

The 829 deaths represent a death-rate of 22.79, against 29.83 for the previous week and 33.61 for the corresponding week of 1892.

Contagious and infectious diseases continue to decrease, the number of cases reported of diphtheria, measles, scarlet fever, typhoid fever and small-pox being respectively 93, 169, 39, 18 and 5, against 78, 185, 45, 22 and 2 for the previous week, a total of 324 against 332. Diphtheria increased chiefly in the Ninth, Seventeenth, Eighteenth, Nineteenth and Twenty-third Wards, the decrease being most marked in the Seventh and Twenty-first Wards. There was a noticeable increase of measles in the Seventh, Eleventh, Fifteenth and Nineteenth Wards, the decrease being mainly in the Twelfth, Eighteenth, Twenty-first, Twenty-second and Twenty-third Wards. The decrease of scarlet fever was chiefly in the Tenth and Seventeenth Wards, and there was a slight increase in the Eleventh and Thirteenth Wards. Nine of the 18 cases of typhoid fever were above Fortieth street, and 6 of the remaining 9 were below Fourteenth street. Four of the 5 cases of small-pox were in the Sixth Ward. Typhus fever is apparently extinct for the present, no case having been reported since July 13.
