

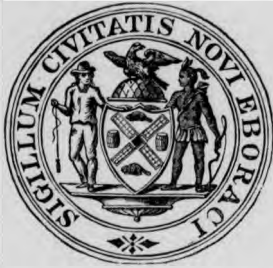

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COMMISSIONERS OF THE SINKING FUND.

Proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund at the Meeting held October 8th, 1884.

Present—Franklin Edson, Mayor; Frederick Smyth, Recorder; S. Hastings Grant, Comptroller; Henry B. Laidlaw, Chamberlain; and Hugh J. Grant, Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Board of Aldermen.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Comptroller submitted the following communication, in relation to the bonds and stocks of the City and County of New York, due November 1, 1884:

To the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

GENTLEMEN—Stocks and bonds of the City and County of New York, amounting to nine million nine hundred and fifty-one thousand six hundred and eighty-one dollars and eighty-nine cents (\$9,951,681.89), become due and payable November 1, 1884, and are redeemable from the Sinking Fund for the Redemption of the City Debt, pursuant to the provisions of section 176 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882. These stocks and bonds were originally payable from taxation and assessments, but are now payable from the Sinking Fund, as provided by law, and in accordance with the proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund and the Board of Estimate and Apportionment on December 28, 1883, in making the Final Estimate for 1884. The particulars of said stock and bonds are as follows, to wit:

Of the above-described stocks and bonds, a portion is held by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, amounting to \$1,486,681.89, the remaining portion, amounting to \$8,465,000, being held by public creditors. I recommend that those held by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, as provided by law, be cancelled. Resolutions to authorize the cancellation and payment of said stocks and bonds, accordingly, are herewith submitted.

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund do hereby authorize and direct the payment from the Sinking Fund for the Redemption of the City Debt, of stocks and bonds becoming due and payable on November 1, 1884, amounting to the sum of eight million four hundred and sixty-five thousand dollars (\$8,465,000), as follows:

Whereas, Section 170 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882 authorizes the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund to cancel any stocks and bonds held by them, as follows, to wit:

"It shall be lawful for the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund in their discretion, and they are hereby empowered in such discretion, to cancel any portion of the indebtedness of the said City held by them, which is by law redeemable from the Sinking Fund;" and

Whereas, City and County stocks and bonds amounting to \$1,486,681.89, becoming due and payable on November 1, 1884, are held by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund and are redeemable from that fund;

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund do hereby order and direct that a portion of the indebtedness of the City held by them, which is by law redeemable from the Sinking Fund and payable on November 1, 1884, shall be cancelled, amounting to the sum of \$1,486,681.89, as follows:

Resolved, That upon the face of each certificate of stock representing such portion of the City indebtedness authorized to be cancelled by the foregoing resolution shall be written a certificate of its cancellation, to be signed by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, as evidence thereof under their authority, besides the usual defacing of the Seal and signatures, and when the said certificates of Stock are so cancelled, they shall be filed in the office of the Comptroller.

The communication was accepted, and, on motion, the resolutions were adopted.

The Comptroller submitted the following communication, in relation to the issue of Consolidated Stock of the City of New York, for the purpose of enlarging the building now erected in Central Park and occupied by the Metropolitan Museum of Art:

To the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

GENTLEMEN—Chapter 447 of the Laws of 1884 authorizes the issue of bonds or stock, in the manner now provided by law, to an amount not exceeding \$350,000, and bearing interest at a rate not exceeding three per centum per annum, for the purpose of enlarging the building now erected upon that portion of the Central Park east of the Old Reservoir, and now in possession and occupation of the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

Upon an application of the Department of Public Parks to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for authority to issue bonds for this purpose, the Comptroller was authorized and directed by said Board on June 27 last, to issue, from time to time, as may be required and at such rate of interest as he may determine, not exceeding three per centum per annum, "Consolidated Stock of the City of New York," for an amount not exceeding \$350,000, as provided by law.

I consider it advisable to make said stock exempt from city and county taxation, pursuant to the provisions of section 137 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, and an ordinance of the Common Council, approved October 2, 1880, and for that purpose submit a resolution to authorize the issue of said stock accordingly.

