The Build NYC Resource Corporation (the "Corporation") is a not-for-profit local development corporation organized under Sections 402 and 1411 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York. In accordance with the aforesaid law, and pursuant to its certificate of incorporation, the Corporation has the power to issue non-recourse revenue bonds or notes and to make the proceeds of those bonds or notes available for projects that promote community and economic development in The City of New York (the "City"), and to thereby create jobs in the non-profit and for-profit sectors of the City's economy. The Corporation has been requested to issue such bonds and notes for the financings listed below in the approximate dollar amounts respectively indicated. 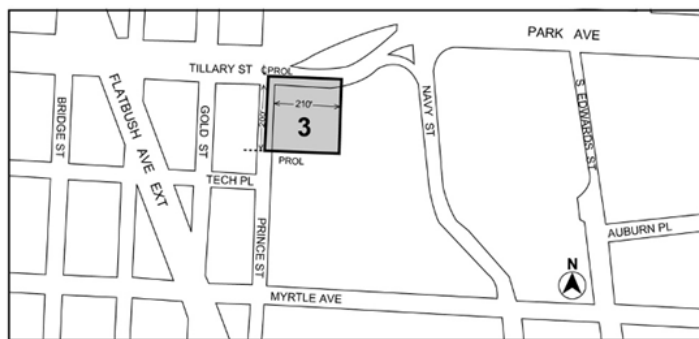

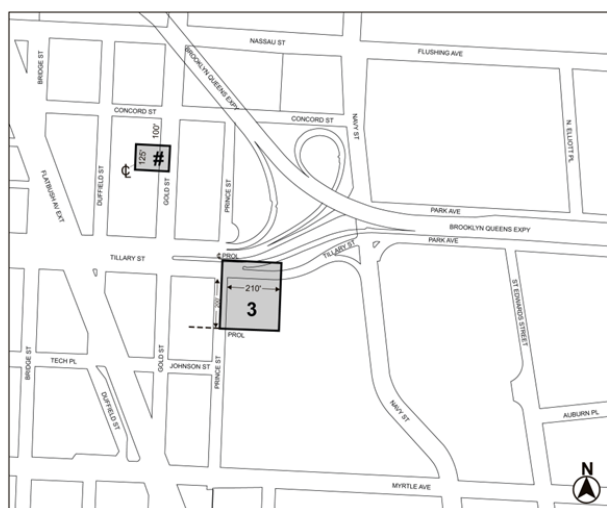


Map 7 – [date of adoption]

Any authorization or special permit application pursuant to the provisions of Section 66-511 (Additional floor area for mass transit station improvements by authorization) or Section 66-512 (Additional floor area for mass transit station improvements by special permit), respectively, shall be subject to the following provisions.

- (a) Additional rules and limitations on bonus #floor area#

The following rules and limitations on bonus #floor area# shall apply in addition to the provisions set forth in Sections 66-511 and 66-512:

- (1) Where a #zoning lot# contains multiple #uses# with different #floor area ratios#, the bonus may be applied to any individual #use#, and the total of all #floor area ratios# shall not exceed 20 percent of the greatest #floor area ratio# permitted on the #zoning lot#;
- (2) The #floor area# bonus may be used in combination with other #floor area# bonuses, provided that the maximum #floor area ratio# permitted through the combination of bonuses does not exceed 20 percent of the maximum #floor area ratio# otherwise permitted on the #zoning lot#. However, such 20 percent limitation shall not apply:
  - (i) where explicitly stated otherwise in a Special Purpose District; or
  - (ii) where explicitly stated otherwise in a special permit of the City Planning Commission; and
- (3) For #MIH developments# or #UAP developments#, the requirements of Article II, Chapter 7 (Additional Regulations and Administration in Residence Districts) shall not apply to the bonus #floor area# granted under the provisions of this Section.

For the purposes of applying this paragraph to applications seeking an authorization pursuant to Section 66-511 (Additional floor area for mass transit station improvements by authorization), notwithstanding the above allowances, in no event shall the amount of bonus #floor area# exceed 200,000 square feet.

