The committee recommend that this work be done, and that an appropriation of \$22,500 be made for the work in the Eighth and Fourteenth Regiment Armories, and report the following resolution:

Resolved, That an appropriation of twenty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$22,500) be and is hereby made for renovating the Armorer's Quarters in the Eighth Regiment Armory, and for a new floor and foundation for the same in the Fourteenth Regiment Armory, in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by Messrs. 

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.
