## BUREAU OF HIGHWAYS.

The total mileage of pavements in the Borough on September 30, 1913, was 795, plus. It is divided among the various kinds of pavements as follows:

Asphalt, 492,498; asphalt block, 30,977; granite block, 136,146; Medina block, 7,286; Belgian block, 15,390; trap rock, 0,364; cobbles, 4,989; brick, 1,494; wood, 7,541; iron slag, 4,099; macadam, 95,058; total, 795,835.

Laid During Quarter—Asphalt, 21,319 miles; asphalt block, 0,648 miles; granite, 5,334 miles; iron slag, 0,976 miles; wood block, 0,196 miles; total, 28,473 miles.

Removed During Quarter—Asphalt, 4,954 miles; asphalt block, 0,473 miles; granite, 3,189 miles; Belgian, 0,608 miles; cobbles, 0,205 miles; macadam, 6,507 miles; total, 15,936 miles.

Of the total number of contracts charged to Repaving Fund, nine were for asphalt pavements.

Of the total number charged to Street Improvements, 42 were for asphalt and three for granite. Fifty-three were for regulating, grading, curbing and walks.

The contract charged against 3034 was for Portland cement. Contracts charged against 3035 was for binder stone, refined asphalt and limestone.

Assessment lists to the number of 129, in duplicate, were prepared by the office division and forwarded for apportionment, involving a total amount of \$648,888. Of the number prepared, 126 were for regulating, grading, curbing, laying walks and paving, at a cost of \$640,531.31.

In addition, 45 were partially completed and will be included in the annual report for the year. Plans for new work were made to the number of 44, of which 29 were for paving.

There were also 236 assessment lists in various stages of completion. Final Estimates Made, also Surveys—Final estimates, 165; repaving contracts (L. & G. furnished), 46; grading and paving, 63; track grades, 8; grading lots, 5; law survey, 32; miscellaneous surveys, 22.

House Numbers—Assigned, 700; inspections, 45; notices served, 25; complaints re duplications settled, 7.

Of reports for original improvements, 102 were made representing a cost of \$616,402. For 12 of these reports there was no cost given.

#### Division of Maintenance and Repairs.

Connection Gang—The work done by this gang, in restoring cuts made by corporations, plumbers, etc., consisted of repairing 3,351 square yards of granite on concrete, 4,599 square yards of granite on sand, 538 yards of Belgian block, 469 yards of wood block, and various other kinds of pavements.

10,361 square yards of six-inch concrete foundation used for above.

Street Repair Gangs—The work done by these gangs consisted in repairs to defective pavements: 11,725 square yards of granite on concrete; 61,426 square yards of sand granite; 12,889 square yards of Belgian block; 1,202 yards of cobble and other kinds of pavement.

Sidewalk Gangs—Bluestone walk laid, 259,678 square feet; cement walk laid, 13,795 square feet; brick walk laid, 3,381 square feet; bluestone curb, 1,386 linear feet; cement curb, 868 linear feet; bridging, 3,767 square feet.

Emergency Gangs—2,090 dangerous holes made safe.

Country Gangs—These gangs perform work of shaping up and repairing dirt and unimproved roadways: Macadam repairs, 45,568 square yards; macadam cleaned, 109,295 square yards; miscellaneous paved gutters cleaned, 2,286 square yards; paved gutters cleaned, 8,386 square yards; dirt roads repaired (hand), 206,000 square yards; dirt roads repaired (machine), 477,848 square yards; ash sidewalks repaired, 2,338 square yards; dirt sidewalks repaired, 3,020 square yards; drain pipe laid, 279 linear feet; wooden drain laid, 157 linear feet; cesspools built, 18; cesspools cleaned, 44; streets sprinkled, oil, 1,180,920 square yards; streets sprinkled, water, 2,911 miles; stone crushed, 1,366 cubic yards.

Miscellaneous Work Other Than Street Repairs—Bridge repairs, drainage, miscellaneous trucking, repairs to tools and equipment, filling washouts, cleaning miscellaneous streets, sanding streets, removing incumbrances. Loads of material hauled: To work, 14,049; to dump, 5,996.

For redemptions of incumbrances \$110.39 was received and credited to the "General Fund."

For vault privileges \$1,513.94 was received and credited to the "Sinking Fund."

For repaving streets within railroad areas the sum of \$4,349.76 was received and credited to "C. P. B.—No. 32."

The sum of \$45.74 was received and credited to "S. A.—5, Street Improvement Fund."

Miscellaneous supplies ordered amounting to \$10,918.22 and chargeable to appropriations.

The total number of permits to the various corporations to make openings in streets amounted to 3,909.

Of this number 1,316 were granted to the Brooklyn Union Gas Company to lay mains and make repairs to gas service. Eight hundred and fifty-six were issued to the Edison Electric Company to lay conduits, etc.; also 374 were issued to the New York Telephone Company and 324 to the Department of Water Supply.

The Bureau removed a considerable quantity of material from the streets of the Borough, among which are the following: Loads of earth, 91; furniture (dispossess), 4 wagon loads; wagons, 3; posts, 2; water trough, 1.

Miscellaneous Permits—Building material, 288; crossing walks, 290; new vaults, 23; repairs to vaults, 50; cement walks, 274; driveways, 116; specials, 1,687.

## DIVISION OF SUBSTRUCTURES.

The duties of this Division are:

Accumulating all information obtainable by surveys and investigations as to size, location and character of the structures under the streets and avenues of the Borough and making records of same on maps.

Complaints to the number of 2,113 were received from all sources and 1,711 were satisfied. Of the total number received 857 were from the Police Department. Due to the seriousness of their character, prompt attention was afforded same and they were all satisfied.

During the quarter 6,141 applications were made by plumbers and the various public service corporations to open streets.

The work completed under contract is shown in detail on the table (blue print) attached to the report of the Chief Engineer of Highways, which I am submitting, the streets being arranged in alphabetical order.

## DIVISION OF INCUMBRANCES.

Complaints numbering 766 were received: Department of Street Cleaning, 13; Bureau of Complaints, 42; mail, 202; office, 183; Inspectors, 276; Department of Police, 50.

There were 399 incumbrances removed. Of this number 243 were trees, etc., in dangerous condition. There were 91 loads of earth removed and 49 boulders. Four incumbrances were seized and three redeemed.

Approximately 4,000 permits were issued to the various corporations not requiring street openings, for stringing wires, placing lights in signs and drawing cables mostly to the New York Telephone Company, Edison Electric Company and the Flatbush Gas Company. These are recorded in the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, but are referred to the Highway Bureau for approval.

The Bureau of Highways received on special security deposits, \$5,600, with refunds totalling \$5,000 with deposits over refunds of \$600. On October 1, 1913, there was a credit balance of \$38,950.



For permits to open pavements for water, gas, sewer, electric light, telephone, etc., the sum of \$54,533.75 was received and credited to "Special Fund S. A.—99."

Assigning definite locations for new substructures, thereby reducing pavement mutilation to a minimum.

Through the recommendation of the Engineer in charge of this Division, the administration has been instrumental in reducing pavement mutilation, also in presenting encroachments upon the subsurface spaces previously selected for the installation of large distribution mains being built under the jurisdiction of the Board of Water Supply.

The Division is working to conserve, as far as possible, for future utilization, subsurface spaces which are becoming one of the City's most valuable assets and from which substantial revenues will be derived from future franchises granted. It is the purpose to exact a moderate fee for information furnished to private individuals and corporations. This is in order to place the Division on a revenue-earning basis, similar to departments of like character in other cities.

Surveys and investigations have been completed in the manufacturing sections of Greenpoint and Williamsburg over an area bounded by Driggs ave., Manhattan ave., Noble st., the East River and Metropolitan ave., and surveys and investigations are now in a fair state of completion over an area bounded by Driggs ave., North 12th st., the East River and Metropolitan ave. In connection with this work we are combining the work of selecting a definite location for the extension of the high pressure fire service in this section of the Borough.

Work of correcting completed record maps in the older sections of the Borough to conform with recent installations and the record maps covering the westerly section of the so-called Atlantic Avenue Improvement, in Atlantic ave., from Flatbush to Vanderbilt ave., are progressing rapidly.

A definite location has been assigned for a 72-way conduit in Ocean ave., crossing the tracks of the Manhattan Beach branch of the Long Island Railroad. Miscellaneous information has been furnished the Public Service Commission relative to new routes in this Borough. Additional information has been furnished the New York Municipal Railway Company relative to proposed changes in the Sea Beach Line.