For a #zoning lot# occupying an entire #block# located in an R9 or an R10 District, or in #commercial districts# mapped within, or with a

#residential equivalent# of an R9 or an R10 District, partially within the #Special Park Improvement District#, and containing a non-profit or voluntary hospital and related facilities, as listed in Use Group III(B), the City Planning Commission may, by special permit, allow the modifications set forth in paragraph (a) of this Section, provided the conditions set forth in paragraph (b) and findings set forth in paragraph (c) are met.

- (a) The Commission may allow an increase in the maximum #community facility# #floor area ratio# by up to a maximum of 20 percent. A #floor area# bonus pursuant to this Section may be used in combination with a #floor area# bonus permitted pursuant to Section 66-51 (Additional Floor Area for Mass Transit Station Improvements), and the combination of such bonuses may exceed 20 percent of the maximum #floor area ratio# otherwise permitted.

In connection with such #floor area# bonus, the Commission may allow modifications to applicable #bulk# regulations.

- (b) In order to grant a special permit pursuant to this Section, the following conditions shall be met:
- (1) a minimum #floor area# of 75 percent of any #development# or #enlargement# on such #zoning lot# will be allocated to such hospital #use#;
  - (2) the bonus #floor area# allowed pursuant to this Section shall be exclusively allocated to such hospital #use#; and
  - (3) the amount of #floor area# to be located on the portion of such #zoning lot# within the #Special Park Improvement District# shall not exceed a #floor area ratio# of 10.0.
- (c) In order to grant a special permit pursuant to this Section, the Commission shall find that:
- (1) the public benefit derived from such proposed hospital #development# or #enlargement# merits the additional #floor area# being granted pursuant to this special permit;
  - (2) where #bulk# modifications are utilized, such modifications will provide a more satisfactory physical relationship to existing hospital #buildings or other structures# on the #zoning lot#, and facilitate a more efficient and integrated site plan; and
  - (3) where #bulk# modifications are utilized, the distribution of #bulk# on the #zoning lot# will result in a satisfactory site plan and urban design relationships of #buildings or other structures# to adjacent #streets# and the surrounding area.

The Commission may prescribe appropriate conditions and safeguards to minimize adverse effects on the character of the surrounding area.

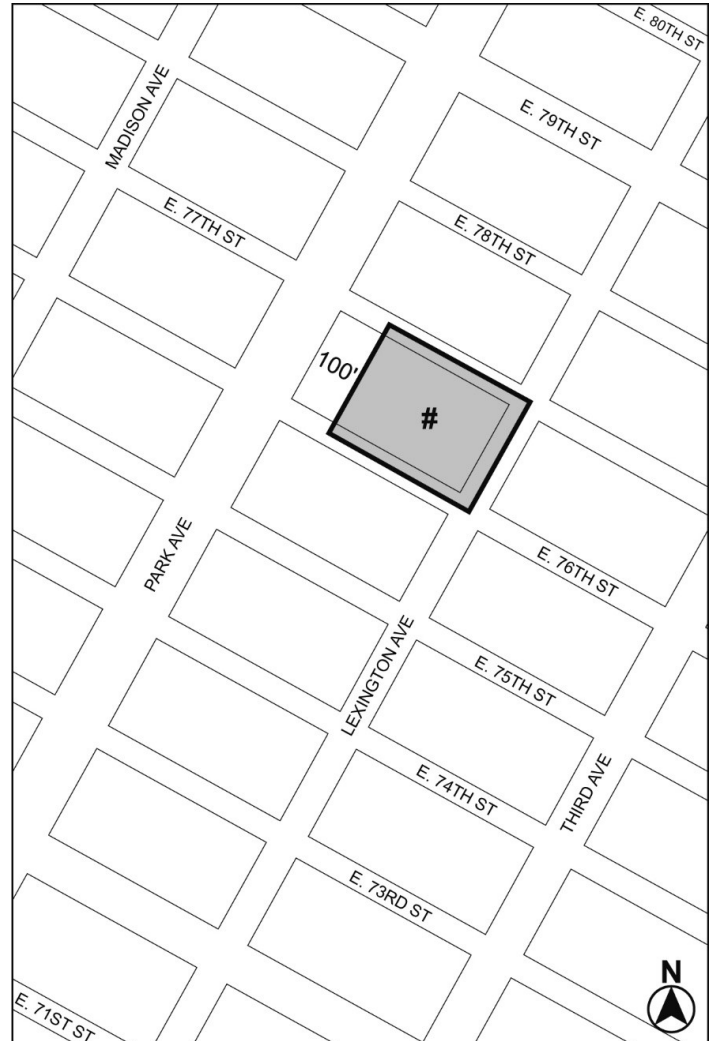

protective structures. This rule was first published on March 26, 2025 and a public hearing thereon was held on April 30, 2025.

