About Affordable Housing

The New York City Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) promotes the quality and affordability of the city's housing and the strength of its many neighborhoods. HPD is responsible for carrying out Housing New York, Mayor Bill de Blasio's plan to build or preserve 300,000 affordable homes by 2026.

Housing is considered affordable if it costs about one-third or less of what the people living there earn, also known as Area Median Income (AMI).

Area Median Income (AMI)

The median income for all cities across the country is defined each year by U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The 2020 AMI for the New York City region is \$102,400 for a three-person family (100% AMI).

How do I use this chart?

1. Find your family size in the left column.

2. Follow that row across until you find how much your family earns per year.

3. At the top fo the column where you find your family income, see the % of AMI that is associated with (or closet to) your family income.
