

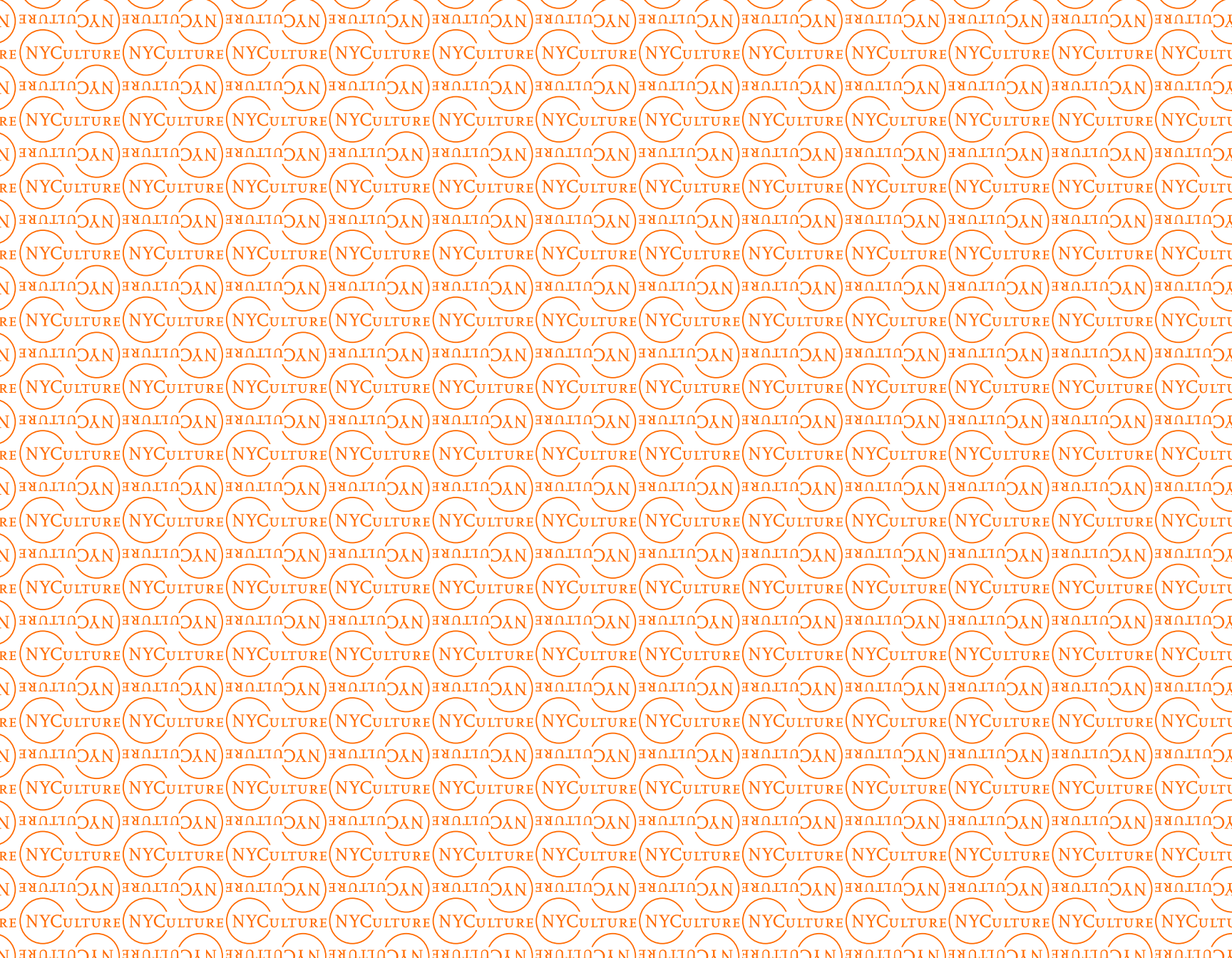

LETTER FROM THE MAYOR, FIRST DEPUTY MAYOR & COMMISSIONER

Culture is one of New York City's signature industries, present in every neighborhood of all five boroughs. It supports our economic vitality, generates excitement, and enhances quality of life, in turn making New York City a world-class destination. That's why we are proud to be the nation's largest single arts funder, supporting programming, operations, and construction projects at over 900 diverse nonprofit arts groups citywide.

In fiscal year 2013, the Department of Cultural Affairs continued expanding opportunities for making and experiencing art across each of the five boroughs. The year saw significant progress on a number of special initiatives. This includes paving the way for more affordable artist workspaces in Brooklyn and Governors Island. We have also heralded in new cultural developments in Downtown Brooklyn such as the future BRIC Arts Media House, St. Ann's Warehouse at the

Tobacco Warehouse, Theatre for a New Audience, and Urban Glass, as well as Culture Shed and the Whitney Museum of American Art on Manhattan's West Side.

The City also maintained its record-high funding levels for arts and culture in FY13, the results of which can be seen in the exceptional work produced by the cultural sector. Efforts to quantify the impact of those results have advanced through the agency's expanded data collection initiatives and use of the Cultural Data Project. Other indicators provide overarching context for advocacy—for example, in 2013 62% of Tony Award-winning productions originated in nonprofit theaters, and nearly half of the city's 52 million visitors came for arts and culture.

Sincere thanks to our many colleagues across City agencies and the local foundations, corporations, and individuals, whose ongoing partnership and commitment has ensured that arts and culture are at the core of this vibrant city.

INTRODUCTION

EVERY YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS (DCLA) STRIVES TO IMPROVE ITS SERVICE TO THE CULTURAL FIELD, responding to the ongoing needs of the creative sector and promoting the achievements of artists and arts organizations throughout the city.

DCLA's achievements in Fiscal Year 2013 (FY13), some of which are included in these few pages, reflect the agency's commitment to maintaining and promoting New York City's unmatched cultural resources for residents and visitors from around the world. This year, a signature program celebrated a significant milestone. The agency continued to pursue its goal of increasing the supply of permanent, affordable work and exhibition space for arts practitioners through targeted investments in new and renovated facilities. DCLA also helped launch a number of initiatives in the wake of Hurricane Sandy to aid arts organizations and artists in their recovery and resiliency efforts.

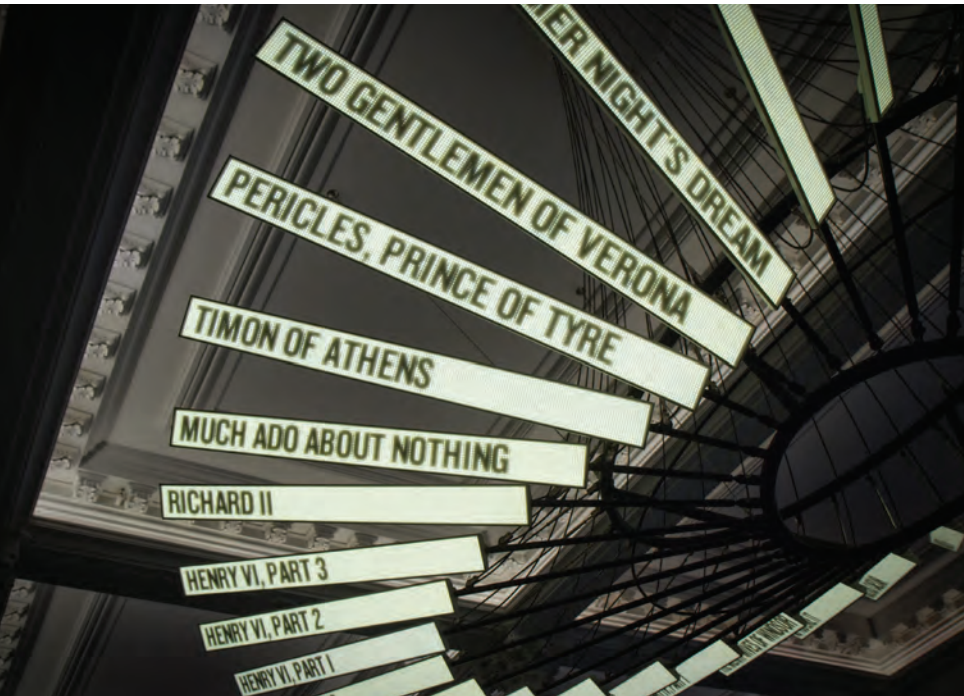
PERCENT FOR ART 30TH ANNIVERSARY

October 2012 marked the 30th anniversary of DCLA's Percent for Art Program (Percent), signed into law by Mayor Ed Koch in 1982. The Percent for Art law requires that one percent of the budget for eligible municipal capital projects be allocated to the commission and installation of a work of permanent public art. Under DCLA's guidance, over the last 30 years, the City has installed over 300 public artworks at public schools, municipal buildings, plazas, and other public spaces across the five boroughs, with more than 80 additional

commissions underway. Collectively, these projects reflect the history, diversity and creativity of New York City residents and experiences.

To honor Percent's 30th anniversary, DCLA introduced a series of online initiatives designed to increase the visibility of and access to this unique public collection. The new initiatives include:

- A **mobile-friendly website** for use on smartphones and tablets that makes Percent installations easy to find through an interactive map and keyword search functions. The site was created in partnership with the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications (DoITT). nyc.gov/percentmobile
- A **Tumblr blog** that highlights Percent projects on a regular basis through images, videos, descriptions, artist information, and current news related to the Percent program. percentforartnyc.tumblr.com
- A **Foursquare Percent page**, which enables visitors to "check in" at Percent installations and access tips and fun facts about the artworks they encounter around the city. foursquare.com/nycpercent
- The addition of Percent installations on the **NYCity Map**, a single access point to find all City services and agencies and a valuable tool for people looking for a wide array of resources. The Percent layer was developed in partnership with the Department of Design and Construction and DoITT. maps.nyc.gov/doitt/nycitymap



SPACEWORKS

2013 was a busy year for Spaceworks, a nonprofit organization incubated by DCLA and formally established in 2012 to offer long-term, affordable studio and rehearsal space to practicing artists across the city. The organization opened its two pilot sites with a ribbon cutting ceremony attended by Mayor Bloomberg on August 20, 2013. The ceremony took place at Spaceworks' facility in Long Island City, Queens, which features three dance studios and a music practice room. The second facility in Gowanus, Brooklyn, offers two visual arts studios and co-working office space. Both sites are now available for use.

