

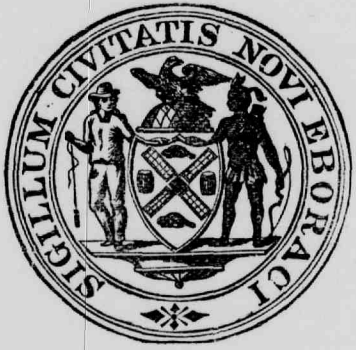

Ordinances, Resolutions, etc., approved by the Mayor during the week ending December 8, 1877.

Whereas, Certain streets in the lower portion of the city are in a dangerous condition, and it is necessary that they be immediately repaved and put in good order, therefore be it

Resolved, That the Board of Estimate and Apportionment be and they are hereby respectfully requested to make an appropriation sufficient to repave the following named streets: Centre street, Church street, Madison street, Frankfort street, Pearl street, Water street, Vesey street, Barclay street, Exchange place, New street, Broad street, Bridge street, William street, Cliff street, Gold street, North Moore street, Marion street, Market street, Rutgers street, Clinton street, Jefferson street, Montgomery street, Gouverneur street, Jackson street, Henry street, Monroe street, Cherry street, Water street, Sheriff street, from Broome to Rivington street, Division street, Mulberry street, Mott street, Leonard street, White street, and Walker street.

Adopted by the Board of Aldermen, November 20, 1877.

Received from his Honor the Mayor, December 4, 1877, without his approval or objections thereto; therefore, as provided in section 11, chapter 335, Laws of 1873, the same became adopted.

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to James Brady to place and keep a stand on the southwest corner of Sixth avenue and One Hundred and Twenty-eighth street; such permission to continue only during the pleasure of the Common Council.

Rivington street, from Bowery to Avenue B; Chrystie street, from Rivington to Houston street; Allen street, from Rivington to Houston street; First avenue, from Houston to Fourteenth street; Orchard street, from Rivington to Houston street; Ludlow street, from Rivington to Houston street; Essex street, from Rivington to Houston street; Norfolk street, from Rivington to East Houston street; Suffolk street, from Rivington to East Houston street; Clinton street, from Rivington to East Houston street; First street, from Bowery to Norfolk street; Avenue A, from Houston to Fourteenth street; Third street, from Bowery to Avenue B; Fourth street, from Bowery to Avenue B; Fifth street, from Bowery to Avenue B; Sixth street, from Third avenue to Avenue B; Seventh street, from Third avenue to Avenue B; Ninth street, from Second avenue to Avenue A; Eleventh street, from Fourth avenue to Avenue B; Twelfth street, from Second avenue to Avenue B.

This privilege to take effect immediately.

PROPOSALS, IN SEALED ENVELOPES, WILL
be received at the office of the above-named Depart-
ment, No. 36 Union square, New York City, until Wednes-
day, the 19th day of December, 1877, at the hour of half-
past nine o'clock A. M., when they will be publicly opened
and read, for furnishing Illuminating Material to, and
Lighting, etc., all or any portion of the Public Lamps, on
the Public Parks, Places and Bridges of the City of New
York (except the ornamental lamps on the north side of
Union square), under the control of the Department of
Public Parks, from the first day of January, 1878, until the
thirtieth day of April, 1878, both days inclusive.

Each proposal must state the description or kind of Illu-
minating Material proposed to be used, and also a price
shall also include the lighting, cleaning, and reglazing the
same, and replacing the cocks, tubes, standpipes, burners,
and other appliances which may be used for a like pur-
pose, and cross-heads, lamp-irons, and lanterns thereto,
and keeping each lamp and lamp-post in repair, in the manner
mentioned in the specifications, during the period above
mentioned.

The said Department reserves the right to determine,
after the proposals are opened, what illuminating material
shall be used in said public lamps during the period, and
will award the contract to the lowest bidder whose propo-

ment of the Museum of Art, in the Central Park.

