenney, Dock Master; office, foot of East Sixteenth street, E. R.

District No. 6.—From north side Pier at Twenty-third street, North river, to and including Pier at foot Fifty-ninth street, North river.

Edward Gilon, Dock Master; office, Pier, new 57, N. R.

District No. 7.—From north side of Thirty-fourth street, East river, to south side of Ninety-second street, East river.

Robert Hall, Dockmaster; office, 645 First avenue.

District No. 8.—From north side of Pier at Fifty-ninth street, North river, to Yonkers and Spuyten Duyvil Creek, from North river to Kingsbridge.

Theodore S. Croft, Dockmaster; office, foot of West Seventy-ninth street, N. R.

District No. 9.—From south side Ninety-second street, East river, to and including Bronx river, and also Harlem river, from East river to Kingsbridge.

John Callan, Dockmaster; office, foot of East One Hundred and Fourth street, Harlem river.

Resolved, That until otherwise ordered by this Board the following rules and instructions are issued for the guidance and observance of the several Dock Masters of the Department:

Each Dock Master shall promptly designate and assign in the order in which application is made, suitable and convenient berths, so far as practicable, within the limits of his district, for the use of such vessel and water craft as may require the same for the reception or discharge of passengers, merchandise, etc., therefrom or for the necessary repair or the safety of any vessel or water craft.

It shall be the duty of each Dock Master to require and enforce the due observance of and compliance with such of the national and State laws, city ordinances, and the rules, regulations and orders of the Department of Docks as appertain to the use, care, and custody of the wharf property of and about the City of New York, promptly reporting to the Board all violations and evasions of such laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and orders.

Each Dock Master is expressly prohibited, under penalty of immediate dismissal from his position, from receiving or demanding, directly or indirectly, any fee, gratuity, compensation, or article of value of any nature or kind, for the assignment of a berth to a vessel at any pier, slip, or wharf property whatsoever, or for the performance of or the omission to perform any of the duties required of or pertaining to the position of Dock Master of this Department.

Any person or persons having any cause of complaint against the Dock Masters for any failure or omission in the performance of the duties as required by the above rules, are requested to promptly communicate the same to this Board, at their offices, Nos. 117 and 119 Duane street.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK, No. 301 MOTT STREET, NEW YORK, March 25, 1884.

AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH of the Health Department of the City of New York, held at its office on the 21st day of March, 1884, the following resolutions were adopted:

Resolved, That under the power conferred by law upon the Health Department, the following additional section and amendments of the Sanitary Code for the security of life and health be and the same are hereby adopted, and declared to form a portion of the Sanitary Code:

Resolved, That section 56 of the Sanitary Code be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 56. That the keeping and slaughtering of all cattle, and the preparation and keeping of all meat and fish, birds and fowl, shall be in that manner which is, or is generally reputed or known to be best adapted to secure and continue their safety and wholesomeness as food. The slaughtering and driving of cattle shall not be permitted or conducted at any place in the City of New York south of Thirty-ninth street, and the slaughtering of cattle shall not be conducted at any place in the City of New York north of said street, without a special written permit from this Department, nor unless the same shall be done in buildings located directly upon the water front, each having a capacity sufficient for the yarding and slaughtering daily of one-half of the entire number of cattle or hogs, or small stock (all or separately, according to the particular object of each abattoir) slaughtered in this city, at the time the application for the permit for such abattoir shall be made, and so constructed as to receive all stock deliverable thereto, directly from cars or transports, and so that all liquid refuse may be discharged below low water-mark, and the proper care and disposition of all parts of the slaughtered animals upon the premises be secured, or the immediate removal thereof by means of boats.

Resolved, That section 5 of the Sanitary Code be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 5. That the word "physician" shall include dentists, and every other person who practices about the cure of the sick or injured, or who has the charge of, or professionally prescribes for, any person sick, injured or diseased, and any person who pursues the business of or acts as midwife; that the phrase "contagious disease" shall be held to include all persons sick, affected, or attacked by or of a disease of an infectious, contagious, or pestilential nature (more especially, however, referring to cholera, yellow fever, small-pox, diphtheria, ship or typhus, typhoid, spotted, relapsing, and scarlet fevers), and also including any new disease of an infectious, contagious or pestilential nature, and also any other disease publicly declared by this Board dangerous to the public health; and every physician in said city shall at all times cause his or her name, office, and residence, and also his or her kind and class of practice, to be registered within the Sanitary Bureau, and in a manner according to the regulations prescribed by this Board.

Resolved, That section 157 of the Sanitary Code be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 157. That it shall be the duty of every person who has discovered or seen the body of a dead human being, or any part thereof if there is reason for such person to think that the fact of the death, or the place of such body, or part thereof, is not publicly known, to immediately communicate to the Sanitary Bureau the fact of such discovery of such body, the place where, and the time when, the same was discovered or seen, and where the same is or may be found, and any facts known by which said body may be identified, or the cause of death ascertained.

Resolved, That section 159 of the Sanitary Code be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 159. That at least two hours before the holding of any inquest within the City of New York upon a dead body, the coroner who has been notified of any death, or who may propose or intend to hold such inquest, shall transmit and cause to be delivered to the Sanitary Bureau a written notice containing the following facts, so far as known or reported to any such coroner:

- 1. The fact of any such call for the holding of an inquest, and by whom made, and when and from whom received by the coroner.
2. The place (giving the street and street number, and if there be none, then other particulars) where the body is.
3. What is reported to be the cause of the death.
4. When and where the death took place, and where the body has since been.
5. When and where he proposes to hold the inquest, giving the street number or otherwise sufficiently designating such place, and the hour.
6. What physician, or physicians, or other professional person last attended such deceased person, or attended such person within forty-eight hours of such decease.

At any time after the commencement of any inquest, the coroner holding, or who should hold, or who held such inquest, shall within twelve hours after the receipt of a written request so to do from the Sanitary Superintendent, answer in writing such of the following or such other questions as may be propounded to him by the said inspector to the best of his knowledge, information, and belief.

Report of Coroner (here insert Coroner's name), upon the body of (here fill in name or description of deceased), on the (here fill in year, month, and day), at (here mention street and number.

1. What was the age, sex, and last occupation, residence, and nativity of such deceased person?

2. At what house or place, and in or near what street or avenue, and at what number therein did such deceased person die?

3. If such person died of any poison, when and where was the same administered, and what was the kind of poison?

4. If such person died of violence, when and where was the same committed, and upon what part of the body and organs, and of what did it consist?

5. If such person died of any other cause, state such cause, and when and where the cause took effect upon or was received by the deceased?

6. Who was the last in care of or with such deceased person, and at what place and at what time before death, and when, giving the full name and residence of each such person?

7. What was the name and residence of the physician and persons who last attended, and of each physician and person who within forty-eight hours of such death attended upon such deceased person, and where did he so attend; and whether said physician was notified of or attended and was examined at such inquest?

8. The times, places, and dates of holding the inquest, and the names and residences by street number of the jurors and witnesses that attended, and dates of their attendance, and when and where the body of the deceased was present at such inquest?

9. Was any post-mortem examination made, and if so, when, where, and by whom, and who was present thereat?

It shall be the duty of all coroners in said city to make return to the Sanitary Bureau of all inquisitions by them taken, except when, by law, such inquests are required to be filed elsewhere, and such return shall include the evidence taken on such inquest, and the verdict of the jury, and the full names and residences of the several jurymen.

And in all cases where the inquest may be required by law to be filed elsewhere, such coroner shall make return to said Bureau of a copy of such inquest, including a copy of such evidence and verdict; and all such returns shall be made within forty-eight hours after the holding of any and every inquest.

Resolved, That section 161 of the Sanitary Code be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 161. That it shall be the duty of every person mentioned in the last section, or required to make or keep any such register, to present to the Sanitary Bureau a copy of such register, signed by such person, or a written statement, by him signed, of all the facts in said register required to be entered, with five days after the birth or marriage, and within thirty-six hours after the death of any person to whom such registry may or should relate, which shall thereupon be placed on file in the said Bureau.

Resolved, That section 162 of the Sanitary Code be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 162. That every clerk, officer and person within said city, required by the one hundred and fifty-second chapter of the Laws of 1847, or by the three hundred and eightieth chapter of the Laws of 1864, to make or preserve any entry, registry record, or certificate, as to births, deaths, or marriages, shall send, or cause to be sent, to the Sanitary Bureau of this Department, within five days after the knowledge of the birth, death or marriage, a full and true statement in writing, containing all the particulars in respect thereto (so far as reasonably ascertainable), which in any other section hereof, are required to be stated by any person relative to any birth, death, or marriage, which shall thereupon be placed on file in said Bureau.

AT 9.30 P. M. ON THURSDAY THE 15TH instant, the aqueduct had to be shut off to repair a large leak that could not be repaired in the usual manner from the exterior. This leak had suddenly developed in the section south of Yonkers, where smaller fissures had previously occurred.

The examination showed fissures aggregating 2,000 feet in length. The repairs were finished and water was again turned on by 4 P. M., on Saturday, the 17th instant. While the flow through the aqueduct was interrupted the supply in the Central Park reservoir was drawn down five feet.

This loss of supply in the city reservoirs, occurring now, as winter is approaching, makes it necessary to take extra precautions against waste of water. Being aware of the temptation to leave faucets open in cold weather to prevent freezing in the pipes, I specially protest against that practice, and appeal to all citizens to abstain from wasteful use of water in any manner whatever. The present condition of the supply and the possibility of a recurrence of similar leaks in the aqueduct make it my duty to give this public notice that I shall hereinafter resort to the peremptory measure of shutting off the water in all places where persistent waste is discovered.
