## Brooklyn Bridge.

Routine work of inspecting, cleaning, repairs to roadway, was carried on without interruption during the quarter.

Fires occurred in the roadway planking between the rails of the surface car tracks on two occasions. Both fires were put out by Department employees and no damage was done to the structure.

The south roadway was opened to heavy vehicular traffic on August 14, after having been closed since June 16, owing to work being done on the approaches in repaving the roadway with granite blocks.

Owing to the closing of William and North William sts. because of the subway connection, provision was made for a passageway for pedestrians under the William st. construction. This passageway was opened to the public on July 21.

On account of the funeral of Mayor Gaynor on Monday, September 22, trolley cars were not operated across the bridge from 11.05 to 2.06 p. m. No elevated trains were operated from 12.04 to 1.48 p. m. Foot passengers and all vehicles were kept off the bridge during the period.

Subway Connections, Manhattan—The reconstruction of south side of Franklin square span is completed and contractor has begun operations on north side.

North Subway Track—Between arch 5 and Vandewater st., is completed; relocation of columns between Vandewater and Rose sts. is progressing daily; Rose st. girders are in place; roof over subway between Rose and William sts. is completed; both walls in William st. are erected to underside of arch; the erection of columns and girders in North William st. is begun and progress is being made in excavation under Park row trolley tracks. Masonry is being excavated between Rose and William sts. and granite coping between Cliff and Vandewater sts. is being laid.

South Subway Track—Masonry excavation between Franklin square and Vandewater st. is daily progressing; columns between Rose and Vandewater sts. are being relocated; Rose st. girders are in place; walls, floors and roof between Rose st. and arch 27 are practically completed; walls in William st. are erected to underside of arch and permanent columns and girders in North William st. under columns 8 and 9 are in place.

Closing William and North William Streets—New street is back filled to roadway grade and passageway in William st. is practically completed.

About fifty-three (53) per cent. of the contract is completed to date.

## Williamsburg Bridge.

The plans have been signed and approved by the Art Commission, and the specifications completed for the island platforms at the Bedford ave. station on the Brooklyn approach. These platforms are to be constructed between the roadways and surface car tracks to supplement the present centre platform and will accommodate eastbound passengers on the Brooklyn lines and westbound passengers on the Manhattan lines.

Extensive repairs were made by the operating company to the overhead trolley equipment on the south tracks during the latter part of August.

Regular passenger service on the elevated railroad extension across the bridge into Centre st. loop to Chambers st. was inaugurated on the morning of August 4. The first train entered the subway at the Essex st. station at 4.08 a. m. and reached Chambers st. eight minutes later.

The Public Service Commission is preparing studies of the changes due to the proposed ten-foot cars and is in consultation with the Bridge Department concerning same.

Strengthening End Spans, Manhattan and Brooklyn Sides—Work continued on this contract during the quarter.

Strengthening Main Span, Brooklyn Side, South Truss—Panels 44 to 53 completed. Manhattan side, North Truss—Panels 34 to 49 completed. Manhattan Side, South Truss—Panels 41 to 53 completed.

## Queensboro Bridge.

Work has been continued on erecting the steel beams and hangers to be used for suspending scaffolds for inspecting, painting and repairs under the deck of the Queens approach viaduct.

The elevator in the south shaft of the Queens Anchor Pier was out of service from July 2 to August 8. The shut down was longer than anticipated owing to delay in delivery of special parts by the successors of the concern that originally installed the elevators.

An experimental section of roadway was laid from panels 46 to 48, Queens approach viaduct. This section was laid to find some substitute for the present type of paving, which requires continuous repairs, due mainly to the disintegration of the concrete foundation.

Plans have been completed for the plumbing and fixtures to be installed in the temporary comfort stations on the two footwalks of the Manhattan approach near 2d ave. Arrangements have been made with the Commissioner of Public Works, Manhattan, for him to furnish the necessary attendants and laborers for these comfort stations.

The Bradley Contracting Company has deposited about 60,000 cubic yards of fill under the Queens approach viaduct during this quarter.

