Fifth—The rights and privileges hereby granted shall not be assigned either in whole or in part, or leased or sub-let in any manner, nor shall the title thereto, or right, interest or property therein, pass to or vest in any other person or corporation whatsoever, either by the act of the Company or by operation of law, whether under the provisions of the statutes relating to the consolidation or merger of corporations or otherwise, without the consent of the City, acting by the Board, evidenced by an instrument under seal, anything therein contained to the contrary thereof in any wise nothwithstanding, and the granting, giving or waiving of any one or more granting, giving or waiving of any one or more of such consents shall not render unnecessary
