MUNICIPAL CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

Minutes of Meeting of the Municipal Civil Service Commission of New York, Held Wednesday, October 21, 1914, at 10.30 o'Clock A. M.

Present—Dr. Henry Moskowitz, President, and Commissioners Darwin R. James, Jr., and Alexander Keogh. The President presided.

A public hearing was had on the proposed amendment of the Municipal Civil Service Classification by including in the Non-Competitive Class, under the heading "Positions in the Department of Health, at compensations not exceeding the amounts set forth below," and under the subheading "Tuberculosis Sanatorium, Otisville, New York," the title, "Watchman, \$600 per annum, with maintenance."

Robert J. Wilson, M. D., Director of the Bureau of Hospitals, Department of Health, appeared in favor of the proposed amendment. Mr. John Finnerty, representing the Interborough Association of Attendants, appeared in opposition. There were no other appearances and the Chair declared the hearing closed.

A public hearing was had on the proposed amendment of the Municipal Civil Service Classification by including in the Competitive Class, Part XII. (The Medical Service), the title "Psychologist." Gordon Ireland, Esq., Third Deputy Commissioner of the Department of Public Charities, appeared in connection with the proposed amendment. There were no other appearances and the Chair declared the hearing closed.

The Commission then went into regular session and the minutes of the meeting held October 7 were approved.

On motion, the proposed amendment of the Municipal Civil Service Classification by including in the Non-Competitive Class of the Department of Health the position of Watchman at \$600 per annum, with maintenance, for the Tuberculosis Sanatorium at Otisville, N. Y., was disapproved, and the Secretary was instructed to certify the eligible list of Attendant from which to fill vacancies in that position.

On motion, it was

Resolved, That the Municipal Civil Service Classification be and the same hereby is amended by including in the Competitive Class, Part XII. (The Medical Service), the title: Psychologist.

The following named candidates for the positions specified appeared, as directed, and their cases were laid over: Charles P. Early, Inspector of Public Works; Matilda White, Examiner of Charitable Institutions (Rule XII, clause 6); Francis M. Gorman, Examiner of Charitable Institutions (Rule XII, clause 6).

A report dated October 20 was presented from the Secretary to the Advisory Board, recommending that the following statement, to be signed by the appointing officer in cases of appointments under clause 3 of Rule XII, be placed on the last page of applications for such appointment: "I certify that to the best of my knowledge and belief the person herein nominated for non-competitive appointment is qualified to perform the duties of the position."

The recommendation was approved.

A report dated October 20 was presented from the Secretary to the Advisory

Board recommending that the receipt of applications for Playground and Gymnasium Attendant be postponed until December. The recommendation was adopted.

A report dated October 20 was presented from the Secretary to the Advisory Board, recommending that the eligible list of Clerk, Second Grade, be certified to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment as an appropriate list from which to make appointments to the position of Tabulator in the office of the Committee on City Plan at \$50 per month for a period not to exceed six months. The recommendation was adopted, and the Secretary was instructed to certify twenty-five names to anticipate declinations on account of salary.

A report dated October 20 was presented from the Secretary to the Advisory Board, transmitting a form of advertisement for the examination for Foreman Asphalt Worker, reading as follows:

"The subjects and weights are: Experience: 5; Duties: 7; 70 per cent. on Duties and 70 per cent. on all.

"Applications for this examination must be filed on a special blank, Form B. Experience blanks will be issued with the applications and must be filed with the Commission at the time of filing applications. The experience will then be rated. Those not passing 70 per cent. will not be notified for a physical examination. Those who pass the physical examination will be summoned for a mental examination at a time to be specified later.

"The duties of the Foreman Asphalt Worker include assignment to the Manhattan or Brooklyn Municipal Asphalt Repair Plant to take charge of a gang working inside the plant or outside on surfacing. He will have responsibility for tools, the work of the roller and all men assigned to his gang. He may be engaged upon mixing gangs or laying gangs as occasion requires.

"Candidates must show continuous experience for at least five years at mixing or laying of asphalt in new or repair work, either in the capacity of foreman or as steam roller engineman; or that they have served upon public works as inspector for five years with at least one additional year exclusively devoted to asphalt making, testing or laying. Rakers or tampers who have occasionally directed men must show other experience in pavement work equal to the requirement as above.

"Candidates will be tested on their ability to compute weights and volumes of carts or piles; how to locate a repair spot for report and later identification; the preparation of time sheets; daily reports of work done; how to cut and repair defects; the treatment of asphalts; the proper temperatures; time of rolling; direction of rolling; general supervision of men and the care of tools, supplies and materials. * * * Minimum age, 21 years."

The form of advertisement was approved.

A report dated October 21 was presented from the Secretary to the Advisory Board, submitting a form of advertisement for the examination for Tabulating Machine Operator (Hollerith Machine), reading as follows:

"The subjects and weights of the examination are: A—Experience, 6; B—Duties, 4; (a) Written test, 2; (b) Practical test, 2; C—70 per cent. required on Experience; D—70 per cent. required on Duties; E—70 per cent. general average required.