Information has been furnished along the route of the Classon Ave. Relief Sewer and a definite location has been assigned in the Flatbush Ave. Extension for the electric power conduit for the new trolley line in that location.

In addition to this, a mass of miscellaneous information has been furnished to the various public service corporations, city departments and others.

Permit applications numbering 3,909 have been referred to the Division of Substructures during the quarter, presented by public service corporations to install new lines, etc. This work includes various reports, based upon requests for revocable privileges and other matters referred to this bureau.

#### BUREAU OF SEWERS.

I submit to you detailed report of the operations of our Sewer Bureau in the maintenance and repairs of existing sewers and construction of new sewers.

From the same it will be observed that, during the third quarter of 1913, 66,321.04 linear feet of all sizes of sewers were laid, or an equivalent of 12,561 miles.

On June 30, 1913, there were 942,948 miles of sewers, which with that laid during the second quarter, brings the total mileage of sewers in this Borough on September 30, 1913, up to 955,509 miles.

The total mileage of sewers built during the quarter, divided among the various sizes, is as follows:

There were 56,738.16 linear feet (10,746 miles) of 6-inch house connection drains built during the quarter.

The number of basins built during the quarter was 135. These, added to the basins previously connected with the sewerage system, 11,984, makes the total 12,119 on September 30, 1913.

At the commencement of the third quarter, there remained on hand 49 resolutions for sewer improvements, amounting in estimated cost to \$1,168,100, for which the Board of Estimate and Apportionment had, prior to that date, authorized the preparation of plans and had further directed the resubmission of the matters when the preliminary work was done.

Plans and specifications for 25 improvements, amounting to \$73,200, were authorized to be prepared under preliminary authorization of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

On July 1, 1913, there remained on hand two petitions for the construction of sewers by private contract under the provisions of section 395 of the Charter.

There were made during the quarter 51 reports upon sewers to precede paving, and in response to petitions for sewers 24 of these were for sewers to precede paving, estimated cost being \$9,000.

Twenty-seven were for sewers petitioned for, the estimated cost being \$93,200.

Attached to the report of the Chief Engineer is a list of some contracts for which assessment lists have been prepared and forwarded to the Board of Assessors. Also a list of 90 improvements which have been completed and accepted but which have not been forwarded to the Board of Assessors.

Statement is also appended showing contracts entered into, contracts completed and contracts in progress during the quarter, with a summary showing the magnitude of the work carried on by the Bureau.

Supplies chargeable to appropriation amounted to \$12,155.48.

#### TOPOGRAPHICAL BUREAU.

The Work of this Bureau consists of the preparation of surveys for the field force for profiles in connection with improvements and work performed by the office division, and the preparation of necessary maps, reports, etc.

The activities of this Bureau are broad and general in scope, the Bureau performing work and compiling data for the use of other departments of the City Government, as well as the Bureaus under the jurisdiction of the Borough President. Summing up the duties of the Topographical Bureau they may be defined as follows:

First—To make topographical surveys and computations, and to prepare maps, plans and profiles, sketches, etc., for altering the map or plan of the City of New York, and for acquiring title to streets, avenues, public parks, places, etc.

Second—To mark on the ground, by means of monument-stones, etc., the lines of streets, and to protect monuments in the streets when improvements are being made.

Third—To prepare maps and technical descriptions for the Local Boards, Board of Estimate and Apportionment, Corporation Counsel and Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment, in the matters of altering the map or plan of the City of New York and of acquiring title to streets, avenues, etc.

Fourth—To prepare certificates of dedication for streets in which the city has an easement for the use of the public, and also statements of facts for submission to the Corporation Counsel in order that he may determine whether improvements may be made without instituting condemnation proceedings in the streets for which the statements of facts are submitted.

Fifth—To furnish, when requested, reports on the legal status of streets, not only for the Bureaus of the Borough Government, but for the City Departments as well, i. e., Street Cleaning Department, Department of Taxes and Assessments, Department of Bridges, Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, and for the public generally.

Sixth—To connect the transverse lines, monumented street lines and monumented lines holding the triangulation stations to the several secondary stations, or towers, in this borough.