Resolved, That "The Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for the Redemption of the City Debt" do hereby, by their concurrent resolution, direct that Consolidated Stock of the City of New York, authorized to be issued by chapter 447, Laws of 1884, and a resolution of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, adopted June 27, 1884, to an amount not exceeding \$350,000, and at a rate of interest not exceeding three per centum per annum, be issued, exempt from taxation by said City and by the County of New York, as provided by section 137 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, and an ordinance of the Common Council, approved October 2, 1880.

The communication was accepted, and, on motion, the resolution was adopted.

The Comptroller submitted the following report, in relation to sale at public auction of house and lots Nos. 135 and 137 Mulberry street, known as Colored School No. 1:

GENTLEMEN—Upon the application of the Board of Education, made pursuant to the provisions of section 2 of chapter 89, Laws of 1881, and sections 170 and 186 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, by a resolution adopted March 21, 1884, authorized the Comptroller to sell the house and lots known as Nos. 135 and 137 Mulberry street, being fifty feet front and rear by about one hundred feet deep, and known as Colored School No. 1.

After due advertisement and appraisal of the premises they were offered for sale at public auction, on April 24, 1884, for cash, and as reported by me to this Board on April 27, 1884, no bid was received and the property was withdrawn from sale.

I have consulted the President of the Board of Education, who advises that the property be put up for sale again, upon a new appraisalment, and I present a resolution to authorize such sale and appraisalment.

Francis Tomes is appointed appraiser, who shall report within ten days the valuation of said property for the action thereon of this Board.

The Comptroller submitted the following report of the Comptroller and Chamberlain, to whom was referred the communication from the Armory Board, recommending the purchase of a plot of ground situated on Sixty-seventh and Sixty-eighth streets, Ninth avenue and Boulevard, as a site for an armory for the Twenty-second Regiment, N. G. S. N. Y.:

Resolved, That a warrant, payable from the appropriation, "Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, Expenses of," 1884, for the sum of \$100, be drawn in favor of Hugh N. Camp, to pay for appraisalment of land, Ninth avenue and Sixty-first and Sixty-second streets, proposed for the site of an armory for the Twelfth Regiment, N. G. S. N. Y., the amount having been approved as correct by the Committee appointed to examine and report upon said site, September 18, 1884.

Hon. FRANKLIN EDSON, Mayor and Chairman Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

SIR—In his letter of the 17th ult., the Commissioner of Public Works requested the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund to authorize the lease of storage room for eleven public baths in Gowanus Basin, from George S. Townsend & Co., from October 1, 1884, to June 1, 1885, at the rate of \$1.50 per day for each bath, and the Commissioners have authorized said lease. This Department has since ascertained that there is a question whether George S. Townsend & Co. have any ownership in or control over the location or space in which they propose to store the baths; and to avoid possible dispute, litigation or other difficulty arising in the matter, I have to request that the Commissioners authorize the substitution of Beard & Kimpland, who also have an eligible and commodious storage place in the Gowanus Basin, as lessors in the lease in place of George S. Townsend & Co., the terms and conditions to remain the same in all respects.

Hon. FRANKLIN EDSON, Mayor and Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of the City of New York:

SIR—At a meeting of the Board governing this Department, held October 1st inst., the following resolutions were adopted, to wit:

"Resolved, That this Board deem it advisable to make an alteration in the width of the proposed new pier to be built at the foot of West Forty-first street, North river, from the lines therefor, as shown upon the plans adopted by the Department, April 13, 1871, by making the same sixty feet in width instead of eighty feet as laid down thereon, and to that end do hereby fix and establish, subject to the approval of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, as provided by law, the location and width of the pier proposed to be built at the foot of West Forty-first street, North river, as follows: the northerly line of the said pier to be built on the northerly line of West Forty-first street, as extended, and the southerly line of the said pier to be built on the southerly line of West Forty-first street, as extended, the width of the said pier to be sixty feet, and the length of said pier to remain as heretofore established.

"Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund be and hereby are respectfully requested in pursuance of the provisions of section 712 of chapter 410, Laws of 1882, to consent to and approve of the width and location of the said proposed new pier at the foot of West Forty-first street, North river, being altered and changed as above described and set forth."

Accompanying this is a tracing in triplicate exhibiting the new lines referred to above, for the signatures of the Commissioners, if the changes proposed be approved by your Honorable Board.
