**Permits** Commissioner Christopher O. Ward of the New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) issued a

Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) issued a reminder today that people who want to use City-owned lands in the watersheds of its upstate reservoirs must have Public Access Permits.

"Public Access Permits are a prerequisite for use of DEP's lands in the watershed, whether it be for hunting, hiking or fishing," said Commissioner Ward. "You must have a Public Access Permit to fish or hike at any City-owned property that has been opened for such uses. You must have a Public Access Permit before you apply for a Boat Permit. And you must have a Public Access Permit, as well as a New York State Hunting License, before you apply for a DEP Hunting Permit."

Public Access Permits may be obtained by submitting an application to the DEP through the U.S. mail. PAP applications are available at the following locations:
