

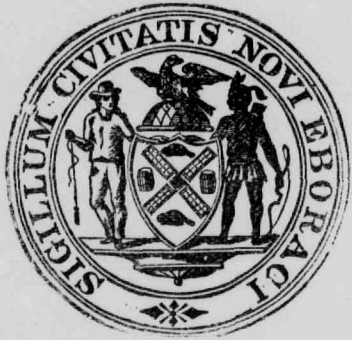

APPROVED PAPERS.

Ordinances, resolutions, etc., approved by the Mayor during the week ending November 26, 1881.

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to Mills & Gibbs to place and keep a storm-door in front of their premises, corner Grand and Crosby streets, the work done at their own expense, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works; such permission to continue only during the pleasure of the Common Council.

Adopted by the Board of Aldermen, November 15, 1881.
Approved by the Mayor, November 21, 1881.

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to Mitchell & Kinzler, proprietors of the Hotel Brunswick, to place and keep an ornamental lamp-post and lamps in Twenty-seventh street, south side, about 75 feet east of Fifth avenue, and a similar lamp-post and lamps on the north side of Twenty-sixth street, about 65 feet east of Fifth avenue, near the curb-stone, in each case, and similar to the posts and lamps now in front of said hotel, the work to be done and illuminating material furnished at their own expense, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works; such permission to continue only during the pleasure of the Common Council.

Resolved, That twenty painters be appointed for the immediate painting of the fences around the several parks in Fourth and Park avenues ; that the expense for labor and materials employed upon the parks south of Sixty-seventh street be paid from the fund appropriated for maintenance ; and that the expense for the parks north of Sixty-seventh street be paid from the funds provided by chapter 558 of the Laws of 1880 ; and that Commissioners Olliffe and Wales be constituted a committee to select the painters for such appointment and employment.

Resolved, That the Superintendent of Parks be directed to report upon the practicability of removing the chains inclosing the grass plots on the city parks.

Whereas, By section 1, chapter 360 of the Laws of 1880, the Department of Health is charged with the duty of furnishing this Department with a copy of a map "whereon shall be shown the location of such proposed drains and the lands required for the construction thereof ;" and

Whereas, The Counsel to the Corporation having informed this Department that the maps and descriptions furnished this Department by the Board of Health, and embodied in the Rule Maps and descriptions transmitted to him by resolution of this Board, adopted March 2, 1881, fail to contain a technical description of the land proposed to be burdened with this incumbrance, sufficient to enable him to proceed in the matter ; therefore

Resolved, That the Secretary be directed to return to the Board of Health the maps and descriptions heretofore furnished, with a respectful request that the exact location in metes and bounds of the proposed drains be added thereto and furnished this Department, to enable it to prepare the technical descriptions desired by the Counsel to the Corporation, and so soon as said maps and detailed information are furnished this Department, that the Secretary be directed to transmit the necessary Rule Maps and technical descriptions to the Counsel to the Corporation, with the request that he give the matter his early attention.

Resolved, That Richard G. Ternan and George Cafferata be and they are hereby appointed laborers on parks.

Resolved, That Patrick Crimmins, laborer on Manhattan square, Thomas Blake, laborer in Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards, Patrick McCraedy, laborer on Central Park, and Thomas Duggan, double team on Sedgwick avenue, be and they are hereby restored to duty.

Resolved, That the penalties for overtime on the work of the contract with John Beattie, for building piers and abutments of the Madison Avenue bridge, be remitted upon his releasing this Department from all claims for extra work.

Resolved, That two receiving-basins, with a manhole and the necessary appurtenances, be built at the intersection of Melrose avenue and One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street, and that the Acting Engineer of Construction be directed to prepare and submit to this Board for approval, plans and specifications for doing said work, and that a treasurer's order be issued for doing the same.

Resolved, That the Acting Superintendent of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards be directed to lay a temporary drain in One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street to connect the basins heretofore ordered to be built at Melrose avenue and One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street with the existing drain, crossing One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street about 250 feet west of Melrose avenue.

Resolved, That William Van Valkenburgh, Property Clerk, be required to give a bond in the sum of five thousand dollars with two sureties, who shall be approved of by the Comptroller and who shall justify in the sum of ten thousand dollars each.

