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## DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE.

### WARRANTS MADE READY FOR PAYMENT IN DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE TUESDAY, JULY 31, 1917.

#### Resolution Adopted.

Whereas, the Division of Factory Inspection has submitted to this Commission the following requests for variation of law, made by the parties named herein, in which appeal is made from a strict compliance with the orders by the Division of Inspection, against the premises noted below, the granting of which would necessitate a variation of law, and

Whereas, the Division of Factory Inspection has had a reinspection made of the premises in each case, and in accordance with the report submitted recommends as follows:

Premises affected, (1) Big Indian, appellant, Big Indian Products Co. 9—Sanitary inside water closet. 10—Remove outside privy, etc.

11—Additional exit. 12—Prohibit occupancy.

13—Reconstruct present stairway of combustible material. 3-story nonfireproof building; open lofts; no sprinklers; combustibles; no fire alarm system; 1 above 1st floor; exit, one interior stairway, not properly enclosed; doors open but are not self-closing; no egress from roof; 15 men employed throughout the year; one outside privy 75 feet from factory; no sewerage nor water in building or grounds; building erected since Oct. 1, 1913; no machinery on upper floor; the man is employed part of the year.

Recommendation: Accept a chemical closet of the Kaustine or other approved type, and as exit a stairway similar to present stairway to be located at west end of building.

Premises affected, (2) Binghamton, Wall and Ferry sts.; appellant, F. J. Baumann. 12—Approved fire alarm system. 4-story nonfireproof factory building; open lofts; sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm system; 68 above 1st floor; exit, one interior stairway, imperfect from fire escape; building occupied by more than one tenant and would require a Class C system.

Recommendation: Accept as Class B System, inasmuch as the building is equipped with a sprinkler system as per 83b.

Recommendation: When self-closing fire-resisting doors have been provided at all door openings to stair enclosure, and windows opening from workroom to stair enclosure bricked up; waiver of order No. 14 for fireproof passage from foot of tower to street.

Premises affected, (4) Gloversville, 99 Forest st.; appellant, C. W. Johnson Co. Additional exit. 3-story nonfireproof factory building; divided lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy above the 2d floor 1 occasionally; exits, one interior stairway doors to which open but are not self-closing; 3d floor an attic under eaves; boxes stored; building measures, 50 x 30.

Recommendation: Existing rear stairs to be continued to ground floor with exit from the foot thereof direct to outer air; a ladder to be provided through scuttle, which shall connect the present front stairs running from 1st to 2d floors with 3d floor.

Recommendation: Accept either interior or exterior stairway from 2d floor to ground (if interior, then direct exit on ground floor to street must be provided); opening to be made in present partition now in center of room and also through line of sewing machines, to give access to proposed stairway; from 2d floor to 3d floor will accept while present occupancy remains a straight ladder leading from 3d to 2d floor at a point where proposed stairway is located.

Premises affected, (10) Johnstown, 30 North Market st.; appellant, Mrs. H. B. Cline. 1—Additional exit. 3—Prohibit occupancy. 3-story nonfireproof factory building with divided lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm system; occupancy above the 2d floor 1 occasionally; one interior stairway, doors to which open out but are not self-closing; no egress from roof.

Recommendation: Order to guard gear conveyor to be complied with; order for inside water closet to be waived on condition that privy be kept in good condition; order for wash sink waived while conditions and occupancy remain as at present.

Premises affected, (7) Ilion, 141 Clark st.; appellant, Sterling Mills. 11—Additional water closet for males; additional wash sink for males; 2 additional wash sinks for females. Company claims it will erect a new building within a year; there is very little free space now; approximately 50 females on 2d and 3d floors, for whom it provided 2 water closets on 2d floor and one on 3d floor; one wash sink on 2d floor for females; 22 males throughout the building, for whom it provided one water closet on 1st floor and one wash sink on 1st floor; space on 2d floor for additional water closet, and space on 3d floor for additional wash basin.

Recommendation: Accept either interior or exterior stairway from 2d floor to ground (if interior, then direct exit on ground floor to street must be provided); opening to be made in present partition now in center of room and also through line of sewing machines, to give access to proposed stairway; from 2d floor to 3d floor will accept while present occupancy remains a straight ladder leading from 3d to 2d floor at a point where proposed stairway is located.