### Statement of Basis and Purpose of Rule

Local Law 111 of 2024 (LL 111) amended section 3307.11 of Chapter 33 of the Building Code regarding artwork on temporary protective structures to allow for artwork to be painted on the structures.

The Department of Buildings (DOB) is amending section 3307-01 of Chapter 3300 of Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York to address the new requirements of LL 111, and clarifying that the inspection requirements set forth in section 3307-01 do not apply to artwork painted on temporary protective structures.

DOB's authority for these rules is found in sections 643 and 1043 of the New York City Charter and Local Law 111 of 2024.

New material is underlined.

[Deleted material is in brackets.]

Asterisks (\*\*\*) indicate unamended text.

"Shall" and "must" denote mandatory requirements and may be used interchangeably in the rules of this department, unless otherwise specified or unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

Section 1. Subdivision (a) of section 3307-01 of chapter 3300 of Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(a) **Required installation of artwork approved by the Department of Cultural Affairs ("DCLA").** Temporary protective structures installed on and after September 1, 2023 must include DCLA-approved artwork as defined in Section 3307.11.2 of the Building Code unless the owner of the property at which such temporary structure is installed opts out in accordance with the provisions of this section. For the purposes of this section, the term "temporary protective structures" refers to sidewalk sheds, construction fences, and supported scaffolds that are or will be installed for at least 90 days. For the purposes of this section, the term "install" with respect to artwork means affixed to or painted on a temporary protective structure.

§2. The exception to subdivision (c) of section 3307-01 of chapter 3300 of Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(c) **Opting out.**

\*\*\*

Exception. Subject to appropriation of funds for city capital projects to install approved or alternative artwork, properties owned by the City of New York or receiving capital funding from the City or a City agency may not opt out, except as otherwise provided in Section [3307.11.8] 3307.11.7.1 of the Building Code.

§3. Subdivisions (d), (e) and (f) of section 3307-01 of chapter 3300 of Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York are amended to read as follows:

(d) **Installation [and removal] of the artwork.**

(1) The applicant of record for the temporary protective structure must submit plans showing area of coverage, materials, and method of installation of the artwork to the temporary protective structure.

(2) If DCLA approval for alternative artwork is not received by the time that the application for the temporary protective structure is approved, the applicant must file a post approval amendment with revised plans that comply with paragraph (1) above when DCLA approval is received and prior to installation of the artwork.

[(3) An owner may choose to participate in the program again after de-installation of the artwork and may install DCLA-approved artwork in accordance with the provisions of this section.]

(e) **Method of installation.**

(1) Artwork installed on sheds. Artwork [must] may be installed on the outer sides and ends of sidewalk sheds by stretching such artwork over the shed and fastening to the back or on panels that adhere directly to the outer sides and ends of the shed. Artwork cannot extend above or below the shed parapet or be larger than four (4) feet in height. Artwork may also be painted directly onto the shed.

(2) Artwork installed on construction fences. Artwork [must]

may be installed on the outside of the construction fence by stretching such artwork over the fence and fastening to the back or on panels that adhere directly to the fence structure. Artwork cannot extend beyond the top of the fence. Artwork may also be painted directly onto the fence.

(3) Artwork installed on supported scaffolds. Artwork must be printed on debris netting meeting the requirements of Section 3314.8.2 of the Building Code.

(f) **Inspections.**

(1) Upon completion of the installation of affixed artwork on a temporary protective structure, such installation must be inspected by a qualified person designated by the permit holder for the temporary protective structure or a third party acceptable to such permit holder to verify that the artwork is in a safe condition and has been installed in accordance with approved plans. The results of the inspection must be documented in an installation inspection report signed and dated by the person who performed the inspection.

