In an effort to prepare New York City's immigrant communities, NYC Emergency Management (NYCEM) has created a toolkit specifically for ESOL classrooms. The toolkit contains a 25-minute episode, called **The Storm**, focused on emergency preparedness and access to City resources during emergencies. This episode is a part of the larger We Speak NYC series geared toward English-language learners.

"The Storm" Toolkits can be used by ESOL instructors, interested in helping New Yorkers improve their English while learning how to plan, prepare, and get informed during emergencies.