The north footwalk was opened to the public July 28, 1913.

The work on the contract drawings and specifications for passenger elevators to Blackwells Island is progressing.

Studies have been made of the operation and spacing of subway trains across the bridge.

All routine maintenance requirements were carried on without interruption during the quarter.

## Manhattan Bridge.

The cross connections between the fire pipe lines on each side of the roadway have been completed. This, with the fire signal system installed during the previous quarter, completes the fire prevention equipment on this bridge.

The allied surface car companies organized under the name of the Brooklyn and North River Railroad Company have extended the service and are now operating from Desbrosses st. Ferry in Manhattan to Fulton st., by way of Gold st., Brooklyn. A contract, dated September 9, 1913, between the City and this company, supersedes the permit of the Commissioner of Bridges, dated February 29, 1912, for the operation of cars over this bridge. The local bridge service heretofore conducted by this company is to be stopped under the terms of the contract.

Plans and specifications for the upper deck track equipment were completed and approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

Routine maintenance work was taken care of during the quarter.

## Improvement of Brooklyn Plaza.

Excavation—Easterly subway about 80 per cent. finished. Easterly exterior wall about 95 per cent. finished. Easterly pylon finished. Westerly subway about 33 per cent. finished. Westerly exterior wall about 40 per cent. finished. Westerly pylon about 20 per cent. finished. Westerly conduit retaining wall about 120 feet excavated to subgrade and ready for forms.

Concrete—Easterly exterior wall complete up to granite line. Easterly pylon foundation complete up to granite line. Easterly subway about 18 per cent. finished. This concrete is in walls and footings only.

Drainage System—Easterly side of plaza about 85 per cent. finished. Westerly side of plaza about 55 per cent. finished.

This contract is about 10 per cent. completed.

## Improvement of Manhattan Plaza.

Excavation complete for the Forsyth st. and Canal st. retaining walls. Bowery wall is about 65 per cent. finished. Subway excavation from portal to station —149 finished. Excavation for west colonnade started.

Canal st., from Forsyth st. to a point about 30 feet west of Chrystie st., and Chrystie st., from Canal st. to Hester st., is filled to required grade.

Exterior retaining walls on Canal and Forsyth sts. are finished up to a point level with lower course of granite, from rear of abutment to a point opposite Chrystie st. and on the Bowery for a distance of 160 feet. Subway walls and roof from station +87 to south side of arch roof and from —149 to —120. Subway walls and footings finished from —120 to —30.

All steel for subway is in place except a section of roof girders from station —15 to station +40. The steel for this work is delivered and will be in place the



coming week. When this work is in place, there will yet remain the steelwork for the elevated structure.

Waterproofing on all side walls of subway finished from station —149 to —50 and from +87 to +321. Also roof from —87 to —220 Forsyth st. retaining wall a small section for about six feet in height and 165 feet in length. All of the above mentioned waterproofing is backed up with four inches of brickwork.

A shipment of about 213 pieces of granite was received at site on September 29, 1913, and granite setting began on October 2. Up to date about twenty-four pieces of the shipment were set.

Canal st., from Forsyth to Chrystie st., and Chrystie st., from Canal st. to a point 300 feet east, have been paved and traffic opened on October 2, 1913.

All water mains under the contract are now finished.

Companies owning mains and conduits on Canal st. and Hester st. have restored same where possible.

Temporary roadway used for Canal st. traffic was discontinued on August 26, 1913.

The contract is about 40 per cent. completed.

Willis Avenue Bridge.

The contract for the electrification of this bridge was completed during this quarter.

On July 31 the entire steam plant was abandoned and the bridge was operated by electricity.

Third Avenue Bridge.

The contract for repaving the north approach with granite block was completed during this quarter.

Ocean Avenue Bridge.

The old timber truss and flooring over the channel span of the trestle was removed and in its place a new steel bridge was built.

Metropolitan Avenue Bridge (Fixed).

The Brooklyn Heights Railroad Company filled up the creek and paved the railway tracks and that portion of the highway was formally turned over to the Bureau of Highways in the Boroughs of Brooklyn and Queens, respectively, on July 25, 1913.

Municipal Building.

The contract for laying and relaying water and gas mains and grading and paving streets adjacent to the Municipal Building was completed except for a few items.

The work which was suspended under the contract for the completion of the substructure, the erection of the superstructure, etc., of the Municipal Building was advanced 44 per cent. to completion.

The contract for the interior finish was advanced to 57 per cent. complete.

Robert Wetherill & Co., Inc., completed 92 per cent. of the work to be done under the contract for the installation of the elevators.

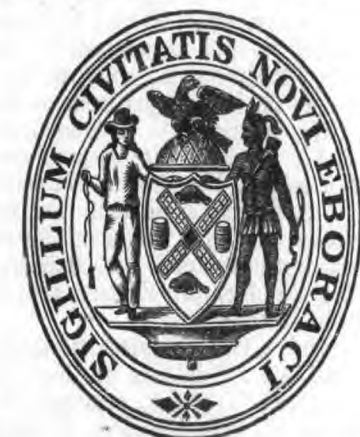

**Proposed Form of Contract.**  
This contract, made and executed in duplicate this day of December, 1913, by and between The City of New York, (hereinafter called the City), party of the first part, by the Mayor of said City, acting for and in the name of said City, under and in pursuance of the authority of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of said City (hereinafter called the Board), and the Manhattan Bridge Three Cent Line (hereinafter called the Company), party of the second part; witnesseth:

Whereas, By a contract dated July 10, 1912, the Company was authorized to construct, maintain and operate a street surface railway upon and along Desbrosses, Vestry, Washington, Greenwich and Canal streets, in the Borough of Manhattan, to and across the Manhattan Bridge, and upon and along Flatbush Avenue Extension and other streets in the Borough of Brooklyn, from the Desbrosses Street Ferry, Borough of Manhattan, to the Long Island Railroad Depot, Borough of Brooklyn; and

Whereas, By a contract dated July 10, 1912, was amended by extending the times for commencement and completion of construction; and

Whereas, The Company has by a petition dated September 25, 1913, applied to the Board for certain modifications and amendments in and to said contract dated July 10, 1912, as amended by said contract dated July 10, 1912, to wit:

First—By substituting for that portion of the route authorized by said contract of July 10, 1912, upon and along Rockwell place, Flatbush ave. from Rockwell place to 4th ave., 4th Atlantic and 3d aves. in the Borough of Brooklyn, the following routes:

(a) An additional single track upon and along Fulton st. from Flatbush Avenue Extension to Rockwell place; thence by double track upon and along Fulton st. and Ashland place from Rockwell place to Hanson place.

(b) A single track upon and along Lafayette ave. and Flatbush ave. from the above described route on Ashland place to and connecting with the existing route of the Company in Flatbush ave. between 3d ave. and Livingston st.

Second—By amending Section 2, sixth of said contract of July 10, 1912, by permitting the use of overhead electric power upon the Manhattan Bridge, its terminals and approaches.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

Section 1. The City hereby consents, subject to the conditions and provisions hereinafter set forth, to certain modifications and amendments in and to said contract of July 10, 1912, as amended by said contract of July 10, 1912, and said modifications and amendments to be as follows:

THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION FOR THE First District (hereinafter called the "Commission") invites proposals to construct Section No. 6 of Routes 4 and 38, a part of the Seventh Avenue-Lexington Avenue Rapid Transit Railroad.

The points within The City of New York between which the said part is to run and the route or routes to be followed are briefly as follows: Section No. 6—Beginning at a point under 7th ave., in the Borough of Manhattan, about seventy-five (75) feet north of the northerly building line of W. 30th st., and extending thence northerly under 7th ave. to a point about one hundred (100) feet south of the southerly building line of W. 43d st.

The general plan of construction calls for a subsurface railroad having four and five tracks. The details of the construction of the railroad and appurtenances are more particularly indicated on the contract drawings.

