## MAYOR DE BLASIO AND SPEAKER MELISSA MARK-VIVERITO ANNOUNCE CONTINUING AND EXPANDED BENEFITS FOR YEAR TWO OF IDNYC PROGRAM

## IDNYC remains free to all new Yorkers

Less than one year after launch, IDNYC boasts over 670,000 enrollees, is largest municipal ID program in the country

**NEW YORK**—Mayor Bill de Blasio and Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito today announced that the IDNYC program, the largest municipal ID program in the country, will continue to be free for eligible New Yorkers in 2016. In addition to welcoming back all of the 2015 benefit partners, IDNYC now provides New Yorkers with free one-year memberships to seven more cultural institutions – including the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, the Museum of Modern Art, the New Museum, the Metropolitan Opera, the Museum of Chinese in America, BRIC Arts | Media and Pregones Theater – and discounted tickets and memberships for Citi Bike, the New York City Football Club, the New York Theatre Ballet and Ballet School, Animal Care Centers of New York, the Alliance of Resident Theatres, and Roundabout Theatre Company.

The Mayor announced the second year of the IDNYC program – which now boasts 670,000 cardholders and over 160,000 cultural memberships redeemed – with the launch of a <u>digital media campaign</u>.

Returning benefits include free one-year memberships to the City's Cultural Institutions Group and expanded discounts and benefits. A list of all partners and benefits of IDNYC is available at nyc.gov/idnyc.

"In just one year, the IDNYC program has grown to be the leading municipal identification program in the country, and an example to cities all across the world. I am proud to announce that even more New Yorkers will be able to join the ranks of IDNYC cardholders in 2016 absolutely free, so that every city resident has the confidence to interact with law enforcement, enter a government building, or pick up their kids from school. IDNYC also makes New York City's premiere cultural institutions accessible at no cost, welcoming new and diverse audiences from across our great city. IDNYC is a card for all of us to proudly identify ourselves – as New Yorkers," said **Mayor Bill de Blasio.** 

"With the tremendous success of the nation's largest municipal ID card program, I'm thrilled that we can offer residents another free year of IDNYC," said **Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito**. "No matter your status, whether it's immigrant, economic, financial, or if you're homeless or transgender, New Yorkers will be able to take advantage of benefits by signing up for this valuable card. With this extension, even more people can become card-carrying New Yorkers."

"In the first year of IDNYC, we heard countless stories of New Yorkers empowered through the program, including teenagers who did not previously have access to ID, immigrant mothers who can now enter school buildings and participate in their child's school with confidence, and transgender individuals who can self-designate their gender for the first-time," said **Nisha Agarwal**, **Commissioner of the Mayor's Office of** 

**Immigrant Affairs**. "We are thrilled to expand on IDNYC's success in year two with expanded benefits and enrollment centers across the five boroughs, with same or next day appointments available. All New Yorkers have an opportunity to get their IDNYC and show their New York City pride."

"We are proud to have contributed to the success of IDNYC and we are committed to maintaining the highest level of customer service and program integrity while continuing to expand benefits and use of the IDNYC card for all New Yorkers," said **Steve Banks, Commissioner of the Human Resources Administration.**

Mayor de Blasio and Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito launched the IDNYC program in 2014 to make government work more efficiently and effectively for New Yorkers by expanding access to the services, programs, and opportunities available to all residents across the five boroughs. IDNYC serves as valid identification when interacting with the NYPD, grants access to all City buildings, functions as a library card across all three library systems and serves as primary identification for opening a bank or credit union account at more than 75 financial institution branches in NYC. In July, the Administration launched a veteran designation on the card to facilitate access to veteran-specific services and benefits for New Yorkers who served in our country's military.

All city residents age 14 and above are eligible to get a municipal ID card, and enrollment is free for anyone who applies in 2016. All IDNYC applicants must have documentation that proves identity and residency in New York City. The City will protect the confidentiality of all IDNYC card applications and will not ask applicants about their immigration status.