"Applications for this examination must be filed on a special blank, Form B. Experience blanks will be issued with applications and must be filed with the Commission at the time of filing applications. The experience will then be rated. Those not passing 70 per cent. will not be notified for a physical examination. Those who pass the physical examination will be summoned for a mental examination at a time to be specified later. * * *

"The minimum age is 18 years. Candidates must present evidence of having been employed in a position giving them practical experience in the operation of the Hollerith Machine.

"Tabulating Machine Operators (Hollerith Machine) in the employ of the City are required to operate the sorting machine, the key punch, the gang punch and the tabulator of this machine."

The form of advertisement was approved.

A report dated October 20 was presented from the Secretary to the Advisory Board, submitting the following form of advertisement for the examination of Supervising Inspector, Public Buildings and Offices, Grade 5:

"The duties of the position comprise the charge of personnel employed in the Public Buildings and Offices within the Bureau of the Borough President of Manhattan. The Supervising Inspector has immediate control over the employees in baths, comfort stations, court houses, municipal buildings, etc., who are engaged in cleaning or operating the plants or who are employed as repairers. He has the responsibility for the proper conduct and efficiency of engineers, attendants, mechanics and other squads of employees of both sexes. He examines into complaints of tenants of buildings, visitors, as to conditions or attendance. He maintains a daily record of work done, inspections made, repairs and attendance on all utilities. He must be a good judge of labor and have had the necessary experience in handling men that will insure an ability to meet the needs of the service and the character of the work accomplished.

"Subjects and weights: Experience, 5; Duties, including report, 5. Seventy-five per cent. on duties, 70 per cent. on experience and 70 per cent. on all.

"To meet the above requirements it is essential that the candidate shall show a continued employment in large building or buildings for at least five years as Superintendent of the same in charge of employees of the general character mentioned above.

"Applications for this examination must be filed on a special blank, Form C. * * * Candidates failing to receive 70 per cent. on the Experience paper will not be summoned for the physical examination. Candidates failing to pass the physical examination will not be summoned for the mental test.

"The candidates will be tested on their knowledge of the equipment of public buildings, tools, appliances, and materials used in cleaning and operating the same. They will be required to submit a bill of materials and estimates of labor required for known conditions in one of the buildings. They will also be called upon to write a report upon some phase of their prospective duties. * * *

The form of advertisement was approved.

A report dated October 21 was presented from the Secretary to the Advisory Board, recommending that the limit of compensation for the position of Supervising Nurse in the Non-Competitive Class of the Department of Public Charities be raised to \$900 per annum with maintenance, and that the order for the open competitive examination for the position be canceled. The Secretary was instructed to advertise a public hearing in the matter.

The Secretary submitted a memorandum dated October 20, stating that George Edwards, of 323 West 42nd Street, New York City, had called at the office and complained that he had been dropped from the service of the Department of Parks, Boroughs of Manhattan and Richmond, on account of illness; that the illness was the direct result of injuries sustained in the performance of duty; that he was a veteran volunteer fireman; had filed a doctor's certificate in the department; had been informed that a leave of absence would be granted him; and that he did not know that he had been dropped from the service until he presented himself for duty. The Secretary was instructed to communicate with the Commissioner of Parks, Boroughs of Manhattan and Richmond, in the matter.

The following reports were presented from the Examiner in Charge of the Bureau of Investigation:

Report dated October 15, recommending that candidates 14 to 19, inclusive, on the eligible list of Junior Chemist (Asphalt) be marked "Qualified" except in the case of Edward J. Kelley, where it was recommended that certification be withheld.

Report dated October 16, recommending that the twelve candidates named therein be marked "Qualified" on the eligible list of Court Attendant, Second Division, except in the cases of Cornelius Hosey, Frank A. Moran and Morgan L. Livingston, where it was recommended that certification be withheld.

Report dated October 16, recommending that candidates 15 to 20, inclusive, on the eligible list of Telephone Operator be marked "Qualified" except in the case of F. J. McGeary, where it was recommended that certification be withheld.

Report dated October 19, recommending that candidates 21 to 30, inclusive, on the eligible list of Janitor-Engineer be marked "Qualified" except in the case of Patrick J. Burke, where it was recommended that the candidate be summoned before the Commission, and in the case of Robert McQueen, where it was recommended that the candidate be marked "Not Qualified."

Report dated October 15, recommending that candidates 16 to 22, inclusive, on the eligible list of Inspector of Foods, Group 1, be marked "Qualified" thereon except in the case of John J. Sachtleben, where it was recommended that the candidate be summoned before the Commission.

Report dated October 15, recommending that candidates 16 to 20, inclusive, on the eligible list of Inspector of Foods, Group 2, be marked "Qualified" thereon.

Report dated October 19, recommending that the eligible list of Police Matron be promulgated and that the first ten candidates thereon be marked "Qualified" except in the case of Amelia King, where it was recommended that certification be withheld.

The recommendations were adopted.

A report dated October 20 was presented from the Examiner in Charge of the Bureau of Investigation relative to Mary E. Viney, of 113 Chester Street, Mount Vernon, N. Y., who had filed an application for appointment to the position of Examiner of Charitable Institutions in the Department of Public Charities under clause 6 of Rule XII. It appearing that the candidate had requested that her application be withdrawn, the papers were ordered filed.

After consideration of reports dated September 8 (K-244) and October 3 (K-281) from Mr. Leonhard Felix Fuld, Assistant Chief Examiner, in the matter of the experience of Peter Ward Brennan, Supervisor of Recreation in the Department of Parks, Borough of Brooklyn, it was

Resolved, That the action of the Municipal Civil Service Commission on March 4, 1914, in authorizing the employment of Peter Ward Brennan as Supervisor of Recreation in the Department of Parks, Borough of Brooklyn, under clause 5 of Rule XII of the Rules of the Municipal Civil Service Commission be and the same hereby is rescinded.

A communication dated October 19 was presented from the Chief City Magistrate, First Division, requesting to be informed of the status of the following-named Probation Officers, whose services were terminated on January 1, 1914, for lack of appropriation: Mrs. Francis M. Stevens, Miss Julia Coleman, Miss Mary E. Moore, Miss Jennie M. Shannon, Mrs. Henriette L. Smith.

The Secretary was instructed to request the Corporation Counsel for an opinion as to whether the names of the said persons should go on a preferred list as of October 20, when the Commission first received notice of the action taken in their cases, or as of January 1, 1914, the date when their services were actually dispensed with.

A communication dated October 16 was presented from the Commissioner of the Department of Public Charities, relative to the action of the Commission in notifying him that Mr. Clyde B. Rose and Miss Florence Rowland were performing duties inappropriate to their title of Hospital Helper, and should be assigned forthwith to duties appropriate thereto, and that the Commission could not pass their payrolls until such appropriate assignments had been effected. The Secretary was instructed to state that the Commission could see no reason for rescinding its action in the cases of the above-named persons, and to request of the Departments of Public Charities, Correction, Health and Bellevue and Allied Hospitals information as to whether any hospital helpers were engaged in work in the central offices or whether any hospital helpers were assigned to clerical or stenographic work or to work not in an institution or hospital, and to direct the First Assistant Chief Examiner and Assistant Chief Examiner Fuld to prepare definitions of the duties of Hospital Helper and a report as to whether it would be advisable to reduce the maximum salary from \$720 per annum to \$540 per annum; as to whether it would be advisable to have local boards of examiners for all non-competitive positions; as to any changes which might be necessary in the certificate which the Boards of Examiners forward to the Civil Service Commission; as to the reclassification of people now doing work of hospital helpers, and to embody therein any suggestions pertinent to the control of the non-competitive class in the various City departments.

A communication dated October 17 was presented from the President of the Borough of Brooklyn, stating that Julius Reisner, an Inspector of Regulating, Grading and Paving, had been reassigned to duty at the expiration of a leave of absence on account of illness. The Secretary was instructed to note the reassignment on the records.

After consideration of a communication dated October 20, from the Fire Commissioner, the payroll of John J. Kennedy, Chief Inspector in the Bureau of Fire Prevention, for time from March 9 to May 21, 1914 (under suspension), in the amount of \$801.06 was approved.

A communication dated October 17 was presented from John J. Curtin, Counsellor-at-Law, of 60 Wall Street, New York City, stating that the Remittitur from the Court of Appeals affirming the order of the Appellate Division that the Commission issue a certificate approving the reinstatement of Albert H. Johnson in the position of Patrolman had been filed on October 17 in the office of the Clerk of Kings County, and requesting that the Commission issue a certificate of reinstatement in accordance with law. The Secretary was instructed to inquire of the Corporation Counsel whether there was any objection to such action on the part of the Commission.

The Commission then adjourned, to meet Wednesday, October 28, 1914, at 10:30 o'clock a. m.

A report dated October 24 was presented from the Examiner in Charge of the Bureau of Investigation, recommending that the three successful candidates in the examination for Civil Service Examiner, Mechanical Engineering, be marked "Qualified" and that the eligible list for that position be promulgated. The recommendations were adopted.

The Commission reconsidered its action of October 14 denying the request of the Committee on Taxation for authority to employ under clause 6 of Rule XII, Wallace McClure and Elsie Simpson as Assistants to Dr. Robert Murray Haig in preparing his report on his investigation of taxation systems used in various cities. On motion, it was

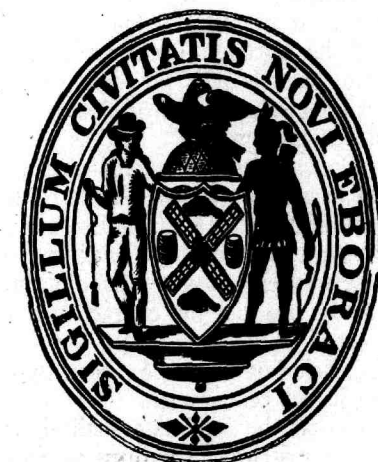

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the cash, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate, but the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the City.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.