Seventh—To make surveys and prepare plans and profiles for all original improvements that are undertaken by the Bureau of Highways; to determine for all contracts let by the Highway Bureau the amount of excavation, fill, number of linear feet of curbing, number of square feet of sidewalk, number of cubic yards of concrete, number of square yards of asphalt, and to furnish the contractors with line stakes and grade stakes and monthly estimates of cost of preparing maps in street opening proceedings for the use of the Corporation Counsel.

A great deal of the routine work of the office which took considerable time, such as the care and preservation of the monument stones, the keeping of the detailed records of the office, the accumulation of records which had been missing, the numerous investigations necessary to make reports on the legal status of streets, the many replies both oral and written to inquiries as to the legal status of the streets, etc., are not, and cannot well be, included in the report submitted by the Chief Engineer of this Bureau.

The field work, which was required for and which is included in the maps and reports under the head of "Office Work" consists of chaining, line work, angular measurements, leveling and damage survey work, and the amount of this work which has been done during the quarter is as follows:

13,400 feet precise chaining; 648,900 feet approximate chaining; 8,500 feet precise line work; 30 precise angles measured; 40,491 feet profile for regulating, grading, etc. (original improvements), for streets; 9,602 feet damage surveys for three streets; 101,855 feet line and grade stakes set (original improvements) for 92 streets.

#### Monument Lines Fixing Streets.

Monument points set, 11; monuments referenced, 35; monuments reset, 35; monument covers set, 2; monuments dug for that were not previously reported found, 2; monuments found that were not previously reported, 0; total, 91.

The force completed and transmitted to this department a number of maps affecting the changes of the established elevation of streets, reduction in the width of streets, widening, location and laying out, closing and discontinuing, etc., all requiring action by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment. Also several maps for filing with the Board of Estimate and Register in street changes, which had been previously adopted by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

#### Miscellaneous Maps.

These comprise maps, or general sketches, for special reports and copies of maps previously prepared and forwarded.

There were about seven of the above, the more important being map showing soundings for the proposed construction of a board walk at Coney Island, from Ocean parkway to W. 37th st.

#### Maps Showing Encroachments.

Of these there were eight and were prepared for the Bureau of Encumbrances in the following streets:

Elmore place, Avenue M to O; 13th ave., 55th to 57th sts.; E. 45th st., Avenue L to M; E. 46th st., Avenue L to M; Avenue V, W. 6th st. to Van Sicklen st.; E. 10th st., Avenues K to L; W. 24th st., between Mermaid and Surf aves.; Avenue M, E. 16th st. to E. 17th st.

#### Streets and Street Openings.

This work, in addition to furnishing a mass of oral information, consists of preparing statements of facts for submission to the Corporation Counsel for determination as to whether same may be considered sufficient to authorize the City to commence public improvements without the need of condemnation proceedings.

It requires an accurate search of all records in our Topographical Bureau and other public offices, besides an exhaustive examination on the ground of the physical condition of each street.

Four statements of facts were prepared and forwarded to the Corporation Counsel. The maps which were prepared for the Corporation Counsel's office in condemnation proceedings consisted of the preparation of the following character of maps, the number prepared and the total number of feet represented:

- Rule map in quintuplicate showing land taken, 20 maps, 2,897 feet.
- Profile maps showing physical elevation of property on side lines and centre of street and manner in which lands and buildings not taken, but affected, will be injured or benefited by the intended regulation of the street.
- Draft damage maps are used by the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment to determine the amount of award for lands and buildings taken in the opening of the street; 163 plots, 281,339 city lots, of a total of four (4) streets, comprising 12 maps, 2,897 feet in area.
- Draft benefit maps, showing the limits of assessment for opening a street, and give block numbers and block dimensions, 1,263 city plots covered by these maps, or 7 streets.
- Final damage and benefit maps (in duplicate) (in triplicate).

These are the last maps made for street opening proceedings and are copies of the draft damage and benefit maps with the additions of any changes and modifications that may have been decided upon by the report of the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment, which is placed on file at the confirmation of each street opening proceeding. Total, 116 sheets, 8 streets; total, 2 maps.

From January 1, 1898, at the time of consolidation, to September 30, 1913, a total of 360 street opening proceedings were confirmed.

In the course of the three months 460 reports and letters were sent.