Spaceworks also has a number of projects in the pipeline that are slated to begin construction in FY14. These include studio and rehearsal spaces on Governors Island, in the Red Hook and Williamsburg branches of the Brooklyn Public Library, and in Brooklyn Bridge Park.

CULTURE SHED

In the State of the City address at Barclays Arena on February 14, 2013, Mayor Bloomberg unveiled the City's next great cultural venue, Culture Shed, developed in partnership with DCLA, City Hall, and the Hudson Yards Development Corporation. Comprised of a combination of large-scale, flexible spaces, Culture Shed will provide a unique venue for cultural activities in New York City, presenting and producing innovative work across the spectrum of creative industries. Designed by architects Diller Scofidio + Renfro in collaboration with Rockwell Group, Culture Shed will be a five-story, 100,000 square foot fixed building with large, column-free floors for



exhibitions and performances and a shell that deploys to expand the interior space by an additional 20,000 square feet. The building will be able to host multiple programs simultaneously, giving local, national, and international cultural organizations an unprecedented opportunity to showcase their works for a broad audience. Critical work on Culture Shed began in 2010 with a \$100,000 grant award from National Endowment for the Arts' Mayors Institute on City Design initiative to advance the design, technical and operational development of the space. Construction is expected to begin in 2014, with an anticipated completion date of 2017.

HURRICANE SANDY RESPONSE AND RECOVERY EFFORTS

From the Bronx to Staten Island, Hurricane Sandy left artists and cultural organizations reeling from floodwater damage, power outages, and revenue losses. As the recovery continues and New York City adjusts to the legacy of the storm, DCLA remains committed to providing information and assistance to the cultural community. The agency also continues to work closely with those groups hardest-hit by Sandy, ensuring they have access to the resources available for recovery efforts.

In the days immediately following the storm, DCLA began to catalog losses, direct organizations to available resources, and advocate to FEMA on behalf of the cultural community. Specific initiatives included:

Field Survey

On November 2, DCLA distributed a field-wide survey to assess the storm's impact on the nonprofit cultural community. Of the 645 groups that responded:

- 150 (23%) organizations sustained storm-related property damage;
- 387 (60%) organizations reported revenue losses due to closures, canceled performances, reduced ticket sales or attendance, and disrupted fundraising;
- Only 38 (6%) of respondents had flood insurance;
- 70 (11%) had business interruption insurance but in most cases, storm-related damage was excluded from coverage.

Financial Resources

DCLA worked to ensure that financial resources were available to help artists and organizations conserve damaged work, replenish supplies, and stabilize facilities. Efforts included:

- Collaboration with the Fund for the City of New York to develop and promote the interest-free NYC Nonprofit Loan Recovery Program, established by the Mayor's Fund and other philanthropic partners. The initiative was designed to help organizations access cash for operations and short-term construction projects while awaiting FEMA reimbursement.
- Facilitation of a \$430,000 grant from the Mayor's Fund to the New York Foundation of the Arts (NYFA) Emergency Relief Fund. The award offered financial relief to 55 artists who lost materials, artwork, and sustained damages to their studios.

Art Conservation

In partnership with a team of conservators from the Smithsonian Institute, the American Institute for Conservation Community Emergency Response Team (AIC-CERT), the Museum of Modern Art and the American Museum of Natural History, DCLA helped establish the Cultural Recovery Center for the conservation of art and artifacts damaged by floodwater. The Center, located at Bush Terminal in Sunset Park, Brooklyn, was staffed by 100 volunteers and outfitted with supplies from Materials for the Arts (MFTA). In the four months it was open, 3,750 works of art passed through its doors for analysis and treatment.

Technical Assistance

DCLA also provided essential technical assistance to the field, including:

- **Promotion.** Immediately following the storm, DCLA worked to promote arts organizations that were operating regularly or offering special programs, and highlighted relief efforts undertaken by arts organizations to help address the needs of their neighbors. DCLA collaborated with NYC & Company to publish this information across various channels, generating extensive coverage through social media, newsletters, and other outlets.
- **Access to Supplies.** DCLA's Materials for the Arts (MFTA) served as a vital resource, providing donated office equipment, office supplies and other materials for arts groups and public schools whose facilities were damaged by the storm.
- **FEMA Briefings.** With First Deputy Mayor Patricia E. Harris and Deputy Mayor Linda Gibbs, DCLA organized two FEMA briefings geared specifically for nonprofit groups to learn more about the application process for FEMA Public Assistance. Within one month, over 100 cultural groups applied for assistance.
- **Resource Aggregation.** The Agency established and continues to maintain an online compendium of funding resources, FEMA news, and available technical assistance including legal support services and artwork conservation opportunities.
- **City Resiliency Efforts.** Through the City's Nonprofit Task Force, DCLA monitored the advancement of the approximately 100 cultural applications to FEMA's

Public Assistance program, and offered assistance to groups navigating the applications as well as declinations and appeals. Also, in April 2013 DCLA hosted a conversation with cultural groups and the Special Initiative for Rebuilding and Resiliency (SIRR), about the impact of Hurricane Sandy on the field. Feedback from the event contributed to SIRR's report, *A Stronger, More Resilient City*—a comprehensive set of policy recommendations and community plans—published in May 2013.

On October 22, 2013, Commissioner Kate Levin accepted the "Heritage Defender Award" on behalf of DCLA from Heritage Preservation, a national institute devoted to conservation. The award acknowledged the Agency's "extraordinary and sustained commitment to protecting New York City's cultural and artistic heritage through meaningful partnerships that promote emergency preparedness and response, including critical activity following Hurricane Sandy." Looking ahead, the agency will continue to work with leaders in the cultural community to strengthen the existing response and recovery efforts across the City.

PROGRAM SERVICES

THE PROGRAM SERVICES UNIT ADMINISTERS THE CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT FUND (CDF), through which the City grants programming support to arts and cultural organizations across the five boroughs. CDF provides funding for cultural programming as diverse as the city itself: from museum exhibitions to theatrical productions to arts education programs and public art installations.

In FY13 DCLA convened 22 CDF panels of seven members each to review applications and allocate \$27,177,810 in program support. In addition, the Programs unit facilitated the distribution of \$3,663,607 in Member Items.

DCLA's own data sets, in combination with those generated from the Cultural Data Project (CDP), help the agency understand the impact of the City's financial support for arts and culture in new and powerful ways. For example, DCLA's data revealed that:

- 388 (44%) funded organizations reported annual operating budgets of less than \$250,000
- 433 (49%) organizations provided programming with an educational component, providing arts access to the city's public school students in a range of disciplines and formats, from opportunities to attend performances and exhibitions, to in-depth pre-professional arts training.
- 884 groups, representing 84% of all eligible applicants, received a total of \$30,841,417, including \$3,663,607 in City Council Member Items

Through CDP, the agency ascertained that FY13 CDF applicants offered:

- 35,894 performances including 3,658 world premieres
- 26,622 classes/workshops
- 4,054 in-school programs
- 2,788 temporary and permanent exhibitions

Applicants also reported a significant impact on the city's economy through:

- \$876,363,997 in total gross earned revenue
- \$792,690,475 spent on salaried employees, and an additional \$192,800,472 on contracted artists and performers
- 19,532 full-time equivalent employees, as well as 42,304 full- and part-time volunteers

CULTURAL INSTITUTIONS GROUP

THE CULTURAL INSTITUTIONS GROUP (CIG) COMPRISES 33 DIVERSE CULTURAL ORGANIZATIONS that operate on City-owned property and receive operating support to help meet their security, maintenance, and energy costs. In return, CIGs offer a broad range of cultural public programs to residents and visitors of all ages.

CIG HIGHLIGHTS

- In conjunction with a vast facility expansion, in February 2013 the **Queens Museum of Art** announced plans to broaden its mandate beyond the traditional definition of art. The museum will now offer performances, artist studios, and special events designed to celebrate the diversity of the local community and all of New York City. To reflect the expanded programming, the institution also formally changed its name to the **Queens Museum**.
- Following the success of its *Jim Henson's Fantastic World* exhibition in 2012, **Museum of the Moving Image** announced in May 2013 that it acquired 400 puppets, costumes, and props from the Jim Henson

family that will be permanently displayed at the Museum beginning in 2014.

- In May 2013, the **Metropolitan Museum of Art** opened its reinstalled and reinvented European Paintings Galleries, the first major renovation of the galleries since 1951 and the first reinstallation since 1972. The wing now houses over 700 works of art in 45 rooms, reorganized to enable visitors to follow the history of European art both chronologically and by region.

- **Brooklyn Museum of Art** had three record-breaking exhibitions in FY13: *Grace and Gravity: Monumental Words* by El Anatsui, *John Singer Sargent Watercolors*, and “*Work by Hand*”: *Hidden Labor and Historical Quilts*. Each show had more visitors than the top three exhibitions from the previous year.
- To celebrate the reemergence of cicadas across Staten Island after their 17-year dormancy period, the **Staten Island Museum** opened a new exhibit: *THEY'RE BAAACK! Return of the 17-Year Cicadas*. The program highlighted the museum's collection of 35,000 cicadas—the second-largest in the world—and included workshops, performances, ephemera, and clips from horror movies featuring the insects, among other cicada-related offerings.
- From March through September 2013, **MoMA PSi** hosted *Expo 1: New York*, a large-scale exhibition including a vast array of installations, shows and events relating to the current and future state of Earth's ecology. The Expo included ten “modules” located throughout the facility, the Museum of Modern Art, and the VW Dome in Rockaway Park, as well as dozens of related events including films, speakers, educational programming, and performances.
- **Bronx Museum of the Arts**, sponsored by the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the U.S. Department of State, presented *Triple Point*, an installation by Chelsea-based artist Sarah Sze at the U.S. Pavilion in La Biennale di Venezia, the 55th International Art Exhibition. This prestigious event took place in Venice, Italy from June through November of 2013.

CIGs BY THE NUMBERS:

As with CDF applicants, members of the CIG submit their programmatic and financial data to DCLA through the Cultural Data Project every year.

The most recent submissions revealed that:

- *Total revenue for the 33-member group was **\$389,214,855***
- *CIGs spent **\$479,782,998** on salaried employees and an additional **\$20,845,835** on artists and performers*

In FY13, CIGs offered:

- ***3,242** performances*
 - ***531** temporary and permanent exhibitions*
 - ***2,384** classes and workshops for **781,892** attendees*
 - ***311** public school programs, with **5,539** off-site school events*

CAPITAL PROJECTS



EVERY YEAR, DCLA HELPS ARTS ORGANIZATIONS IMPROVE THEIR PROGRAMMING CAPACITY by supporting construction projects that expand and enhance cultural venues. In FY13, DCLA's adopted budget included \$178,957,000 in new capital allocations for 92 organizations. DCLA also awarded \$4,785,000 to 31 organizations for equipment purchases, meeting a wide variety of needs including technology, theatrical lighting, and audio/visual systems. The renovations, restorations, energy upgrades, and other improvements made possible with this funding provide first-rate cultural facilities for residents and visitors in all five boroughs.