Whereas, Section 7 of said act provides for the creation and issue of stock of the City of New

York for the payment of the damages awarded by said Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment, and of the expenses, charges, and disbursements in the premises ; therefore

Resolved, That pursuant to section 7 of chapter 604, Laws of 1874, the Commissioners of the Department of Public Parks hereby direct that the public fund or stock which the Comptroller of the City of New York by said provision of law is authorized and directed to create and cause to be issued in the name and on behalf of the City of New York, shall be issued at such time or times, in such manner and form, of such description and in such amounts, not exceeding the total sum of ninety-seven thousand eight hundred and eighty-four dollars and ninety-seven cents (\$97,884.97) as the said Comptroller may determine, for the payment of the awards for damages, expenses, charges and disbursements made and incurred by the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment appointed by the Supreme Court in a certain proceeding instituted by the Department of Public Parks by virtue of said act, to wit :

"In the matter of the application of the Department of Public Parks, for and in behalf of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of New York, relative to the opening of Sedgwick avenue, from Fordham Landing road to Boston avenue, in the Twenty-fourth Ward of the City of New York."

Resolved, That the Acting Engineer of Construction be directed to examine the plans for the completion of the improvement of the Riverside avenue, between Eighty-fifth and Eighty-eighth streets, as presented to this Board December 15, last, and report without delay upon said plans, and what, if any modifications can be made therein, to reduce the cost of completing said improvement.

Resolved, That the Superintending Gardener be directed to report to this Board without delay what additional trees can be advantageously planted upon the City Parks.

Resolved, That the Comptroller be requested to return to James Everard the money deposited by him with his proposal for constructing sewers in One Hundred and Forty-fifth, One Hundred and Forty-fourth, and One Hundred and Forty-third streets, opened October 13, 1881.

Resolved, That the Board of Estimate and Apportionment be requested to transfer the sum of \$1,000 from the appropriation for the Improvement of Manhattan Square, for 1881, which is in excess of the amount required for the purposes and objects thereof, to the appropriation for Bronx River Bridges, which is insufficient.

Resolved, That Robert McKenna be appointed a laborer on the Central Park, and detailed for duty at the Arsenal.

Resolved, That John Downey be and he is hereby appointed a laborer for duty at the Menagerie, at \$1.50 per day.

Resolved, That the Director of the Menagerie be directed to ascertain and report in relation to the purchase of a young elephant for the Park collection, with the price of the same.

Resolved, That the proposals of James Everard, amounting to \$22,295, for constructing two roadways in Central Park, nearly opposite Seventy-seventh and Eighty-first streets and Eighth avenue ; the proposals of Bernard C. Murray, amounting to \$9,020, for regulating, etc., One Hundred and Fifty-third street, and for constructing a sewer in One Hundred and Fifty-fifth street, amounting to \$2,274.10, be and the same are hereby accepted as the lowest and most advantageous bids for doing said works ; that the proposals be sent to the Comptroller for his approval of the sureties thereon, and when so approved, that contracts be entered into with the said James Everard and the said Bernard C. Murray for doing said works, and that the Chairman is hereby authorized to sign said contracts for and on behalf of this Department.

Resolved, That Calvert Vaux be and he is hereby appointed Superintending Architect, at a salary of \$2,500 per annum, and that Julius Munckwitz be appointed Architect, at a salary of \$1,500 per annum.

Resolved, That Patrick Feeley be and he is hereby appointed a laborer on the Central Park.

Resolved, That the proposal of John Beattie, amounting to \$13,749.70, for building an iron swing bridge over the Bronx river, between New York City and Westchester County, be accepted as the lowest and most advantageous bid ; that the proposal be sent to the Comptroller for his approval of the sureties thereon, and when so approved, that a contract be entered into with the said John Beattie for doing said work, and that the Chairman is hereby authorized to sign said contract for and on behalf of this Department.

Cash amounting to \$300.63 was deposited with the Comptroller.

Bills amounting to \$39,213.66 were audited and sent to the Finance Department for payment.

A contract for constructing a sewer in One Hundred and Forty-first street, between Alexander and Willis avenues, with branches, etc., was executed with T. C. Saportas, Contractor, and Shepherd F. Knapp and Wm. Foster, Jr., sureties.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH AN ORDINANCE OF the Common Council. "In relation to the burial of strangers or unknown persons who may die in any of the public institutions of the City of New York," the Commissioners of Public Charities and Correction report as follows:

Section 1. If any taxes of any year shall remain unpaid
on the first day of November, after the assessment-rolls
and the warrants to collect such taxes have been delivered
to the Receiver of Taxes in the City of New York, it shall
be the duty of said Receiver to give public notice, by ad-
vertisement for at least ten days in two of the daily news-
papers, and in the CITY RECORD, printed and published in
said city, respectively, that unless the same shall be paid
to him at his office on or before the first day of December,
in any such year, he will immediately thereafter proceed
to collect such unpaid taxes, as provided in the following
section of this act:

Section 2. If any such tax shall remain unpaid on the
said first day of December, it shall be the duty of the said
Receiver of Taxes in said city to charge, receive, and collect
upon such tax so remaining unpaid on that day, in addi-
tion to the amount of such tax, one per centum on the
amount thereof; and to charge, receive, and collect upon
such tax so remaining unpaid on the first day of January
thereafter, interest upon the amount thereof at the rate of
seven per centum per annum, to be calculated from the
day on which said assessment-rolls and warrants shall
have been delivered to the said Receiver of Taxes to the
date of payment.