Premises affected, (10) Johnstown, 30 North Market st.; appellant, Mrs. H. B. Cline. 1—Additional exit. 3—Prohibit occupancy. 3-story nonfireproof factory building with divided lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm system; occupancy above the 2d floor 1 occasionally; one interior stairway, doors to which open out but are not self-closing; no egress from roof.

Recommendation: Stationary iron ladder from 3d to 2d floors, with a 36-inch stairs, pitched at 45 degrees, from 2d to 1st floors, said stairway to be remote from present stairway and ladder from 3d floor to terminate at point where proposed stairway is located.

Premises affected, (11) Johnstown, 215 W. State st., rear; appellant, M. Denker & Co. 1—Additional exit. 2—Prohibit occupancy. 3-story nonfireproof building; open lofts; no sprinkler; no fire alarm; occupancy above the 2d floor 1 occasionally, 12 on 2d floor; exit, one interior stairway, doors to which open out but are not self-closing; no egress from roof.

Recommendation: Accept an interior wooden stairway, 36 inches wide, from 2d to 1st floor, at north end, no doors to outer air at northwest corner of 1st floor, and straight wooden ladder from 3d floor to 2d floor at point where proposed stairway is located.

Premises affected, (12) Johnstown, 5 Church st.; appellant, Davies, McIntyre & Co. 2—Additional exit. 4—Prohibit occupancy. 3-story nonfireproof factory building; open lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; 1 above 2d floor; one stairway, doors to which open out but are not self-closing; building 40 x 40 feet; 6 females, 5 males on 2d floor; straight wooden ladder from 2d to 3d floor leading to head of stairway from 2d to 1st floors.

Recommendation: Accept wooden ladder from 3d to 2d floors on condition that a second exit from 2d floor be provided in form of outside wooden stairway at a point remote from present stairway, i. e., northeast corner of building two stories high, and to have proper balcony and properly railed.

Premises affected, (13) Johnstown, 10 W. Green st.; appellant, Pierson Brothers. 1—Prohibit occupancy. 2—Additional exit. 3-story nonfireproof building; divided lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; 1 on 3d floor occasionally; one interior stairway; on 2d floor 7 females, 3 males are employed.

Recommendation: Accept a 4a fire escape at rear, or, while occupancy remains unchanged, a wooden ladder through scuttle on 3d floor leading to 2d floor at rear of building, with outside wooden stairway from 2d floor, properly hand-railed, said stairway to be located in center of southerly wall, with proper door opening leading there.

Premises affected, (14) Johnstown, 10-12 Jansen st.; appellant, L. B. Hibbard. 3—Additional exit. 4—Prohibit occupancy. 3-story nonfireproof factory building; no sprinkler; no fire alarm; no combustibles; divided lofts; one occasionally above 2d floor; one interior stairway, doors to which open out but are not self-closing; no egress from roof.

Recommendation: Accept a 36-inch interior wooden stairway, properly hand railed, extending from 2d to 1st floors at north end of building, and straight wooden ladder from 3d to 2d floors at a point where the proposed stairway terminates on 2d floor; partition at north end of "Making room" to be removed 3 feet north and door installed to give access to proposed stairway.

Premises affected, (15) Johnstown, 106-108 South Market st.; appellant, H. B. Ten Eyck. 1—Prohibit occupancy. 3—Additional exit. 3-story nonfireproof building; divided lofts; no sprinkler; no fire alarm; no combustibles; occupancy above the 2d floor 1 occasionally; exit, one interior stairway, doors to which open out but are not self-closing; no egress from roof; stairway in center; 3d floor attic under eaves; 4 men on 2d floor; elevator at north end of building extending to 3d floor; straight ladder at south end from 2d to 3d floors; straight ladder at west end from 2d to 3d floors; both ladders interior.

Recommendation: Acceptance of present straight ladders while occupancy remains unchanged.

Premises affected, (16) Norwich, 84 East Main st.; appellant, W. C. Coe. 7—Enclose stairway 6 feet. 8—Self-closing gates at hoistway entrances. 9—Proper grating over overhead sheaves of hoist. Carriage hoist suspended by four corners; it descends to 1st floor in front of doorway leading to street, which doorway is used by cars coming into garage; proprietor uses hoist occasionally to bring articles to be stored to 2d floor; orders as issued cannot be complied with unless hoistway is relocated.