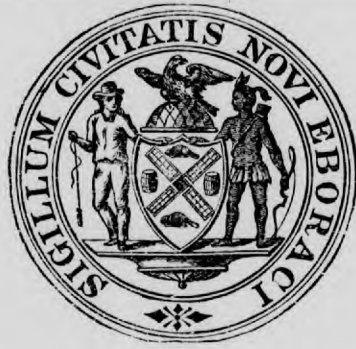

Supervisor Purroy moved that the Supervisor's returns for Senator in the Twenty-third Election District of the Eighteenth Assembly District be received as correct. Adopted.

Supervisor Morris moved that the returns for Senator in the Twenty-third Election District of the Eighteenth Assembly District, be referred to the Committee on Corrected Returns, and that the Inspectors be sent for and the returns be compared with those in the Mayor's office and at Police Headquarters.

Supervisor Purroy raised the point of order that, as the Supervisor's returns had been accepted, the motion was out of order.

The Chairman decided the point of order well taken.

Supervisor Morris thereupon withdrew his motion.

Supervisor Keenan moved that the Board take a recess until Monday the 19th instant, at 10 o'clock A. M. Adopted.

MONDAY, November 19, 1877—10 o'clock A. M.

The Board assembled after recess:

Present—Supervisor Purroy in the Chair, and a quorum to compare returns.

Supervisor Cowing commenced the canvass of the Nineteenth Assembly District.

Supervisor Keenan moved that the County Clerk's returns for State Engineer in the Seventh Election District of the Twentieth Assembly District be received as correct. Adopted.

Supervisor Keenan moved that the Supervisor's returns for Treasurer in the Ninth Election District of the Twentieth Assembly District be received as correct. Adopted.

Supervisor Keenan moved that the County Clerk's returns for State Engineer in the Fifteenth Election District of the Twentieth Assembly District be received as correct. Adopted.

Supervisor Tuomey moved that the Supervisor's returns for Register in the Eighteenth Election District of the Twentieth Assembly District be received as correct. Adopted.

Supervisor Simonson moved that the County Clerk's returns for Secretary of State in the Twentieth Election District of the Twentieth Assembly District be received as correct. Adopted.

Supervisor Sauer moved that the returns of the Thirty-first Election District of the Twentieth Assembly District on District Aldermen be referred to the Committee on Corrected Returns, and that the Inspectors be sent for. Adopted.

Supervisor Sauer of the Committee on Corrected Returns reported the necessary corrections on the following: Fourth Election District of the Sixteenth Assembly District, on District Aldermen; Third Election District of the Sixteenth Assembly District, on Assembly; Fourth Election District of the Seventh Assembly District, on Aldermen-at-Large; Twentieth Election District of the Fifteenth Assembly District, on Comptroller; Twenty-third Election District of the Fifteenth Assembly District, on District Aldermen and Aldermen-at-Large; Fourth Election District of the Fourteenth Assembly District, on Justice of the Supreme Court, which report was adopted.

Supervisor Keenan moved that the Supervisor's returns on Justices of the Marine Court in the Thirty-second Election District of the Twentieth Assembly District be received as correct. Adopted.

Supervisor Simonson moved that the Thirty-sixth Election District of the Twentieth Assembly District be referred to the Committee on Corrected Returns, and the Inspectors be sent for. Adopted.

Supervisor Purroy moved that the Committee on Corrected Returns send for the Inspectors in the Twenty-third Election District of the Eighteenth Assembly District, in relation to returns on Senator. Adopted.

Supervisor Simonson moved that the Board take a recess for one hour.

The Board reassembled after recess.

Supervisor Simonson commenced the canvass of the returns of the Twenty-first Assembly District.

Supervisor Tuomey moved that the Inspectors in the Thirty-first Election District of the Twenty-first Assembly District be sent for on returns for District Aldermen. Adopted.

In the absence of Supervisor Purroy, Supervisor Sauer canvassed the returns of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards.

Supervisor Pinckney offered the following resolution, called for the reading, and asked that the same be laid over.

Resolved, That in printing the blanks for the returns for the Registers of Election, the Commissioners of Police be and are hereby requested hereafter to omit the column under the head of scattering heretofore printed by them in such blank forms of returns."

Supervisor Morris moved that when the Board adjourn they do so until 12 o'clock to-morrow to receive the corrected returns. Adopted.

Supervisor Simonson moved that the Board take a recess until 12 o'clock to-morrow. Adopted.

TUESDAY, November 20, 1877—12 o'clock M.

The Board assembled after recess.

Present—Supervisor Purroy in the chair, and Supervisors Cole, Cowing, Ehrhart, Guntzer, Hall, Lewis, Morris, Phillips, Pinckney, Salmon, Sauer, Shiels, Simonson, Slevin and Tuomey.

Supervisor Pinckney moved that the returns of the First Election District, of the Thirteenth Assembly District, on register, be referred to the Committee on Corrected Returns, and the Inspectors be sent for. Adopted.

Supervisor Tuomey moved that when the Board adjourn they do so until 2 o'clock to-morrow. Adopted.

Supervisor Cowing moved that the matter of the returns of the Twenty-third Election District, of the Eighteenth Assembly District, be withdrawn from the Committee on Corrected Returns, and brought before the full Board for action.

Supervisor Pinckney moved that the returns be referred to the Committee on Corrected Returns. Adopted.

Supervisor Tuomey, of the Committee on Protests, made a report and called for the reading:

To the Board of County Canvassers in and for the City and County of New York:

GENTLEMEN—Please take notice that ballots, of which the following are true copies, were duly voted by the Electors of the City of New York, at the late election for Aldermen and Assistant Aldermen for the City of New York, pursuant to an act of the Legislature of the State of New York, passed April 5, 1870, chapter 137.

That the district canvassers, in some of the election districts of said city, duly received, counted, proclaimed, and returned said votes, and, I am informed, that in some of the other election districts the Inspectors returned such votes as "Scattering," etc., in violation of law.

As counsel for the candidates that ran for Aldermen and Assistant Aldermen on the annexed tickets, I hereby demand that you estimate and declare the result of such vote, and spread the same upon your minutes.

I also demand that you summon before your Board the Inspectors of Election from those districts where said ticket was improperly returned as aforesaid, in order that they may correct and explain such canvass. I have hereunto annexed copies of the ballots cast for Aldermen and Assistant Aldermen in the different Assembly and Assistant Aldermanic districts of said city, pursuant to said act.

The undersigned hereby protests against the return of votes for Member of Assembly made respectively by the Inspectors of Election of the Seventh, Twenty-second, and Twenty-third Election Districts of the First Assembly District, in said city and county, for the reason that gross irregularities were committed and allowed by the said Inspectors in each of said election Districts, and for the further reason that gross frauds were committed and allowed by the Inspectors in the said Twenty-third Election District, by reason of which the said returns, or any of them, should not be counted by their Honorable Board. The undersigned claims that he was duly and legally elected Member of Assembly for the First Assembly District of said city and county, at the recent election held therein, and he will in due time, and in the proper place and manner, make due proof thereof.

The undersigned Republican candidate for Member of Assembly in the Thirteenth Assembly District of the City and County of New York, respectfully protests against the return and canvass of votes cast in said district for the office of Member of Assembly, for the reason, as proponent believes and avers, that the same are false and fraudulent, and the protestant further charges that illegal voting and wrongful practices on the part of officers of election are the cause of the apparent majority for his opponent, which facts the protestant intends to fully establish before the proper tribunal.

Whereas, Experience has clearly shown that not ten per cent. of the returns of election made by the Inspectors of Election in the several Election Districts of the city at each general or any special election are in conformity with sections 54 and 56, of chapter 675, Laws of 1872, commonly called the Election Law. Some are unsigned; some unsigned and unsealed; in many cases the seals are broken, and other grave irregularities are manifest on the outside of the envelopes containing said returns, while on their face provisions of law are evaded or violated in numberless ways, particularly in the failure to attach copies of the several ballots voted at elections, to write out the full vote received by each candidate, numerals only being used, the number of votes given are very rarely written, partly across the returns and partly across the ballots, and in the total absence of all ballots counted as informal, scattering, or defective; and

Whereas, All such omissions or irregularities are made misdemeanors punishable with fine and imprisonment, and it is mandatory upon the District Attorney to prosecute all reported violations of the Election Law of this and every other character to find judgment (see section 83, chapter 675, Laws of 1872); and

