Resolved, That upon the face of each certificate of stock representing such portion of the City indebtedness authorized to be cancelled by the foregoing resolution shall be written a certificate of its cancellation, to be signed by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, as evidence thereof under their authority, besides the usual defacing of the Seal and signatures, and when the said certificates of Stock are so cancelled, they shall be filed in the office of the Comptroller.

The Comptroller submitted the following communication, in relation to the issue of Consolidated Stock of the City of New York, for the purpose of enlarging the building now erected in Central Park and occupied by the Metropolitan Museum of Art :

CITY OF NEW YORK-FINANCE DEPARTMENT, COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE, October 6, 1884.

To the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund :

GENTLEMEN-Chapter 447 of the Laws of 1884 authorizes the issue of bonds or stock, in the manner now provided by law, to an amount not exceeding \$350,000, and bearing interest at a rate not exceeding three per centum per annum, for the purpose of enlarging the building now erected upon that portion of the Central Park east of the Old Reservoir, and now in possession and occupation of the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

Upon an application of the Department of Public Parks to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for authority to issue bonds for this purpose, the Comptroller was authorized and directed by said Board on June 27 last, to issue, from time to time, as may be required and at such rate of interest as he may determine, not exceeding three per centum per annum, "Consolidated Stock of the City of New York," for an amount not exceeding \$350,000, as provided by law.

I consider it advisable to make said stock exempt from city and county taxation, pursuant to the provisions of section 137 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, and an ordinance of the Common Council, approved October 2, 1880, and for that purpose submit a resolution to authorize the issue of said stock accordingly.