Recommendation: Accept the placing of two bars of sufficient strength to hold car at 2d floor; providing of bell which will ring when car starts to descend to give ample warning to anyone who may be underneath elevator; and provided some method is arranged to lock the operating mechanism of car so that same cannot be operated without direct knowledge of owner.

Premises affected, (17) New York Mills, Mill No. 1; appellant, New York Mills Corporation. Machine shop building, 9—2 proper and approved exits. 4-story nonfireproof factory building; sprinkler installed; combustibles carried; no fire alarm system; 8 above 2d floor; exit, one interior stairway properly enclosed with fireproof partitions, but openings not provided with doors at time of reinspection (which stairway has been erected since the inspection on which the order was issued); imperfect horizontal exit on each floor except the 1st, consisting of bridges of wood covered with sheet metal; doors to bridges fireproof but not self-closing; some are provided with springs but are fastened back during working hours; building 62 x 44 feet; exits remote.

Recommendation: Acceptance of bridges as exits when doors have been made self-closing.

Premises affected, (18) Oriskany Falls; appellant, E. S. Hamlin Co. 3—Additional exit. 2-story and attic building, measuring 40 x 60 feet, and used as feed mill; occupancy above the 1st floor, occasionally one man goes to oil machinery and changes chutes; at end of building, remote from stairs, there is a creek, and wall of building at this end extends down two stories



carried; no fire alarm system; 4 on 2d floor; used as woodworking shop, with 3 employees on 1st floor; 34-inch stairway located at front of building; stairway enclosed on first floor in partitions of 4-inch hollow tile; enclosure extending to underside of 1st floor ceiling; an open bridge extends from rear of this building to a rear building wherein is a stairway leading to ground; bridge used regularly by employees to carry lumber.

Recommendation: Accept present stairway if enclosure be carried to underside of roof and openings equipped with self-closing fire doors, and accept bridge from 2d floor to rear building as second exit.

AND it appearing that there are practical difficulties and unnecessary hardships in carrying out the strict provisions of law and the rules and regulations of the Industrial Code on the premises herein stated, and that in granting the variations recommended in each case the spirit of the law and of the rules and regulations will be observed and public safety secured in each case; and

It further appearing that the appellants have each been notified that he would be given an opportunity to appear at this time and be heard if he so desired, and of such of the appellants who appeared having been heard by the Commission; therefore,

Be it resolved that the Commission grant the variations set forth above with the understanding that said variations remain during the time that the conditions continue as of this date.