Bidders will not be required to provide or lay tracks, ties or ballast, nor to do station finish work.

The work of construction under the contract will include the construction of all necessary sewers and connections along or off the route of the railroad; also the necessary support, maintenance, readjustment and reconstruction of vaults adjacent to buildings, pipes, tubes, conduits, subways or other subsurface structures; the support and care, including underpinning or the maintaining, protecting and securing, where necessary, of all buildings, monuments, surface and subsurface railroads and other surface, sub-surface and overhead structures of any kind, etc., affected by or interfered with during the construction of the work; also the restoration of the sidewalks and roadways.

The method of construction will be by trench excavation under cover, unless otherwise permitted by the Commission, as set forth in the form of contract.

Bidders must examine the form of contract and the specifications, maps and plans; must visit the location of the work and inform themselves of the present conditions along the line thereof and make their own estimates of the facilities and difficulties attending the execution of the proposed work.

A fuller description of the work to be done is set forth, and other requirements, provisions, details and specifications are stated, in the printed form of contract and in the contract drawings therein referred to. The City and the Interborough Rapid Transit Company will both be parties to the contract; the Interborough Rapid Transit Company being a party for the purpose of disbursing part of its contribution toward the cost of construction as provided in the contract dated March 19, 1913, between the City of New York, acting by the Commission, and Interborough Rapid Transit Company for the equipment, maintenance and operation of additional rapid transit railroads. The liability of Interborough Rapid Transit Company under the contract for which bids are now invited will be limited to an amount equal to ninety-five (95) per centum of the aggregate sum arrived at by multiplying the estimated approximate quantities by the unit prices, as contained in the schedule of unit prices in the contractor's proposal. The contractor is to accept the obligation of the Interborough Rapid Transit Company to make payments to the amount and in the manner provided in the contract, and is to agree not to look to the City except to the extent that the amounts earned under the contract may exceed the amount for which the Interborough Rapid Transit Company is liable.

The Commission is informed by the Department of Docks and Ferries that docks and bulkheads along the East River or along the North River may be available for dumping purposes. Information in regard thereto may be obtained by any intending bidder upon inquiry at the office of the Department of Docks and Ferries with whom all arrangements must be made with respect to utilizing such docks and bulkheads as may be available.

Partial payments to the contractor will be made monthly as the work proceeds, as provided in the form of contract.

No proposal, after it shall have been deposited with the Commission, will be allowed to be withdrawn for any reason whatever.

#### Amendment to Sanitary Code.

AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF

Health of the Department of Health, held December 9, 1913, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That section 108 of the Sanitary Code be and the same is hereby amended to take effect January 1, 1914, so as to read as follows:

Section 108. It shall be the duty of every owner, tenant, lessee, occupant or person in charge of any and every building or place of business in the generally built-up portions of The City of New York forthwith to provide or cause to be provided, and at all times thereafter to keep and cause to be kept and provided, within such building or place of business, and for the exclusive use of such building or place of business, separate receptacles for receiving and holding, without leakage, all the ashes, garbage and liquid substances that may accumulate during thirty-six hours, from said building or place of business, or the portion thereof of which such person may be the owner, tenant, lessee, occupant or in charge, and every such recept



And such receptacles, as well as any light refuse or rubbish to be removed, shall be kept within the premises until the proper time for removal, and shall then be placed in the area, or within the stoop line, fence or other enclosure in front of any building and not upon the sidewalk, and shall there remain until such materials or substances are removed by the Department of Street Cleaning, but in no case shall such receptacles be placed where they shall be or become a nuisance.

All light refuse or rubbish likely to be scattered or blown about shall, before being placed outside of any building or premises for removal, be properly bundled, packed or otherwise secured.

Any receptacle containing garbage or liquid substances, which shall be placed outside of a building in the area or within the stoop line, fence or other enclosure shall be covered and kept covered until such removal, as aforesaid.

