#### MUNICIPAL CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

"Subjects and weights: Experience, 5; Duties, including report, 5. Seventy-five

per cent. on duties, 70 per cent. on experience and 70 per cent. on all.

"To meet the above requirements it is essential that the candidate shall show a continued employment in large building or buildings for at least five years as Superintendent of the same in charge of employees of the general character mentioned above.

"Applications for this examination must be filed on a special blank, Form C.

\* \* \* Candidates failing to receive 70 per cent. on the Experience paper will not be summoned for the physical examination. Candidates failing to pass the physical examination will not be summoned for the mental test.

"The candidates will be tested on their knowledge of the equipment of public buildings, tools, appliances, and materials used in cleaning and operating the same. They will be required to submit a bill of materials and estimates of labor required for known conditions in one of the buildings. A report dated October 24 was presented from the Examiner in Charge of the Bureau of Investigation, recommending that the three successful candidates in the examination for Civil Service Examiner, Mechanical Engineering, be marked Qualified" and that the eligible list for that position be promulgated. On motion, it was Resolved, That, under authority of clause 6 of Rule XII of the Rules of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, Wallace McClure of Livingston Hall, Columbia University, and Elsie Simpson of 313 West 124th Street, New York City, be and they hereby are excepted from examination to be employed in the Mayor's Committee on Taxation to assist in the preparation of a report by Dr. Robert Murray Haig on his investigation of the taxation systems now in force in various cities of the United States and of Canada, compensation to be at the rate of one dollar per hour and seventy-five cents per hour, respectively; provided, however, that the total compensation in either case shall not exceed the sum of \$750.

A communication dated October 17 was presented from the Secretary to the Commissioner of Public Works, Borough of Manhattan, relative to his request for authority to employ Elmer E. Noyes, Allan R. O'Keefe and Peter Kurscheidt as Inspectors of Public Works under clause 6 of Rule XII. and requesting that his original application be amended by changing the title under which it was desired to employ the said persons to Expert Inspector of Borings. In this connection, the Commission considered two reports dated October 23 from the Examiner in Charge of the Bureau of Investigation recommending that Messrs. O'Keefe and Noyes be marked "Qualified" for employment as Inspectors of Borings under clause 6 of Rule XII. It appearing that Commissioner Wolff of the State Civil Service Commission had signified at a previous meeting of the Municipal Commission his approval of the employment of the above-named persons under the title of Expert Inspector of Borings, it was

Resolved, That under authority of clause 6 of Rule XII. of the Rules of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, Allan R. O'Keefe, of 323 West 15th Street, New York City, and Elmer M. Noyes, of 153 West 64th Street, New York City, be and they hereby are excepted from examination, to be employed as Expert Inspectors of Borings in the office of the Commissioner of Public Works, Borough of Manhattan, in connection with the new Court House site, with compensation at the rate of \$1,200 per annum; provided, however, that in neither case shall the total compensation exceed the sum of \$750.

The Commission then adjourned, to meet Wednesday, October 28, 1914, at 10:30 o'clock a. m.