Design and construction of a 3-story, 4,500 square foot Amur leopard enclosure, and the Conservation Carousel.

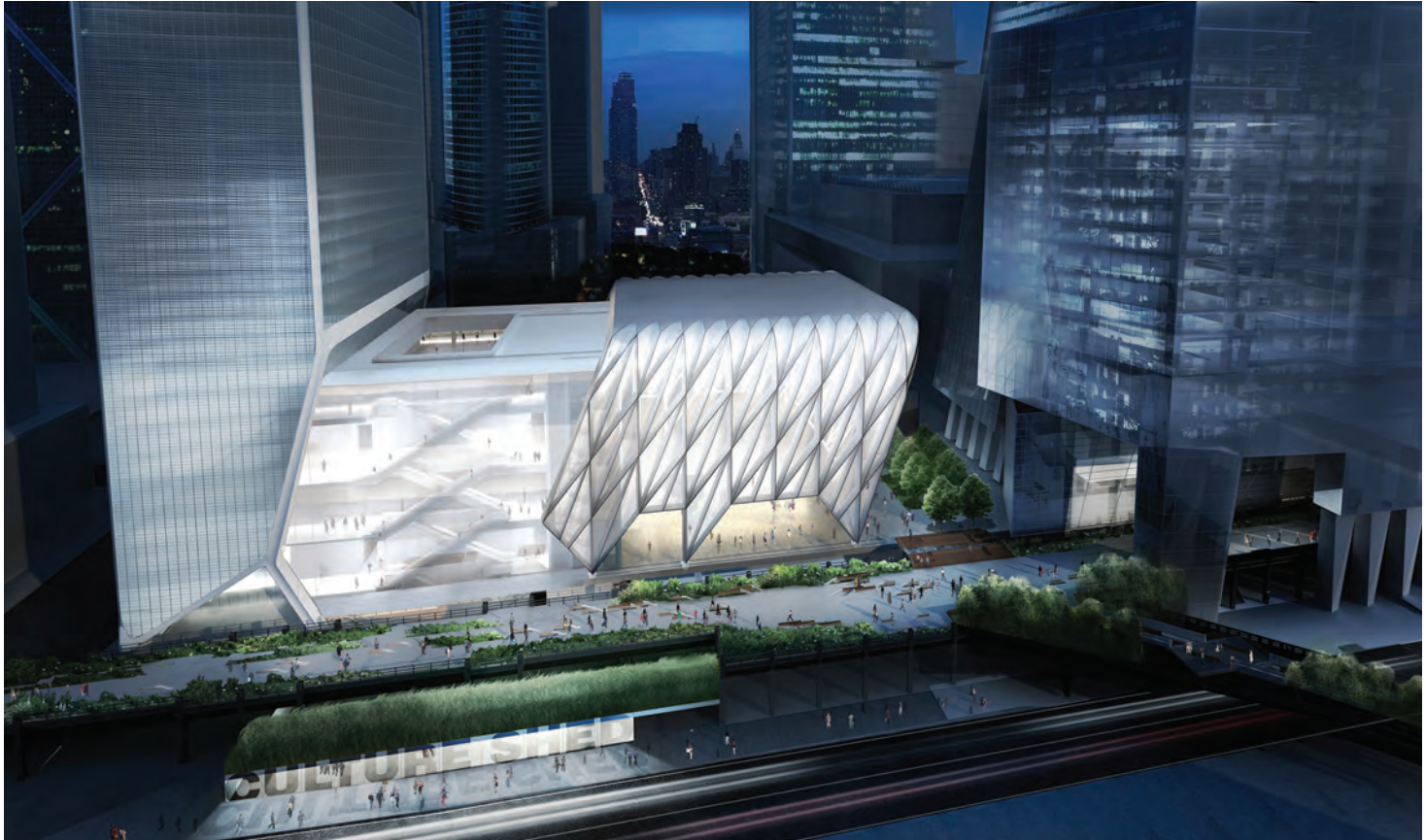

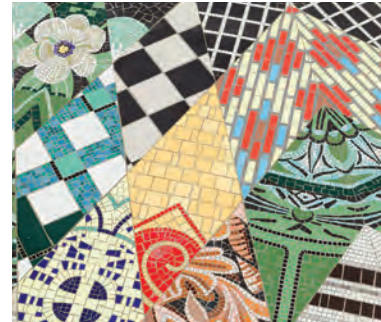

THE COMMUNITY ARTS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (CADP) PROVIDES CAPACITY-BUILDING SERVICES to cultural organizations located in low- to moderate-income neighborhoods. Funding for the program comes from a Community Development Block Grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

For 2013, DCLA developed CADP into a year-long workshop series, Community Arts Leadership, for which organizations with budgets under \$250,000 were selected to participate through a competitive panel process. Through monthly workshops, executive directors, board members, and other key staff gain practical instruction in strategic planning, board development, and financial management. The program is now structured to allow each participant the opportunity to design for themselves a working strategic plan, a sustainable budget forecast, and a stronger board of trustees. Concurrent with the workshops, instructors provided one-on-one assistance to the groups during and after the program.