Supplies were ordered for blue print paper, tracing cloths, typewriting supplies, etc., chargeable to corporate stock.

#### BUREAU OF BUILDINGS.

The Superintendent reports on the work of his bureau during the third quarter on the number of applications filed for new buildings, their cost, and plans for alterations and repairs, etc.:

Number of Violations—Plastering, 9; defective plumbing and drainage, 230; defective construction and materials, 431; elevators, 15; erecting and altering without permit, 205; unsafe buildings, 50.

Notices Issued During Quarter—To remove violations of law, 875; to remove unsafe buildings, 50; to repair passenger elevators, 15.



Complaints regarding buildings, numbering 34, were received and, upon investigation, remedied, except in a number of cases where complaints were unfounded. These numbered 20.

Passenger elevators to the number of 1,059 were inspected, and of this number 15 were found not in compliance with the law.

Total number of iron and steel inspections made were 1,175.

Total number of construction inspections, 36,984; applications for ordinary repairs made on construction slip blanks, 906.

Disposition of Cases Not in Compliance with Law—No grating under overhead machinery: Pending, 88; received since, 15; total, 103. Law complied with, 34; pending, 69.

The total number of plans for new buildings filed was 500, affecting 758 buildings, the estimated cost of which was \$6,947,960. Of this number 36 applications were for 109 one-family brick buildings, estimated cost each less than \$20,000; total, \$480,875. Forty-eight applications for 158 two-family brick buildings, each costing less than \$20,000; total cost, \$603,650. Fifty-three for 65 tenements, each costing over \$20,000; total cost, \$2,430,000. Fourteen were for 16 tenements, each costing less than \$20,000; total estimated cost, \$184,500. Of brick stores, each costing less than \$15,000, 7 applications were filed for 7 buildings at a total cost of \$22,800. Stores and two-family brick houses, 31 buildings, at a total cost of \$171,200. Office buildings, brick, there were 7, at a total cost of \$126,300. Factories and workshops, brick, 20 buildings; total cost, \$535,600.

Nine brick churches, total cost \$226,000; three brick school houses, total cost \$535,000.

There were 15 applications received for 15 public buildings, places of amusements, hotels, etc., at a total cost of \$445,500.

There were 83 applications for 114 one-family dwellings, frame, at a total cost of \$355,250.

There were 22 applications for 30 two-family frame dwellings, total cost of \$113,800. Other frame structures to the number of 75, to cost \$42,710, were applied for and acted upon.

## BUREAU OF SEWERS.

City of New York, Borough of Brooklyn, Office of Chief Engineer, Mechanics' Bank Building, Brooklyn, November 25, 1913.

Hon. WM. J. TAYLOR, Superintendent of Sewers:

Dear Sir—I transmit herewith report of the operations of the engineering division of this Bureau for the third quarter of the year, ending September 30, 1913.

As you will note from the tabulated statement next attached, 66,321.04 linear feet of sewers of all sizes were laid during the quarter, or an equivalent of 12.561 miles, which, added to the mileage of the sewerage system on June 30, 1913, 942,948 miles, makes the mileage on September 30, 1913, 955,509 miles. The total amount of sewers built during the quarter, divided among the various sizes, is as follows:

There were 56,738.16 linear feet (10.746 miles) of 6-inch house connection drain, and 5,436.50 linear feet (1.030 miles) of 8-inch house connection drain built during the quarter, making a total of 146,300 miles of 6-inch and 2.421 miles of 8-inch house connection drain built under the jurisdiction of the Bureau since this system was inaugurated, making a grand total of 148,721 miles of house connection drains on September 30, 1913.

The number of sewer basins built during the quarter has been 135, which, added to the basins previously connected with the sewerage system, 11,984, makes the total, 12,119 on September 30, 1913.

On July 1, 1913, there remained on hand 49 resolutions for sewer improvements, amounting in estimated cost to \$1,168,100, for which the Board of Estimate and Apportionment had, prior to that date, authorized the preparation of contract plans and specifications and had further directed the resubmission of the matters when the preliminary work was done. Contract plans and specifications for 32 of these improvement matters, amounting in estimated cost to \$163,000, and for one section, amounting to \$330,000 in estimated cost of one of the other improvements, were completed and submitted during the quarter. Plans for four improvements, amounting in estimated cost to \$32,300 are held because of grading or other changes. Resolutions for two improvement matters will be rescinded, the estimated cost of them being \$9,400. Plans for the other 11 improvement matters, estimated cost, \$633,400 are either under way or are held temporarily in abeyance because of other sewer improvement work which must be completed before these others are begun.

The contract plans for several more sections of the relief sewers authorized on January 9, 1913, are nearing completion and will shortly be submitted.

During the quarter the Board of Estimate authorized the preparation of plans and specifications for 25 sewer improvements, amounting in estimated cost to \$73,200. Plans were prepared and submitted for 10 of these improvements, estimated cost \$23,500. Plans are in preparation for the remaining 15 improvements, estimated cost \$49,700.

On July 1, 1913, there remained on hand 5 resolutions of the Local Boards authorizing the construction of sewer basins. Plans were submitted for 4 of these, estimated cost \$960. The remaining resolution has been held owing to the uncertainty of the lines of W. 12th st.

During the quarter there were received 4 resolutions of Local Boards authorizing the construction of sewer basins. Plans were prepared and submitted for all four, estimated cost \$1,200.

On July 1, 1913, there remained on hand two petitions for the construction of sewer improvements by private contract. Plans were prepared for these two improvements during the quarter and were submitted.

During this quarter the Board of Estimate authorized the construction of 41 sewer improvements, amounting in estimated cost to \$499,700 for which contract plans and specifications had previously been prepared under preliminary authorizations.

There were prepared during the quarter plans for the repair of sewer in Navy st. from Nassau st. to Tillary st., and in Tillary st. from Raymond st. to Hudson ave.; sewer in Osborn st., between Hegeman ave. and Lott ave.; sewer in Benson ave., between 14th ave. and Bay 7th st.

There was also prepared contract plan and specifications for dredging of Gowanus Canal; dredging of Newtown Creek at Vandervoort ave. basin, at Stagg st. basin and at Metropolitan ave. and Scott ave.

Five local changes of drainage and sewerage plans are in preparation and will shortly be submitted.

There were made during the quarter 51 reports upon sewer improvements to precede paving, and in response to petitions for sewers. Twenty-four of these were to precede paving, the estimated cost of the sewer improvements required before paving being \$9,000; 27 were for sewers and basins petitioned for, the estimated cost of the sewer improvements being \$93,200. The total mileage of sewers called for by the reports is 6.082 miles.

I append hereto a list of 50 contracts for sewer improvements amounting to \$183,329.36 for which assessment lists have been prepared and forwarded to the Board of Assessors during the quarter, and also a list of 90 contracts for sewer improvements amounting to \$739,587.86, which have been completed and accepted up to and including September 30, 1913, but which have not been sent to the Board of Assessors at the close of the quarter.

Statements are attached hereto showing contracts entered into during the quarter, contracts completed during the quarter, and contracts in progress during the quarter which were uncompleted on September 30, 1913, with a summary showing the magnitude of the work carried on under the jurisdiction of the Bureau.

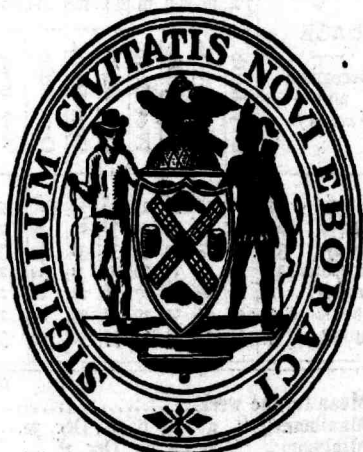

the street, and the opening of the main sewer in street shall be properly closed in compliance with the directions of the Bureau of Sewers in the Borough in which the buildings are situated, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Bureau of Sewers that the work has been properly performed.

The permit for all opening in the street to be obtained by and at the expense of the purchaser of the building.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days from the day of possession will work forfeiture of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances, or portion as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed, and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the day of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials of labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs, and each of them, for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furnishings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam-ends, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flashed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the Contractor.

The Comptroller of The City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids; and it is further

Resolved, That, while the said sale is held under the supervision of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, the Comptroller is authorized to cause the sale to be advertised and to direct the sale thereof as financial officer of the City.

#### NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

#### GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department, and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a Department, chief of a Bureau, deputy thereof or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be, or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