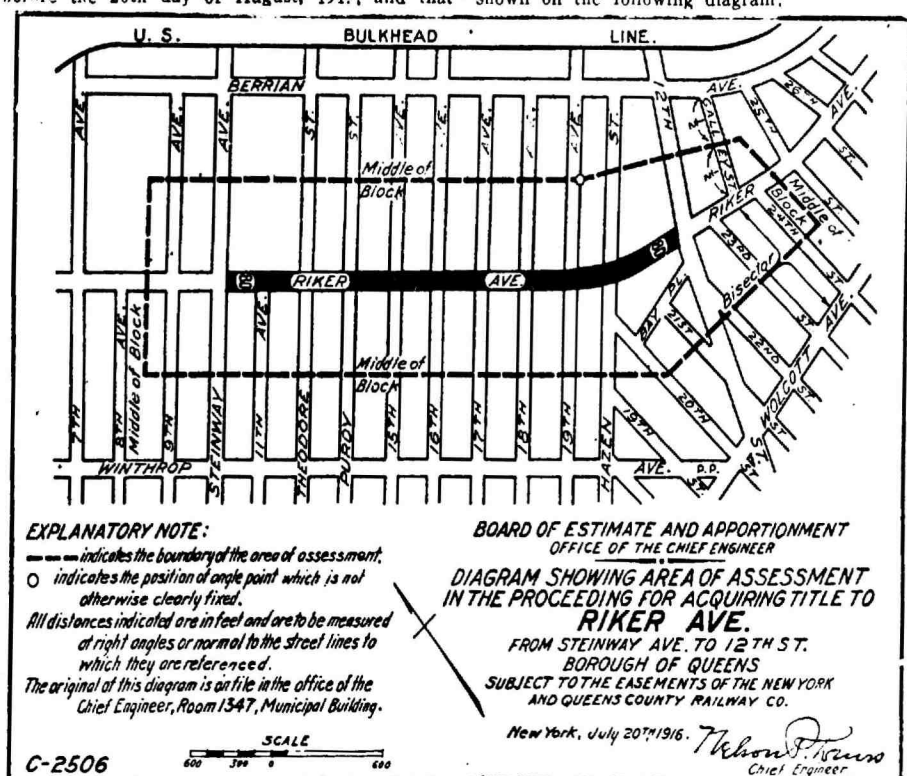

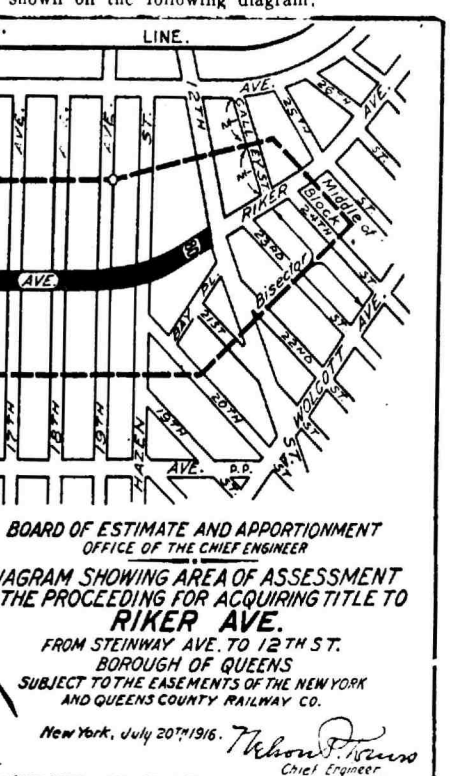

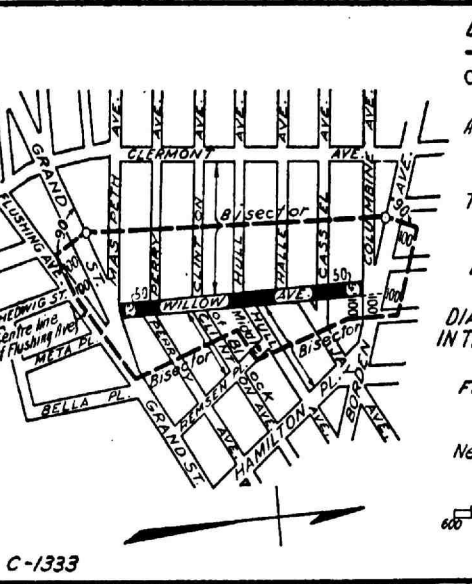

**TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH** BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

**THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES** thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The placing therein or permitting the occupancy of any such building by any tenant free, for rent or otherwise, excepting the necessary watchmen or the workmen engaged in the actual demolition thereof, shall of itself be a breach of the above conditions of sale.

The sale will be as of the condition of the property on date of delivery thereof to the purchaser. The City of New York will not be responsible for any change or loss which may occur in the condition of the buildings, or their appurtenances, between the time of the sale thereof and the time of delivering possession to the purchaser, after being properly vacated of all tenants. The sale and delivery to purchaser will be made as nearly together as the circumstances of vacating the structures of their tenants will permit.

All the material of buildings, sheds, walks, structures and cellars of whatsoever nature, with their exterior and interior fixtures, appurtenances and foundations of all kinds, except the exterior walls of the buildings and their foundations, and the sidewalks and curb in front of said buildings, extending within the described area, shall be torn down and removed from the premises. None of the dirt, debris or waste resulting from demolition shall be allowed to remain on the premises, except old mortar or plaster only, which may be left, but not higher at any point than two feet below the curb opposite that point. The exterior walls and their foundations shall be taken down only to a plane whose elevation shall be the level of the curb in front of the building. Where there is no curb the elevation of the surrounding ground shall be considered curb level. Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days

The person or persons making a bid for any service, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or officers, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, endorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the bids will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making a bid for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer or employee of The City of New York, is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the bid that the several matters stated therein are in all respects true.