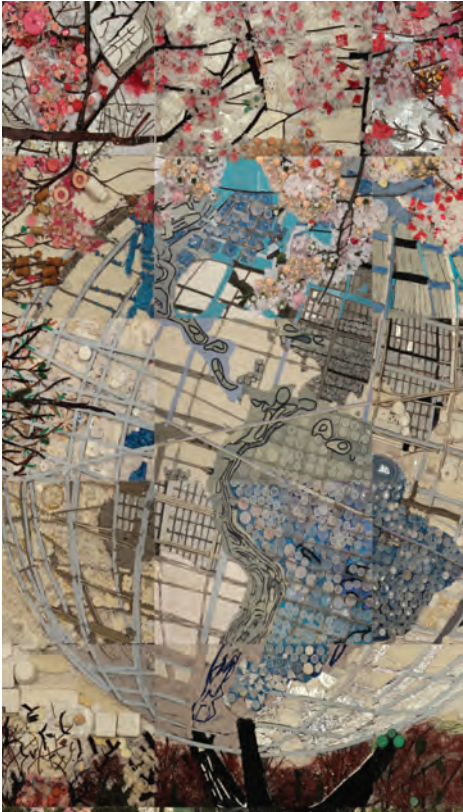

MATERIALS FOR THE ARTS (MFTA) IS THE CITY'S OLDEST REUSE PROGRAM, providing donated goods free of charge to New York City public school teachers and government or nonprofit organizations with arts and cultural programming. In FY13, MFTA received donations from over a thousand individuals, businesses, and nonprofit organizations across the city, and distributed those goods to over 1,800 cultural organization, schools, and government agencies. MFTA also offered educational programming to students and educators and hosted artists-in-residence and free monthly open studio sessions where visitors could learn more about creative reuse from professional artists.

MFTA by the Numbers, FY13:

- **1,494** individuals, businesses, and nonprofits donated materials valued at **\$5.1 million**
- **1,883** groups—including **690** public schools—visited the warehouse and made **5,663** transactions
- **14,682** school children and **5,002** educators participated in MFTA educational programming

SPECIAL INITIATIVES

CULTURAL AFTER-SCHOOL ADVENTURES (CASA)

Now in its seventh year, Cultural After-School Adventures (CASA) continues to ensure that public school students across the five boroughs are provided with quality arts and cultural programming during after-school hours. In fiscal year 2013, DCLA oversaw the distribution of \$5.1 million in City Council designations to partnerships between 95 cultural institutions and 255 public schools.

SENIORS PARTNERING WITH ARTISTS CITYWIDE (SPARC)

2013 marked the second successful year of DCLA's artist residency program, Seniors Partnering with Artists Citywide (SPARC). Supported in part by a \$200,000 allocation from the New York City Department of the Aging (DFTA), SPARC was administered by DCLA in partnership with DFTA and five borough arts councils. In 2013, the program placed 50 artists in 48 senior centers through a competitive application and panel review process. Artists developed a wide range of workshops for seniors in disciplines as varied as bomba dance, musical theater, and printmaking. Throughout each residency, resident artists hosted one or more public programs to showcase the seniors' work for the surrounding community.

RESEARCH & TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

IN FY13, DCLA SUPPORTED NEW INITIATIVES highlighting the importance of arts and culture:

World Cities Culture Report

In August 2012, the City of London released the *World Cities Culture Report* as part of the Summer Olympiad. The report provided an unprecedented audit of cultural assets using 60 key indicators from 12 cities across five continents, revealing that New York has more theaters than any other city and twice the number of dance performances than the next participating city. The Arts & Culture Research Fund

In partnership with the CDP, the New York State CDP Task Force created the Arts & Culture Research Fund, which granted awards to six organizations in FY13, including two in New York City, ranging from \$15,000 to \$25,000. Research awards focused on studies prioritizing CDP data and focusing on topics that would provide increased insight into the cultural sector in the State. DCLA played a central role in designing and administering the application process with the New

York State Community Trust and CDP. Additionally, DCLA, along with the New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA), served on the Fund's advisory board and participated in the grantee selection panel in February 2013. The research was supported by a funder collaborative made up of The New York Community Trust, The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, The John R. Oishei Foundation of Western New York, and New York Council for the Humanities, and managed by The New York Community Trust.

Project Access New York City, May 2, 2013

In collaboration with Art Beyond Sight, the Mayor's Office for People with Disabilities (MOPD), and the Museum of Modern Art, DCLA presented "Project Access New York City: Best Practices for Inclusion in the Arts" on May 2, 2013. The day-long symposium highlighted best practices for arts groups to serve

disabled audiences by presenting an update on the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), as well as presentations about new technologies and innovative programming to serve these vital audiences. 22 panelists provided a wide array of perspectives and insights for 186 attendees representing diverse cultural organizations in the city.