(2) In addition, the affixed artwork must be inspected in accordance with the following provisions:

- (i) Sheds – daily, as set out in Section 3307.6.5.10 of the Building Code.
- (ii) Fences – weekly, as set out in Section 3307.7.8 of the Building Code.
- (iii) Supported scaffolds – prior to each shift, as set out in Section 3314.4.3.4 of the Building Code.

(3) Inspection records must be kept on site and made available to the Department on request.

Exception. The requirements of this subdivision do not apply to artwork painted on a temporary protective structure.

#### EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 792

May 3, 2025

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2021, the federal monitor in the *Nunez* use-of-force class action stated that steps must be taken immediately to address the conditions in the New York City jails; and

WHEREAS, on June 14, 2022, the federal court in *Nunez* approved the *Nunez* Action Plan, which “represents a way to move forward with concrete measures now to address the ongoing crisis at Rikers Island”; and

WHEREAS, although there has been improvement in excessive staff absenteeism, extraordinarily high rates of attrition due to staff retirements and other departures continue to seriously affect the Department of Correction’s (DOC’s) staffing levels and create a serious risk to DOC’s ability to carry out the safety and security measures required for the maintenance of sanitary conditions; and access to basic services, including showers, meals, visitation, religious services, commissary, and recreation; and

WHEREAS, this Order is given to prioritize compliance with the *Nunez* Action Plan and to address the effects of DOC’s staffing levels, the conditions at DOC facilities, and health operations; and

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#### EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 793

May 3, 2025

WHEREAS, it is of utmost importance to protect the health and safety of all persons in the custody of the Department of Correction (“DOC”), and of all officers and persons who work in the City of New York jails and who transport persons in custody to court and other

facilities, and the public; and

WHEREAS, over 80 provisions in the various Court Orders entered in *Nunez v. City of New York*, 11 CV 5845 (SDNY), require DOC to consult with, and seek the approval of, the *Nunez* Monitor (“Monitor”) prior to implementing or amending policies on issues, including but not limited to, matters relating to security practices, the use of restraints, escorts, emergency lock-ins, de-escalation, confinement management of incarcerated individuals following serious acts of violence and subsequent housing strategies, and DOC may be held in contempt of court and sanctioned if it fails to appropriately consult with and obtain approval from the Monitor regarding policies in these areas; and

WHEREAS, as fully detailed in Emergency Executive Order 579 of 2024, DOC is already experiencing a significant staffing crisis, which poses a serious risk to the health, safety, and security of all people in custody and to DOC personnel; and

WHEREAS, attempting to comply with many of the provisions of Local Law 42 and the new BOC regulations, such as by transporting individuals to court without restraints, would require a massive increase in staff and other resources, which are not available; and

WHEREAS, even if DOC had such additional staffing and resources, that still would not obviate the direct threat to public safety posed by certain provisions of Local Law 42, nor would it obviate the fact that the Monitor has yet to approve implementation of those provisions as required by the *Nunez* Orders, nor would it obviate the fact that additional time would be needed to safely implement those provisions of Local Law 42 eventually approved by the Monitor, because, as the Monitor has expressly cautioned, the safe implementation of any new requirement or reform in DOC facilities requires planning time to “evaluat[e] the operational impact, update[e] policies and procedures, updat[e] the physical plant, determin[e] the necessary staffing complement, develop[] training materials, and provid[e] training to thousands of staff, all of which must occur before the changes in practice actually go into effect” [11 CV 5845 (SDNY) Dkt No. 758-3 at p. 61]; and

WHEREAS, on July 27, 2024, I issued Emergency Executive Order No. 624, and declared a state of emergency to exist within the correction facilities operated by the DOC, and such declaration remains in effect; and

WHEREAS, additional reasons for requiring the measures continued in this Order are set forth in Emergency Executive Order No. 625, dated July 27, 2024, and Emergency Executive Order 682, dated October 30, 2024; and

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 790, dated April 28, 2025 is extended for five (5) days.

§ 2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.
