Health Department Encourages New Yorkers to Get mpox Vaccinated

The mpox vaccine is effective at preventing mpox. Get the full two-dose series for the best protection.

The two-dose JYNNEOS vaccine is very effective at protecting against mpox, according to new data from the CDC.

- ☑ Getting vaccinated for mpox can reduce your chance of getting mpox, and it may reduce symptoms if you do get it.
- ☑ Everyone should receive two doses of the mpox vaccine, at least four weeks apart. If you never received your second dose, make sure to get it, no matter how much time has passed. Vaccines are being administered subcutaneously.
- Anyone of any sexual orientation or gender identity who is at risk for mpox can get vaccinated.



Vaccination is no cost and available regardless of immigration status.



The mpox vaccine is very effective at protecting against mpox. If you never received your second dose, make sure to get it — no matter how much time has passed. Vaccines are being administered subcutaneously.