TEMPORARY PUBLIC ART INSTALLATIONS & PERFORMANCES

DCLA WORKS WITH OTHER CITY AGENCIES AS WELL AS NONPROFIT PARTNERS to coordinate logistics and provide guidance on the permitting, security, and safety procedures for artists and organizations that wish to present work in public spaces. Through these unique installations, concerts, and special events presented in all five boroughs, New York City's streets and public plazas become a dynamic and ever-changing museum and performance venue. Below is a sampling of the temporary public art exhibitions and performances that took place in the past year.

FLOW.12: Art and Music at Randall's Island

Multiple artists

June 3–October 1, 2012

Organized by the Randall's Island Park Alliance and Bronx Museum of the Arts

FLOW.12 featured temporary public art installations and music performances along the shoreline at Randall's Island Park that called on visitors to interact with and care for the Park's island environment. Over multiple installments, *FLOW* featured ten site-specific art projects by participants in the Bronx Museum Artists in the Marketplace program for emerging artists. Commissioned

by the Randall's Island Park Alliance in partnership with the Bronx Museum of the Arts with funds from the Rockefeller Foundation. Additional funding provided by the Foundation for Contemporary Arts.

Mary Mattingly, Flock House

June 29–August 18, 2012

A series of mobile temporary artworks by artist Mary Mattingly, *Flock House* consisted of a group of migratory, public, sculptural living quarters installed in Van Cortlandt Park in the Bronx, DUMBO in Brooklyn, Battery Park and Coleman Oval in Manhattan, Flushing Meadows-Corona Park in Queens, and Snug Harbor in Staten Island. Built collaboratively upon reclaimed, redesigned, and rethought materials, the *Flock House* project included workshops, organized events, an interactive website, and narrated cell phone tours that focused on environmental and community issues. Partners on the project included the NYC Department of Parks and Recreation, Eyebeam Center for Art and Technology, Lower Manhattan Cultural Council, New York City Mayor's Office of Special Projects, New York Foundation for the Arts, The Clocktower Gallery & Radio ARTonAIR.org, and more.

Tatzu Nishi, *Discovering Columbus*
September 20–December 2, 2012
Columbus Circle, Manhattan
Organized by Public Art Fund

More than 100,000 people visited Public Art Fund's playful installation, which reimaged this 1892 Columbus Circle monument as the centerpiece in a modern day living room, 75 feet in the air. Following the exhibition, Public Art Fund oversaw the conservation of the Columbus Monument in cooperation with the NYC Department of Parks & Recreation.

Dianne Smith, *Organic Abstracts*
March 4–24, 2013
Bartow-Pell Mansion Museum and Carriage House, Bronx.
Organized by West Harlem Art Fund in partnership with the Bartow-Pell Mansion Museum and the NYC Department of Parks & Recreation.

The first public art installation in Pelham Bay Park in over twenty years, *Organic Abstracts* by artist Dianne Smith consisted of two large-scale, outdoor sculptures on the grounds of the mansion. Both pieces in the installation, *The Couple* and *Flying High*, were made from repurposed materials incorporated into the landscape of the park. *Organic Abstracts* was a part of Armory Week 2013.

Nick Cave, *Heard NY*
March 25–31, 2013
Grand Central Terminal, Manhattan.
Organized by Creative Time.

For one week in March 2013, Creative Time and the Metropolitan Transit Authority's Arts for Transit program presented *Heard New York*, a large-scale public artwork by artist Nick Cave. Consisting of thirty life-size fanciful horses located in Grand Central Terminal's Vanderbilt

Hall, the handcrafted herd was brought to life by 60 dancers from the Alvin Ailey Dance Company, who presented twenty-minute performances several times a day for an estimated total audience of over 15,000 people. Each horse's colorfully dyed raffia coat was inspired by traditional dress from cultures around the world. These "Soundsuits" remained on display in Vanderbilt Hall while not in use, part of Grand Central's Centennial celebration.

May 15–September 22, 2013

In May 2013, Dia Art Foundation installed *Gramsci Monument* by artist Thomas Hirschhorn at Forest Houses, a Bronx public housing development managed by the New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA). The Monument was set up as a series of outdoor pavilions built on-site by a crew comprised of the artist, NYCHA residents, Dia staff members, and volunteers. The pavilions spanned 2,500 square feet and housed a stage, library, lounge, internet café, and workshop area with materials for art-making and carpentry. With the pavilions, the participating Forest Houses residents, in partnership with Hirschhorn, presented daily public programs and events from July 1 through September 15, free of charge and targeted to audiences of all ages.



ANNUAL PROGRAMS, FESTIVALS, AND PROMOTIONAL EVENTS

In addition to the many programs in public spaces supported through CDF, each year DCLA collaborates with other City agencies to present a number of annual cultural festivals that bring art and performances to public spaces across the city.

Poem in Your Pocket Day, April 18, 2013

On April 18, 2013, the City celebrated the 12th annual Poem in Your Pocket Day with poetry slams, a Twitter poetry contest, and other programs. Poem in Your Pocket Day is an on-going partnership between the Academy of American Poets, Bryant Park Corporation, DCLA, the Mayor's Office of Media and Entertainment, Metro New York, and the Poetry Society of America.