The foregoing provisions are applicable throughout the City of New York, except that in the Borough of Richmond ashes from house furnaces shall be kept in a receptacle separate and apart from the remainder of the household waste, and no material other than furnace ashes shall be placed in said receptacle. Other household waste materials, including garbage, kitchen ashes, sweepings, soiled paper or rubbish shall be placed in a separate metal or metal lined receptacle, which when placed outside of a building for removal shall be covered and kept covered with a tight fitting cover.

No receptacle shall when filled contain more than two cubic feet of material nor weigh more than one hundred pounds, and a sufficient number of receptacles shall be provided by the owner, lessee or occupant of a building to hold whatever ashes or other waste materials may accumulate thereat during sixty hours next preceding the removal thereof.

Newspapers, wrapping paper and other light rubbish likely to be blown or scattered about the street shall be securely bundled, tied or packed before being placed for removal. Yard sweepings, hedge cuttings, grass, leaves, earth, stone bricks or trade waste shall not be mixed with household waste.

Accumulations of household refuse resulting from failure to take advantage of the regular collection service shall be removed at the expense of the person or persons concerned.

Whereas, Bichloride of mercury, otherwise corrosive sublimate, a poison, has frequently been taken by mistake and loss of life has resulted therefrom, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Sanitary Code be and the same is hereby amended by the adoption of an additional section to be known as section sixty-seven (a), to take effect March 1, 1914, and to read as follows:

Section 67a. Bichloride of mercury, otherwise known as corrosive sublimate, shall not be held, kept, sold or offered for sale at retail in the dry form except in colored tablets individually wrapped, the wrapper to have the word "Poison" in plain letters conspicuously placed, and dispensed in sealed containers of glass, conspicuously labeled with the word "Poison" in red letters.

This section does not apply to tablets containing one-tenth of a grain or less of bichloride of mercury.

#### NOTICE TO BIDDERS AT SALES OF OLD BUILDINGS, ETC.

##### TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, or the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The placing therein or permitting the occupancy of any such building by any tenant free, for rent or otherwise, excepting the necessary watchmen or the workmen engaged in the actual demolition thereof, shall of itself be a breach of the above conditions of sale.

The sale will be as of the condition of the property on date of delivery thereof to the purchaser. The City of New York will not be responsible for any change or loss which may occur in the condition of the buildings, or their appurtenances between the time of the sale thereof and the time of delivering possession to the purchaser, after being properly vacated of all tenants. The sale and delivery of purchase will be made as nearly together as the circumstance of vacating the structures of their tenants will permit.

All the material of the buildings, sheds, walks, structures and cellars of whatsoever nature, with their exterior and interior fixtures, appurtenances and foundations of all kinds, except the exterior walls of the buildings and their foundations and the sidewalks and curb in front of said buildings, extending within the described area shall be torn down and removed from the premises. None of the dirt, debris or waste resulting from demolition shall be allowed to remain on the premises, except old mortar or plaster only, which may be left, but not higher at any point than two feet below the curb opposite that point. The exterior walls and their foundations shall be taken down only to a plane whose elevation shall be the level of the curb in front of the building. Where there is no curb the elevation of the surrounding ground shall be considered curb level. All wells, cesspools, sinks, etc., existing on the property must be filled to the level of the surrounding ground with clean earth.

The purchaser at the sale shall also withdraw and remove all abandoned water taps and old service mains, and in place thereof cause to be inserted a brass plug in the main water pipe in the street, in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity that this has been performed.

The purchaser at the sale shall also remove all house sewer connections to the main sewer in the street, and the opening of the main sewer

in street shall be properly closed in compliance with the directions of the Bureau of Sewers in the Borough in which the buildings are situated, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Bureau of Sewers that the work has been properly performed.

The permit for all opening in the street to be obtained by and at the expense of the purchaser of the building.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days from the day of possession will work forfeiture of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances, or portion as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed, and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the day of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials of labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save the City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furrings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam-holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flashed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the contractor.

The Comptroller of The City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids; and it is further

##### GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department, and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a Department, chief of a Bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement, to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
