#### 2023 U.S. Small Business Administration Disaster Declaration - 9/29 Flash Flood Event

Eligible New York City residents and businesses in Manhattan, Brooklyn, Queens, and Staten Island affected by the significant flash flooding event on September 29, 2023, may now apply for low-interest disaster loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration. These loans are made available for those whose homes and/or businesses were damaged due to flooding. The filing deadline to submit applications is February 2, 2024 for physical damage, and September 4, 2024 for economic injury.

Weather Alerts	A <b>Flood Watch</b> is in effect citywide from 6 PM tomorrow to 12 PM Wednesday. About 2 to 3 inches of rain is expected citywide with locally higher amounts possible. Areas to the north and west of NYC may see higher amounts and significant flooding, particularly along rivers. A <b>High Wind Watch</b> is in effect for Brooklyn, Queens, and Staten Island from 6 PM tomorrow to 6 AM Wednesday. The period of strongest winds will be from about 9 PM to 4 AM. Speeds along the coast may approach 40 mph with gusts up to <b>60 mph</b> .
