## MUNICIPAL CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

Minutes of Meeting of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, Held at the Offices of the Commission, No. 299 Broadway, on Wednesday, July 24, 1907, at 10 a. m.

Present—President William F. Baker and Commissioner Frank L. Polk.

The President, Mr. William F. Baker, presided.

A public hearing was had on the proposed amendment of the classification of exempt positions by including therein, under the heading "Law Department," the following:

Stenographer to Corporation Counsel.

William B. Crowell, Esq., Assistant Corporation Counsel, representing the Corporation Counsel, addressed the Commission in behalf of the request. There was no opposition, and the hearing closed.

A public hearing was had on the request of the Fire Commissioner for an amendment of Rule XV., clauses 7 and 8, so far as the same related to the method of keeping efficiency records of members of the uniformed force of the Fire Department and the terms to be used in indicating the various degrees of efficiency of such employees. Hon. Francis J. Lantry, Fire Commissioner, addressed the Commission in behalf of the amendment, and the hearing closed.

After the Commission had gone into regular session, the minutes of the meeting held July 10 were approved.

The appeal of Ira Coutant of Kingston, N. Y., for a special physical examination for the position of Laborer in Ulster County, was denied for lack of power.

A communication was presented from the Chief Examiner, dated July 17, forwarding a report of Examiner Murray on the case of Lieutenant Joseph Ivory, of the Police Department, who appealed for a re-rating of his record in the examination for promotion to Captain by giving him credit for the department medal awarded him on September 30, 1892. A communication was presented from the Chief Examiner, dated July 22, forwarding a report of Examiner Murray on the appeal of Max Neumaier for a re-rating of his record in the examination for promotion to Lieutenant of Police held September 12, 1905, by giving him credit for a special letter of commendation received while acting Roundsman, which was omitted from his rating by the Commission for the reason that the meritorious act for which it was awarded was performed in a grade lower than that from which promotion was sought. ## BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

Meeting called to order at 2 p. m.  
On motion, minutes approved as read.  
Mr. Smith excused by the Chairman.  
Appeal 60 of 1907, Alteration 1928 of 1907, premises Nos. 521 to 541 West Twenty-fifth street, Manhattan; Louis C. Maurer, architect and appellant.  
No. 4. Additional stairs are required.  
No. 5. Building exceeds area allowed for a nonfireproof structure and should not be increased in height.

Two additional enclosed outside iron stairs are now provided to each story and access to same made by fireproof doors, which provides the building with two outside stairs and two present inside stairs, enclosed in brick wall on all sides, making a total of four (4) continuous stairways, in number being all that is required by law.

The building, which is divided at the centre on the interior with a solid brick partition wall, full depth, and of same thickness as required by outside walls, having fireproof self-closing doors to each opening, practically makes it two buildings, with a small excess area of 400 square feet of floor surface to each division. The boiler is in a separate adjoining fireproof building, divided by brick walls, and the main building having no cellar.

4. Number of stairs to be increased from two to four by adding two outside enclosed iron stairways accessible to each floor.

5. That one additional story to the main building, now a four, to a five-story building.

4. For reason that by adding two outside enclosed iron stairways accessible to each floor, which make equivalent to four (4) stairways, in number all that is required by law.

5. That the intended new story be used solely for storage purposes, such storage of a non-hazardous nature, and not excessive as to height, being only five stories in all with the new story, and excess area being only 400 square feet to each division.

Messrs. Maurer and Connolly appeared before the Board.

On motion, laid over for one week, the appellants being directed to file additional drawing.

Appeal 61 of 1907, New Building 756 of 1907, east side of Fulton avenue, 299 feet 6 inches south of One Hundred and Sixty-eighth street, The Bronx, John V. Van Pelt, appellant.

Bay window construction is unlawful.

The construction as proposed is equally as good and desirable.

To allow the bay window to be constructed of wood frame, covered on the outside with galvanized iron instead of fireproof construction.

That the building is used as a dwelling, situated on church property.

The lot having quite a grade and the bay window being placed on the rear, it is erected on what is termed the first story, and is allowable on a liberal interpretation of section 73 of Code.

Mr. Van Pelt appeared before the Board.

On motion, approved.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

Each bid or estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders in The City of New York, or of a guaranty or surety company duly authorized by law to act as surety, and shall contain the matters set forth in the blank forms mentioned below.