The same rate of interest shall be so charged and col-
lected upon any tax levied in the year eighteen hundred
and eighty, remaining unpaid at the date of the passage of
this act.

Section 3. All existing provisions of law which impose a
charge and require the collection of interest at the rate of
twelve per centum per annum upon arrears of taxes on
real and personal estate within the City of New York,
upon arrears of assessments for local improvements and
street openings in said city, and upon arrears of Croton
water rents in said city, are hereby repealed; and in lieu
of such charge of interest at the rate of twelve per centum
per annum, there shall be charged and collected by the
officer authorized to collect and receive any such arrears
of taxes and assessments and Croton water rents, interest
upon the amount thereof at the rate of seven per centum
per annum, to be calculated for the same period as inter-
est at the rate of twelve per centum per annum is now re-
quired by law to be calculated thereon. This provision
shall apply to taxes, assessments, or Croton water rents
remaining unpaid and due, for the non-payment of which
the lands and tenements liable therefor shall be hereafter
sold at public auction as now provided by law; provided,
however, that nothing in this act shall be construed to
affect the rights of purchasers at sales for taxes, assess-
ments, or Croton water rents, heretofore made, or to
authorize the redemption of lands and tenements from
sales heretofore made for any lesser sums than the sums
collectible for such redemption under the provisions of
existing laws.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Comptroller of the
City of New York to give public notice by advertisement

for at least ten days, in the CITY RECORD, printed and
published in said city, immediately after the confirmation
of any assessment for a local improvement or street open-
ing in said city, that the same has been confirmed
specifying the title of such assessment and the date of its
confirmation by the Board of Revision and Correction of
Assessments in proceedings for local improvements, and
by the Supreme Court in proceedings for street openings,
and also the date of entry in the record of titles of assess-
ments kept in the Bureau for the Collection of Assessments,
and of Arrears of Taxes and Assessments, and of Croton
water rents, notifying all persons, owners of property
affected by any such assessment, that, unless the amount
assessed for benefit on any person or property shall be
paid within sixty days after the date of said entry of any
such assessment, interest shall thereafter be collected
thereon as provided in the following section of this act,
and all provisions of law or ordinance requiring any other
or different notice of assessments and interest thereon are
hereby repealed.

Section 5. If any such assessment shall remain unpaid
for the period of sixty days after the date of entry thereof
in the said record of titles of assessments, it shall be the
duty of the officer authorized to collect and receive the
amount of such assessment, to charge, collect, and receive
legal interest thereon, at the rate of seven per centum per
annum, to be calculated from the date of such entry to
the date of payment.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

ORDER OF THE COMPTROLLER OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK, CONSOLIDATING CERTAIN BUREAUX IN THE FINANCE DEPART- MENT.

SECTION 3 OF CHAPTER 521 OF THE LAWS
of 1880, requires that heads of departments shall
reduce the aggregate expenses of their respective
departments by a reduction of salaries, and confer upon
them authority to consolidate bureaux and offices for that
purpose, as follows, to wit:

"In making the reduction herein required, every head
of department may abolish and consolidate offices and
bureaux, and discharge subordinates in the same
department."

The Comptroller of the City of New York, in pursuance
of the duty imposed and the authority thus conferred upon
him, hereby orders and directs that the following Bureaux
in the Finance Department shall be consolidated, the
consolidation thereof to take effect on the first day of
January, 1881, viz:

First—"The Bureau or the Collection of Assessments,
and "The Bureau for the Collection of Arrears of Taxes
and Assessments and of Water Rents," shall be consoli-
dated as one bureau, and on and after January 1, 1881,
shall be known as "The Bureau for the Collection of
Assessments and of Arrears of Taxes and Assessments and
of Water Rents," and possess all the powers conferred and
perform all the duties imposed by law and ordinance upon
both said bureaux, and the officers thereof, the chief
officer of which consolidated bureau shall be called "Col-
lector of Assessments and Clerk of Arrears."

Second—"The Bureau for the Collection of the Revenue
accruing from rents, and interest on bonds and mortgages,
revenue arising from the use or sale of property belong-
ing to or managed by the city," and "The Bureau of
Markets," shall be consolidated as one Bureau, and on
and after January 1, 1881, shall be known as "The
Bureau for the Collection of City Revenue and of
Markets," and possess all the powers conferred and per-
form all the duties imposed by law and ordinance upon
both said bureaux, and the officers thereof; the chief
officer of which said consolidated Bureau shall be called
"Collector of City Revenue and Superintendent of
Markets."