NYCxDESIGN, May 10-21, 2013

Initiated in FY13 by the New York City Council, NYCxDESIGN is New York's first citywide event designed to highlight and promote design of all disciplines developing across the city. Led by a steering committee including DCLA's Commissioner alongside some of the city's most influential educators, designers, curators, and businesses, the 12-day showcase brought together a wide variety of programs, including exhibitions, installations, trade shows, talks, launches and open studios. The event created a platform for cultural and commercial opportunities, while at the same time increased awareness of and appreciation for design by all New Yorkers. The inaugural year showcased nearly 350 events across the city.

Open House New York (OHNY), October 12-13, 2012

DCLA collaborated with OHNY to include Percent for Art projects for the first time in this annual, weekend-long event that invites participants to explore little known or typically inaccessible buildings and landmarks. For OHNY, DCLA featured Percent artwork in three boroughs: Dennis Adams' *Tributaries* and Mel Chin's *Landmine* at Long Island City High School; George Trakas' *Waterfront Nature Park* and Vito Acconci's *The Edge of the Plant* at the Newtown Creek Wastewater Plant in Brooklyn; and Ben Rubin's *Shakespeare Machine* at the Public Theater.

Sing for Hope's *Pop Up Pianos*, June 1 – June 16, 2013

Sing for Hope's *Pop Up Pianos* returned to the city for two weeks in June, bringing 88 artist-decorated pianos to public parks and plazas throughout the five boroughs, available for anyone to play as they wished.

Make Music New York, June 21, 2013

Make Music New York is an annual festival established in 2007 that celebrates the first day of summer with free concerts throughout the city. On June 21, Make Music New York presented over 1,000 public performances across all five boroughs.

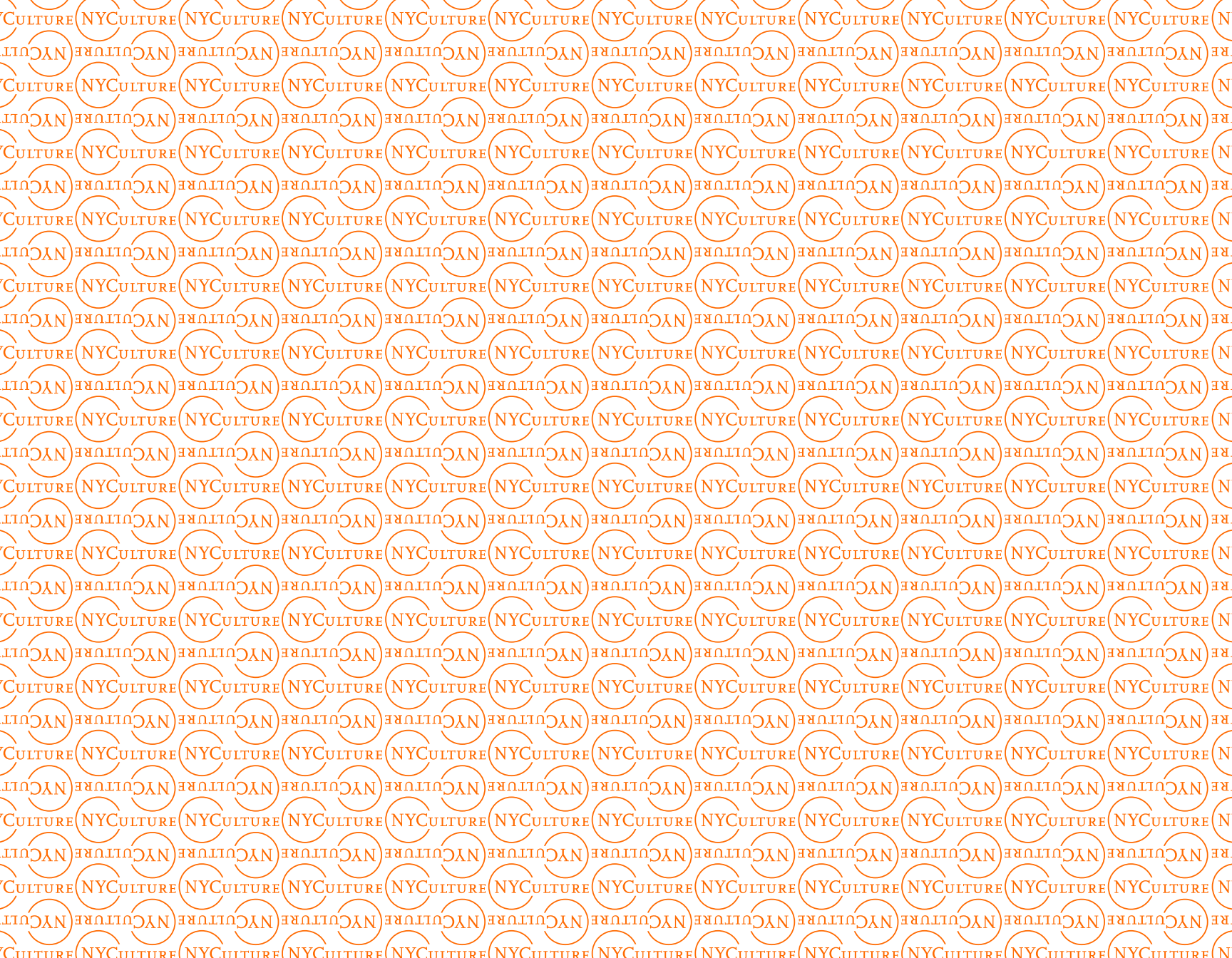