Whereas, The office of Inspector and Clerk of Election, in addition to its emolument entitles the possessor to exemption from military and jury duty; in return for these valuable considerations the people have a right to expect an intelligent and efficient performance of their duties, for failing to do so that they should be made to suffer the penalties provided by law for every dereliction; be it therefore

Resolved, That the Board of County Canvassers hereby requests the Common Council to pass a resolution instructing the County Clerk and the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to keep a record and make a return to the Chief of the Bureau of Elections, showing every informality or irregularity apparent on the envelopes containing the returns of the Inspectors of Election of each annual or special election held in this city; that a like record and statement be kept by the Chief of the Bureau of Elections concerning the returns received by him from such Inspectors; that the County Clerk, as Secretary of the Board of County Canvassers, keep a like record and make a like return to the Chief of the Bureau of Elections of every informality or irregularity that may appear upon the face of every such return or statement during the canvass of the vote by the Board of County Canvassers, and transmit the same to the said Chief of the Bureau of Elections, who shall, after the completion of the labor of the Board of County Canvassers each year, or after the canvass of the vote cast at every general or any special election, transmit said records or returns of irregularities with the name of every Inspector or Poll Clerk in every Election District where such irregularities appear, either upon

the envelopes or upon the statements as canvassed, to the District Attorney before whom the said Chief of the Bureau of Elections shall appear as complainant, and submit the several records or returns of irregularities above alluded to as evidence for the prosecution, which shall be conducted as provided in section 83 of chapter 675, Laws of 1872, the triplicate statement mentioned in section 56 of said act, to be furnished to the District Attorney in each case of informality or irregularity as evidence thereof when required by the said District Attorney, by the Chief of the Bureau of Elections, the County Clerk, or the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors or either of them.

The Committee on Protest to whom was referred the annexed protest of Chas. H. Duell, Thos. Foley, Wilson F. Wolf, Counsel, etc., and a preamble and resolution in relation to irregularities in election returns, respectfully

REPORT:

That an examination of the powers and duties of the Board of County Canvassers has resulted in convincing your Committee that they have not legal authority for entering into an investigation as is contemplated, or the presentation of the above-named protests to your Honorable Body, and their reference to your Committee.

The duties of the Board of Canvassers are simply ministerial in their character, and consist of a comparison of the statement filed, as required by law, with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and the County Clerk. Where no errors or discrepancies appear, the number of votes returned are to be set down and counted for the respective candidates. Where such errors or discrepancies appear, your Honorable Body have not the power to count them. That can only be done by the Inspectors of Election of said election district where they occur. The Board possesses no powers but those conferred by statute; nothing is contained in the statute concerning extraneous evidence, and it has been held by the Court of Appeals of the State, that the Canvassers have not the means of ascertaining by evidence outside the several returns. This inability arises not from positive prohibition, but from actual power. The Legislature never having conferred it.

It would seem, therefore, that there is nothing for your Committee to do other than to ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the paper above referred to, so far at least as the several protests are concerned; the parties have their redress only in the courts, or in case of claimed election, to a legislative body; it is competent upon the organization thereof to pass upon the election and qualification of its own members.

In respect to the preamble and resolution in relation to informalities in the several statements made by the local Inspectors, which duty the Board to request the Common Council to pass resolutions with a view to prevent their recurrence, or to punish for all future dereliction, your Committee are of opinion that it is competent for any member of your Honorable Body to introduce like resolution in the Common Council (the member of both Boards being the same), directly, without the useless formality of being first passed by the Board of County Canvassers, the effect, if passed, will be the same, with half the time and labor saved.

Supervisor Pinckney moved that the Board take a recess until to-morrow, at 2 o'clock P. M. Adopted.

WEDNESDAY, November 21, 1877—2 o'clock P. M.

The Board assembled after recess.

Present—Supervisor Purroy in the chair, and Supervisors Cole, Cowing, Ehrhart, Guntzer, Hall, Joyce, Keenan, Lamb, Morris, Phillips, Pinckney, Salmon, Sauer, Shiels, Simonson, Slevin and Tuomey.

The Secretary then proceeded to read the statements and declarations of the Board on the result of the canvass of the votes returned by the Inspectors of the various Election Districts in the several Assembly Districts of the City and County of New York.

Supervisor Sauer presented the following resolution:
