

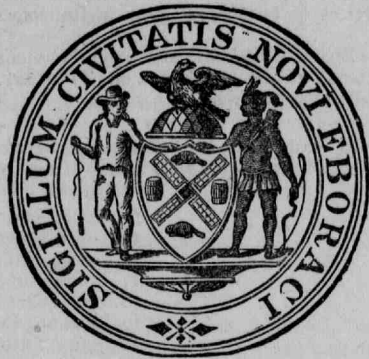

6th. The report of the Sanitary Committee, to whom was referred the report of Dr. Hermann M. Biggs on pulmonary tuberculosis, was received and read, and

On motion, was approved, and the following preamble and resolutions were adopted:

Whereas, Tuberculosis is a contagious disease and is distinctly preventable, and  
Whereas, It is acquired by the direct transmission of the tubercle bacilli from the sick to the well, usually by means of the dried and pulverized sputum floating as dust in the air, and  
Whereas, It can be largely prevented by simple and easily applied measures of cleanliness and disinfection, and to an extent, by segregation of those suffering from it, be it therefore

Resolved, That this Board urge upon hospital authorities of the City of New York the importance of separation so far as possible in the hospitals of this city of persons suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis from those afflicted with other diseases, and urge that proper wards be set apart for the exclusive treatment of this disease, and be it further

Resolved, That the Commissioners of Charities and Correction be recommended to take such steps as will enable them to have and control a hospital to be known as "The Consumptive Hospital," to be used for the exclusive treatment of this disease, and that, as far practicable, all inmates of the institutions under their care suffering from tuberculosis be transferred to this hospital.

#### Work Performed by the Sanitary Bureau for Week ending December 9, 1893.

There were 13,297 inspections made by the Sanitary Inspectors and the Sanitary Police.  
There were 421 complaints returned by the Sanitary Inspectors and the Sanitary Police.  
There were 226 complaints received from citizens and referred to the Sanitary Inspectors and Sanitary Police for investigation and report.

There were issued to the consignees of vessels, to discharge cargoes, on vouchers from the Health Officer of the Port, 20 permits.

There were issued under the Sanitary Code, 2 miscellaneous permits.

There were issued to scavengers to empty, clean and disinfect privy-sinks, 41 permits.

The 731 deaths represent a death-rate of 19.86 against 20.63 for the previous week, and 19.54 for the corresponding week of 1892.

The decrease of 28 deaths was mainly due to a decrease of 9 in the deaths from typhoid fever, of 9 from diarrhoeal diseases, of 17 from phthisis, and of 14 from Bright's disease, partially offset by an increase of 6 in the deaths from bronchitis, and of 6 from congenital debility.

The deaths from diphtheria were most numerous in the Twelfth Ward, from measles in the Nineteenth Ward, and from scarlet fever in the Twenty-third Ward.

Resolved, That, as a mark of respect to his memory, the flags upon the City Hall be displayed at half-staff until after the funeral; and further

Resolved, That this Board attend the funeral in a body.

## TO OWNERS OF LANDS ORIGINALLY ACQUIRED BY WATER GRANTS.

ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE RECENT act of the Legislature (chapter 449, Laws of 1889), which provides that whenever any streets or avenues in the city, described in any grant of land under water, from the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty containing covenants requiring the grantees and their successors to pave, repave, keep in repair or maintain such streets shall be in need of repairs, pavement or repavement, the Common Council may, by ordinance, require the same to be paved, repaved or repaired, and the expense thereof to be assessed on the property benefited; and whenever the owner of a lot so assessed shall have paid the assessment levied for such paving, repaving or repairing, such payment shall release and discharge such owner from any and every covenant and obligation as to paving, repaving and repairing, contained in the water grant under which the premises are held, and no further assessment shall be imposed on such lot for paving, repaving or repairing such street or avenue, unless it shall be petitioned for by a majority of the owners of the property (who shall also be the owners of a majority of the property in frontage) on the line of the proposed improvement.

The act further provides that the owner of any such lot may notify the Commissioner of Public Works, in writing, specifying the ward number and street number of the lot that he desires, for himself, his heirs and assigns, to be released from the obligation of such

covenants, and elects and agrees that said lot shall be thereupon liable to be assessed as above provided, and thereupon the owner of such lot, his heirs and assigns shall thereupon be relieved from any obligation to pave, repair, uphold or maintain said street, and the lot in respect of which such notice was given shall be liable to assessment accordingly.

The Commissioner of Public Works desires to give the following explanation of the operation of this act: When notice, as above described, is given to the Commissioner of Public Works, the owner of the lot or lots therein described, and his heirs and assigns, are forever released from all obligation under the grant in respect to paving, repaving or repairing the street in front of or adjacent to said lot or lots, except one assessment for such paving, repaving or repairs, as the Common Council may, by ordinance, direct to be made thereafter.

No street or avenue within the limits of such grants can be paved, repaved or repaired until said work is authorized by ordinance of the Common Council, and when the owners of such lots desire their streets to be paved, repaved or repaired, they should state their desire and make their application to the Board of Aldermen and not to the Commissioner of Public Works, who has no authority in the matter until directed by ordinance of the Common Council to proceed with the pavement, repavement or repairs.

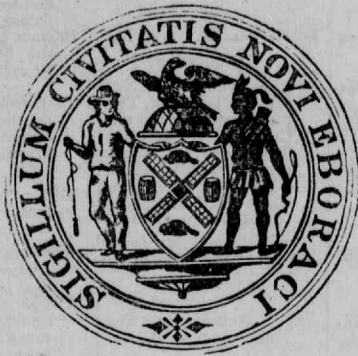
